S.B. No. 129—Requires Legislator who is public officer or employee to take unpaid leave of absence during regular or special session of Legislature.

Counsel's Digest will be changed to read as follows:**

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law prohibits, with certain limited exceptions, a public officer or employee whose salary is set by law from being paid more than one salary for all services rendered to the State, regardless of whether the public officer or employee serves the State in more than one capacity. (NRS 281.127)

This bill requires a Legislator who is a public officer or employee of the State or a local government to take a leave of absence without pay from his public employment during any regular or special session of the Legislature. This bill also specifically provides that this new requirement does not obligate a public employer to grant a leave of absence to a Legislator.
