S.B. No. 130—Revises provisions governing organization and duties of Department of Information Technology.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law provides the Director of the Department of Information Technology with the authority until June 30, 2007, to classify as confidential certain records of the Department relating to homeland security. (NRS 242.105; Section 40 of Chapter 402, Statutes of Nevada 2003, at page 2469)

This bill removes the expiration date, thereby making permanent the authority of the Director to classify such records as confidential.
