If this amendment is adopted, the Legislative

Counsel's Digest will be changed to read as follows:

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Existing law requires an applicant for a certificate of registration to practice as a registered interior designer to submit proof to the State Board of Architecture, Interior Design and Residential Design that the applicant meets certain qualifications, including that the applicant has successfully completed a program of interior design accredited by the Foundation for Interior Design Education Research or a substantially equivalent program approved by the Board. (NRS 623.192)

This bill revises these qualifications for a registered interior designer. If an applicant has not completed a program of interior design accredited by the Foundation or a substantially equivalent program approved by the Board, the applicant may submit proof that the applicant has obtained a bachelor's degree or higher degree from a program of interior design more than 5 years before the date of the application. If the applicant submits such proof, the Board may determine whether the applicant possesses a suitable combination of education and experience in interior design to be issued a certificate of registration to practice as a registered interior designer.
