S.B. No. 23—Authorizes certain persons with physical disabilities to use signature stamps under certain circumstances.

If this amendment is adopted, the Legislative

Counsel's Digest will be changed to read as follows:

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

This bill authorizes the use of signature stamps by persons with physical disabilities who are unable to write because of their disabilities and creates an exception to any law that requires a handwritten signature. In situations in which a signature must be witnessed or has other qualifying requirements, the person with a disability is required to use the stamp in the presence of a witness and meet any other qualifying requirements.

This bill also requires the Office of Disability Services in the Department of Human Resources to adopt standards regarding the use of signature stamps and requires the Department of Human Resources to adopt regulations regarding the use of signature stamps, including regulations concerning the extent to which certain persons and governmental entities may incur liability related to the use of signature stamps.
