Amend the bill as a whole by renumbering sec. 4 as sec. 5 and adding a new section designated sec. 4, following sec. 3, to read as follows:

“**Sec. 4.** 1. In addition to the determinations made pursuant to NRS 612.340, the Administrator of the Employment Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation shall, on or before January 1, 2007, determine the average hourly wage in the State and in each county for nonmanagerial employees.

2. The Administrator of the Employment Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation shall establish a method to determine the average hourly wage in the State and in each county which segregates wages for nonmanagerial employees from wages for managerial and administrative employees. The Administrator shall identify and define the various

types of managerial and administrative positions to allow the computation of a wage that represents the average hourly wage paid to nonmanagerial employees.

3. The Administrator of the Employment Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation shall report to the 74th Session of the Legislature the information determined pursuant to subsections 1 and 2 and recommendations concerning changes in the average hourly wage required to be paid to managerial and nonmanagerial employees to be eligible for the partial abatement of taxes pursuant to NRS 360.750 and 361.0687.”.

Amend sec. 4, page 10, line 1, by deleting:

“1 and 2” and inserting:

“1, 2 and 4”.

Amend the title of the bill, eighth line, after “governments;” by inserting:

“requiring the Administrator of the Employment Security Division of the Department of Employment, Training and Rehabilitation to determine the average hourly wage for nonmanagerial employees and report to the Legislature concerning the average hourly wage required to be paid to be eligible for the partial abatement of certain taxes;”.
