**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing privileges of certain review committees. (BDR 4-884)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [~~omitted material~~] is material to be omitted.

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**AN ACT** relating to privileges; expanding the medical review committees that may refuse to disclose and to prevent other persons from disclosing certain information from their proceedings; providing that the proceedings and records of those review committees are not subject to discovery proceedings; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law allows certain medical review committees to refuse to disclose and to prevent other persons from disclosing certain information from their proceedings and certain records and testimony given before them. (NRS 49.119) Additionally, those proceedings and records are not subject to discovery proceedings. (NRS 49.265)

This bill adds to the list of review committees to which those provisions apply a review committee of a county or district board of health that certifies, licenses or regulates providers of emergency medical service, which currently only includes a county or district board of health in Clark County.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 49.117 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2      49.117 As used in NRS 49.117 to 49.123, inclusive, unless the  
3      context otherwise requires, “review committee” means:

- 4      1. An organized committee of:  
5        (a) A hospital;  
6        (b) An ambulatory surgical center;  
7        (c) A health maintenance organization;  
8        (d) An organization that provides emergency medical services  
9      pursuant to the provisions of chapter 450B of NRS; or  
10      (e) A medical facility as defined in NRS 449.0151,  
11      → which has the responsibility of evaluating and improving the  
12      quality of care rendered by the parent organization; ~~or~~  
13      2. A peer review committee of a medical or dental society ~~or~~ ;  
14      **or**

15      **3. A review committee of a county or district board of health  
16      that certifies, licenses or regulates providers of emergency medical  
17      services pursuant to the provisions of chapter 450B of NRS.**

18      **Sec. 2.** NRS 49.265 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
19      49.265 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2:  
20        (a) The proceedings and records of:  
21            (1) Organized committees of hospitals, and organized  
22            committees of organizations that provide emergency medical  
23            services pursuant to the provisions of chapter 450B of NRS, having  
24            the responsibility of evaluation and improvement of the quality of  
25            care rendered by those hospitals or organizations; ~~and~~  
26            (2) Review committees of medical or dental societies ~~or~~ ;  
27      **and**

28      **(3) Review committees of a county or district board of  
29      health that certifies, licenses or regulates providers of emergency  
30      medical services pursuant to the provisions of chapter 450B  
31      of NRS,**

32      → are not subject to discovery proceedings.  
33      (b) No person who attends a meeting of any such committee  
34      may be required to testify concerning the proceedings at the  
35      meeting.

36      2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply to:  
37        (a) Any statement made by a person in attendance at such a  
38        meeting who is a party to an action or proceeding the subject of  
39        which is reviewed at the meeting.  
40        (b) Any statement made by a person who is requesting staff  
41        privileges at a hospital.



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1       (c) The proceedings of any meeting considering an action  
2 against an insurance carrier alleging bad faith by the carrier in  
3 refusing to accept a settlement offer within the limits of the policy.

4       (d) Any matter relating to the proceedings or records of such  
5 committees which is contained in health care records furnished in  
6 accordance with NRS 629.061.
