SUMMARY—Repeals prospective expiration of authority of Director of Department of Information Technology to classify certain records of Department as confidential. (BDR 19-608)

AN ACT relating to information services; repealing the prospective expiration of the authority of the Director of the Department of Information Technology to classify certain records of the Department as confidential; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law provides the Director of the Department of Information
2 Technology with the authority until June 30, 2007, to classify as confidential
3 certain records of the Department relating to homeland security. (NRS 242.105;
4 Section 40 of Chapter 402, Statutes of Nevada 2003, at page 2469)

5 This bill removes the expiration date, thereby making permanent the authority
6 of the Director to classify such records as confidential.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Section 40 of chapter 402, Statutes of Nevada 2003,
2 at page 2469, is hereby amended to read as follows:
3 Sec. 40. 1. This section and sections 1 to 33,
4 inclusive, 38, 38.5 and 39 of this act become effective on
5 July 1, 2003.



1 2. Sections 34 to 37, inclusive, of this act become
2 effective on January 1, 2004.

3 3. The provisions of sections 21 to 24, inclusive, **[and**
4 ~~27.5]~~ of this act expire by limitation on June 30, 2007.

5 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.
