

Senate Bill No. 132–Committee on Transportation
and Homeland Security

CHAPTER.....

AN ACT relating to traffic laws; authorizing a peace officer to issue a traffic citation that is prepared electronically; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel’s Digest:

Existing law allows peace officers, under most circumstances, to issue citations that are prepared manually or electronically. (NRS 171.1773, 171.1774, 171.17785, 484.799) However, peace officers issuing traffic citations may only prepare such citations manually. (NRS 484.807)

This bill allows peace officers to issue traffic citations that are prepared electronically as well as manually.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. NRS 484.807 is hereby amended to read as follows:
484.807 1. It is unlawful for ~~any~~ **a** person to violate his written promise to appear given to a peace officer upon the issuance of a traffic citation prepared manually ~~or~~ **or electronically**, regardless of the disposition of the charge for which the citation was originally issued.

2. A person may comply with a written promise to appear in court by an appearance by counsel.

3. A warrant may issue upon a violation of a written promise to appear.
