

## SENATE BILL NO. 152—SENATOR MATHEWS

MARCH 2, 2005

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Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions relating to physical therapists.  
(BDR 54-471)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to physical therapists; revising the provisions governing the approval of schools and educational curricula for physical therapy; allowing applicants who meet certain qualifications and requirements to practice physical therapy under a temporary exemption from licensure pending the examination for licensure; authorizing the Board to establish a fee to review a course of continuing education; authorizing a civil penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law requires the State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners to approve schools and any educational curriculum for physical therapists and physical therapists' assistants subject to certain limitations. (NRS 640.060, 640.080, 640.230, 640.240) Under existing law, the Board is prohibited from approving certain schools and curricula unless they meet certain standards required by the American Physical Therapy Association. (NRS 640.080, 640.240)

This bill removes the requirement that certain schools and curricula approved by the Board must meet certain standards required by the American Physical Therapy Association. This bill gives the Board the authority to approve schools that are accredited by an accrediting agency recognized by the Board.

Under existing law, to be eligible for licensure as a physical therapist, an applicant must be of good moral character and must have graduated from a school in which he completed a curriculum of physical therapy approved by the Board. The applicant must also pass an examination. (NRS 640.080) An applicant may not practice physical therapy until he has been issued a license by the Board. (NRS 640.169)

This bill allows certain qualified applicants to practice physical therapy under a temporary exemption from licensure pending the examination. To be eligible for



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19 the temporary exemption, the applicant must be a qualified first-time applicant  
20 whose application has been approved by the Board and who has not previously  
21 failed the examination. During the period of the temporary exemption, the applicant  
22 must practice under the supervision of a licensed physical therapist and must  
23 comply with any other requirements imposed by the Board. In addition, the  
24 applicant may only use the title "graduate of physical therapy" during this period,  
25 and the applicant is subject to the regulatory and disciplinary authority of the  
26 Board. The temporary exemption is valid until the applicant takes the examination  
27 for licensure and receives the results of the examination, or if the applicant fails to  
28 take the examination, until the date on which the examination is given.

29 Existing law provides that the State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners must  
30 require physical therapists to complete certain requirements for continuing  
31 education as a condition to the renewal of a license and requires the Board to  
32 approve the courses of study or training for that continuing education.  
33 (NRS 640.150)

34 This bill authorizes the Board to establish a fee of not more than \$150 to  
35 consider approving a course of study or training for continuing education.

36 Existing law makes it unlawful, except in certain circumstances, to practice  
37 physical therapy without a license. (NRS 640.169)

38 This bill authorizes the Board to impose a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000  
39 per violation, in addition to any criminal penalty, on any person who practices  
40 physical therapy in this State without a license when required.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 640.060 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2        640.060 For the purpose of NRS 640.080, the Board shall ~~not~~  
3 approve any school or educational curriculum ~~[unless graduation~~  
4 ~~from the school or completion of the curriculum entitles the~~  
5 ~~applicant, insofar as educational requirements are concerned, to~~  
6 ~~become a member in the American Physical Therapy Association.]~~  
7 *taught at a school if the school is accredited by an accrediting*  
8 *agency recognized by the Board.*

9       **Sec. 2.** NRS 640.120 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
10      640.120 1. The Board may issue, without examination, a  
11 license to practice physical therapy for a period not to exceed 6  
12 months to any person who meets the qualifications set forth in NRS  
13 640.080, except subsection 3 thereof, upon certification that he has  
14 been assigned to the State of Nevada on a temporary basis to assist  
15 in a medical emergency. Issuance of the temporary license is subject  
16 to such fees, not to exceed \$100, and conditions as the Board may  
17 require.

18      2. A student of physical therapy is not required to be licensed  
19 during his clinical training if his work is done under the direct  
20 supervision of a licensed physical therapist.

21      3. *A person who has applied for licensure as a physical*  
22 *therapist and who meets the qualifications set forth in NRS*



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1   **640.080, except subsection 3 thereof, is temporarily exempt from  
2 licensure and may practice physical therapy during the period of  
3 the temporary exemption if:**

4       (a) **The person has submitted a completed application for  
5 licensure for the first time and the application has been approved  
6 by the Board;**

7       (b) **The Board has approved the person to sit for the  
8 examination required pursuant to NRS 640.100;**

9       (c) **The person has not previously failed an examination for  
10 licensure as a physical therapist;**

11       (d) **The person practices physical therapy under the  
12 supervision of a licensed physical therapist and in accordance  
13 with the provisions of this chapter and the regulations of the  
14 Board; and**

15       (e) **The person complies with any other requirements of the  
16 Board to practice physical therapy during the period of the  
17 temporary exemption.**

18       4. **The temporary exemption authorized by subsection 3  
19 begins on the date on which the Board notifies the person that he  
20 may practice physical therapy under the temporary exemption and  
21 continues until the date of the examination if the person does not  
22 take the examination or until the date on which the Board notifies  
23 the person of the results of the examination. During the period of  
24 the temporary exemption, the person:**

25           (a) **Shall not use as his title or professional credentials any  
26 words, letters or insignia except for the words "graduate of  
27 physical therapy."**

28           (b) **Is subject to the regulatory and disciplinary authority of the  
29 Board to the same extent as a licensed physical therapist.**

30       Sec. 3. NRS 640.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

31       640.150 1. A license to practice physical therapy expires on  
32 July 31 of each year. A physical therapist may renew his license  
33 before its expiration upon:

34           (a) Presentation of proof of completion of a program of  
35 continuing education as required by subsection 3;

36           (b) Submission of the statement required pursuant to NRS  
37 640.095; and

38           (c) Payment of a renewal fee established by the Board.

39       2. A license that is not renewed before July 31 of each year  
40 expires. An expired license may be reinstated, at the discretion of  
41 the Board, upon submission of the statement required pursuant to  
42 NRS 640.095 and payment of the annual renewal fee and the annual  
43 expiration fee established by the Board for each year the license is  
44 expired.



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1       3. The Board shall require licensed physical therapists to  
2 complete a program of continuing education as a requirement for the  
3 renewal of licenses. The Board shall, by regulation:

- 4           (a) Prescribe the curriculum;  
5           (b) Approve the courses of study or training; and  
6           (c) Establish the fees,

7       → for the program.

8       **4. The Board may, pursuant to subsection 3, establish a fee of  
9 not more than \$150 to consider approval of a course of study or  
10 training.**

11      **Sec. 4.** NRS 640.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

12      640.150 1. A license to practice physical therapy expires on  
13 July 31 of each year. A physical therapist may renew his license  
14 before its expiration upon:

15           (a) Presentation of proof of completion of a program of  
16 continuing education as required by subsection 3; and

17           (b) Payment of a renewal fee established by the Board.

18      2. A license that is not renewed before July 31 of each year  
19 expires. An expired license may be reinstated, at the discretion of  
20 the Board, upon payment of the annual renewal fee and the annual  
21 expiration fee established by the Board for each year the license is  
22 expired.

23      3. The Board shall require licensed physical therapists to  
24 complete a program of continuing education as a requirement for the  
25 renewal of licenses. The Board shall, by regulation:

26           (a) Prescribe the curriculum;

27           (b) Approve the courses of study or training; and

28           (c) Establish the fees,

29       → for the program.

30       **4. The Board may, pursuant to subsection 3, establish a fee of  
31 not more than \$150 to consider approval of a course of study or  
32 training.**

33      **Sec. 5.** NRS 640.169 is hereby amended to read as follows:

34      640.169 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 629.091 ~~H~~  
35 **and 640.120**, it is unlawful for any person to practice physical  
36 therapy in this State unless he holds a license or a temporary license  
37 issued pursuant to this chapter.

38      2. **In addition to any criminal penalty that may be imposed  
39 for a violation of subsection 1, the Board, after notice and  
40 hearing, may issue an order against any person who has violated  
41 subsection 1 imposing a civil penalty of not more than \$5,000 for  
42 each violation. Any civil penalty collected pursuant to this  
43 subsection must be deposited in the State General Fund.**



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1       **Sec. 6.** NRS 640.240 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2       640.240 1. For the purposes of NRS 640.230, the Board shall  
3 not approve any educational curriculum for a physical therapist's  
4 assistant unless the curriculum includes elementary or intermediate  
5 courses in clinical, anatomical, biological and physical sciences and  
6 is:

7       (a) At least a 2-year program requiring a minimum of 60  
8 academic semester credits at a college accredited by a recognized  
9 accrediting agency; or

10     (b) A curriculum which is provided by the Armed Forces of the  
11 United States. ~~[and has been approved by the American Physical  
12 Therapy Association.]~~

13     2. The Board may refuse to approve any educational  
14 curriculum for physical therapist's assistants if the curriculum does  
15 not include such courses in theory and procedures as determined by  
16 the Board to be necessary for these assistants.

17     **Sec. 7.** 1. This section and sections 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6 of this act  
18 become effective on October 1, 2005.

19     2. Section 3 of this act expires by limitation on the date on  
20 which the provisions of 42 U.S.C. § 666 requiring each state to  
21 establish procedures under which the state has authority to withhold  
22 or suspend, or to restrict the use of professional, occupational and  
23 recreational licenses of persons who:

24       (a) Have failed to comply with a subpoena or warrant relating to  
25 a proceeding to determine the paternity of a child or to establish or  
26 enforce an obligation for the support of a child; or

27       (b) Are in arrears in the payment for the support of one or more  
28 children,

29       → are repealed by the Congress of the United States.

30     3. Section 4 of this act becomes effective on the date on which  
31 the provisions of 42 U.S.C. § 666 requiring each state to establish  
32 procedures under which the state has authority to withhold or  
33 suspend, or to restrict the use of professional, occupational and  
34 recreational licenses of persons who:

35       (a) Have failed to comply with a subpoena or warrant relating to  
36 a procedure to determine the paternity of a child or to establish or  
37 enforce an obligation for the support of a child; or

38       (b) Are in arrears in the payment for the support of one or more  
39 children,

40       → are repealed by the Congress of the United States.
