

SENATE BILL NO. 165—SENATOR RHOADS

MARCH 8, 2005

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Referred to Committee on Natural Resources

**SUMMARY**—Specifies permissible uses by State Department of Agriculture of certain fees and other money. (BDR 50-1136)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to the State Department of Agriculture; providing that certain fees and other money may only be used by the State Department of Agriculture to carry out certain provisions relating to weights and measures, public weighmasters and petroleum products; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law prescribes the duties of the State Department of Agriculture and  
2 provides that the Director of the Department shall perform the duties of the State  
3 Sealer of Weights and Measures. (Chapter 561 of NRS) Existing law creates the  
4 Division of Measurement Standards within the Department to administer and  
5 enforce the provisions of law concerning standards for weights and measures, and  
6 public weighing and the inspection, branding and advertisement of certain  
7 petroleum products. (NRS 561.108, Chapters 581 and 582 of NRS, NRS 590.010-  
8 590.330) Existing law directs the State Sealer of Weights and Measures to establish  
9 and collect fees for certain tests, licenses and certificates as part of the duties for  
10 administering standards for weights and measures and public weighing. (NRS  
11 581.075, 582.040)

12 This bill provides that certain fees and other money collected by the State  
13 Sealer of Weights and Measures must be deposited in a separate account in the  
14 State General Fund for the use of the State Department of Agriculture. Money in  
15 the account may be used by the Department only to carry out certain duties of the  
16 Department and of the State Sealer of Weights and Measures.

17 Existing law requires the Department of Motor Vehicles to impose an  
18 inspection fee for motor vehicle fuel or lubricating oil that is transported into or  
19 held for sale in the State and transfer 0.005 of a cent per gallon into an account in  
20 the State General Fund for the State Board of Agriculture. (NRS 590.120)

21        This bill requires the entire inspection fee collected to be deposited into the  
22        separate account created in the State General Fund for the use of the State  
23        Department of Agriculture.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1        **Section 1.** Chapter 561 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3        *1. In addition to the inspection fees transferred pursuant to  
4 NRS 590.120, all fees and other money collected pursuant to the  
5 provisions of NRS 581.001 to 581.395, inclusive, and 582.001 to  
6 582.210, inclusive, must be deposited in the State Treasury and  
7 credited to a separate account in the State General Fund for the  
8 use of the Department.*

9        *2. Expenditures from the account must be made only for  
10 carrying out the provisions of this chapter and chapters 581 and  
11 582 of NRS and NRS 590.010 to 590.330, inclusive.*

12        *3. Money in the account does not lapse to the State General  
13 Fund at the end of a fiscal year. The interest and income earned  
14 on the money in the account, after deducting any applicable  
15 charges, must be credited to the account.*

16        **Sec. 2.** NRS 561.355 is hereby amended to read as follows:

17        561.355 1. The Plant Industry Program is hereby established.

18        2. The following fees and money must be used in the Plant  
19 Industry Program:

20        (a) Fees and money collected pursuant to the provisions of  
21 chapters 552, 555 [~~, 581, 582~~] and 587 of NRS.

22        (b) Laboratory fees collected for the diagnosis of infectious,  
23 contagious and parasitic diseases of bees, as authorized by NRS  
24 561.305, and as are necessary pursuant to the provisions of chapter  
25 552 of NRS.

26        (c) Laboratory fees collected for the diagnosis of infectious,  
27 contagious and destructive diseases of agricultural commodities, and  
28 infestations thereof by pests, as authorized by NRS 561.305, and as  
29 may be necessary pursuant to the provisions of chapter 554 of NRS.

30        (d) Laboratory fees collected for the survey and identification of  
31 insect pests, plant diseases and noxious weeds, as authorized by  
32 NRS 561.305, and as may be necessary pursuant to the provisions of  
33 NRS 555.005 to 555.249, inclusive.

34        (e) Laboratory fees collected for the testing of the purity and  
35 germinating power of agricultural seeds, as authorized by NRS  
36 561.305, and as may be necessary pursuant to the provisions of NRS  
37 587.015 to 587.123, inclusive.



1       (f) Money received from a tax on the transfer of real property  
2 imposed pursuant to NRS 375.026.

3       3. Expenditures for the Plant Industry Program must be made  
4 only for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this chapter  
5 and chapters 552, 554, 555 ~~[, 581, 582]~~ and 587 of NRS.

6       4. The money credited to the Program pursuant to NRS  
7 375.026 must be allocated for disbursement to each county in  
8 proportion to the amount of money collected in that county and must  
9 only be used:

10      (a) By the Department for programs on the exclusion, detection  
11 and control of:

12       (1) Invasive species; and  
13       (2) Endemic pests and weeds designated by the Director; and

14      (b) For grants to local governments and nonprofit organizations  
15 for the control or management of such species, pests and weeds.

16      5. Not later than 30 days after the beginning of each fiscal year,  
17 the Department shall present to each board of county commissioners  
18 for approval by each such board proposed programs for the  
19 exclusion, detection and control of invasive species and endemic  
20 pests and weeds designated by the Director that involve cooperative  
21 action between the Department and the county.

22      6. As used in this section:

23       (a) "Invasive species" means any living organism not native to  
24 this State that may present a threat to the economy, environment or  
25 public health of this State.

26       (b) "Local government" has the meaning ascribed to it in  
27 NRS 237.050.

28      **Sec. 3.** NRS 590.120 is hereby amended to read as follows:

29      590.120 1. Every person, or any officer, agent or employee  
30 thereof, shipping or transporting any motor vehicle fuel or  
31 lubricating oil into this State for sale or consignment, or with intent  
32 to sell or consign the same, shall pay to the Department of Motor  
33 Vehicles an inspection fee of 0.055 of a cent per gallon for every  
34 gallon of motor vehicle fuel or lubricating oil so shipped or  
35 transported into the State, or that is held for sale within this State.  
36 This section does not require the payment of an inspection fee on  
37 any shipment or consignment of motor vehicle fuel or lubricating oil  
38 when the inspection fee has been paid.

39      2. ~~[Of each inspection fee paid to the Department of Motor  
40 Vehicles pursuant to this section, 0.005 of a cent per gallon] The  
41 inspection fees collected pursuant to the provisions of subsection  
42 1, together with any penalties and interest collected thereon,~~ must  
43 be transferred quarterly to ~~[an]~~ the account in the State General  
44 Fund **created pursuant to section 1 of this act**, for the **use of the**



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1 State [Board] **Department** of Agriculture. The State Board of  
2 Agriculture shall use all money transferred pursuant to this  
3 subsection to pay the expenses incurred in enforcing the provisions  
4 of NRS 590.070.

5     3. On or before the last day of each calendar month, every  
6 person, or any officer, agent or employee thereof, required to pay  
7 the inspection fee described in subsection 1 shall send to the  
8 Department of Motor Vehicles a correct report of the motor vehicle  
9 fuel or oil volumes for the preceding month. The report must  
10 include a list of distributors or retailers distributing or selling the  
11 products and must be accompanied by the required fees.

12     4. Failure to send the report and remittance as specified in  
13 subsections 1 and 3 is a violation of NRS 590.010 to 590.150,  
14 inclusive, and is punishable as provided in NRS 590.150.

15     5. The provisions of this section must be carried out in the  
16 manner prescribed in chapters 360A and 365 of NRS.

17         6. ***For the purposes of this section, “motor vehicle fuel” does  
18 not include diesel fuel, burner fuel or kerosene.***

19         Sec. 4. NRS 590.130 is hereby repealed.

20         Sec. 5. This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.

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## TEXT OF REPEALED SECTION

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**590.130 Disposition of inspection fees.** Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of NRS 590.120, all inspection fees received by the Department of Motor Vehicles must be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund, and all expenses incurred in carrying out the provisions of NRS 590.010 to 590.150, inclusive, must be paid out of funds provided by direct legislative appropriation.
