

SENATE BILL NO. 171—SENATORS HARDY AND TOWNSEND

MARCH 9, 2005

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Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

**SUMMARY**—Increases number of Commissioners who serve on Public Utilities Commission of Nevada.  
(BDR 58-625)

**FISCAL NOTE:** Effect on Local Government: No.  
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada; increasing the number of Commissioners who serve on the Commission; increasing the number of Commissioners who must act on any matter before the Commission; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law provides that the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada consists  
2 of three Commissioners appointed by the Governor and establishes the composition  
3 of the Commission. (NRS 703.030)

4 This bill increases the total number of Commissioners to five and changes the  
5 composition of the Commission. This bill also requires that a vacancy filled for the  
6 remainder of an unexpired term be filled in the same manner as the original  
7 appointment.

8 Existing law provides that at least two Commissioners are required for the  
9 Public Utilities Commission to enter a final order on a matter within the jurisdiction  
10 of the Commission. (NRS 703.085)

11 This bill increases the number of Commissioners who must be present and  
12 qualified to act on a matter from two to three for consistency with the increased  
13 number of Commissioners. If there are only three such Commissioners present, all  
14 three must concur to enter a final order of the Commission.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 703.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2      703.030 1. The Commission consists of ~~three~~ five  
3      Commissioners appointed by the Governor. ~~for terms of~~ After the  
4      *initial terms, the term of each Commissioner is* 4 years.

5      2. The Governor shall appoint ~~as members of the Commission~~  
6      ~~persons~~:

7      *(a) One Commissioner to represent the general public.*

8      *(b) Four Commissioners* who have at least 2 years of  
9      experience in one or more of the following fields:

10     ~~(a)~~ (1) Accounting.

11     ~~(b)~~ (2) Business administration.

12     ~~(c)~~ (3) Finance or economics.

13     ~~(d)~~ (4) Administrative law.

14     ~~(e)~~ (5) Professional engineering.

15     *Not more than two of the Commissioners appointed pursuant to*  
16     *this paragraph may be from the same field of experience.*

17     3. Not more than ~~two~~ three of the Commissioners may be ~~from~~

18     ~~—(a) Members~~ members of the same political party.

19     ~~(b) From the same field of experience.~~

20     *4. A vacancy on the Commission must be filled for the*  
21     *remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the*  
22     *original appointment.*

23     **Sec. 2.** NRS 703.085 is hereby amended to read as follows:

24     703.085 1. A majority of the Commissioners has full power  
25     to act in all matters within the jurisdiction of the Commission. *If*  
26     *there are only three Commissioners who are able to act on a*  
27     *matter, all three Commissioners must concur to act on behalf of*  
28     *the Commission.*

29     2. Before the Commission may enter a final order on a matter,  
30     there must be at least ~~two~~ three Commissioners who are able to act  
31     on the matter. If there are fewer than ~~two~~ three Commissioners  
32     who are able to act on the matter because of disqualifications,  
33     illnesses, incapacities, vacancies that have not yet been filled, or any  
34     other reason, the Governor shall appoint the requisite number of  
35     persons to serve as Acting Commissioners in the place of the  
36     Commissioners who are unable to act on the matter so that there are  
37     at least ~~two~~ three persons who are able to act on the matter,  
38     whether serving as a Commissioner or an Acting Commissioner. If  
39     there are fewer than ~~two~~ three Commissioners who are able to act  
40     on the matter because of disqualifications, illnesses, incapacities,  
41     vacancies that have not yet been filled, or any other reason, and the  
42     Governor has not appointed the requisite number of persons to serve



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1 as Acting Commissioners pursuant to this subsection, the Deputy  
2 Commissioner appointed pursuant to subsection 1 of NRS 703.130  
3 may serve as an Acting Commissioner.

4       3. Before the Governor may appoint a person to serve as an  
5 Acting Commissioner in the place of a Commissioner who is unable  
6 to act on the matter, the person must be qualified to serve in the  
7 office of that Commissioner as if the Governor were appointing the  
8 person to fill a vacancy in that office.

9       4. A person who is appointed or authorized to serve as an  
10 Acting Commissioner shall be deemed to be a Commissioner and is  
11 entitled to exercise the powers of a Commissioner only in  
12 proceedings before the Commission that involve the matter or  
13 matters for which the person is appointed or authorized to serve as  
14 an Acting Commissioner.

15       5. A person who is appointed to serve as an Acting  
16 Commissioner:

17           (a) Is subject to all legal requirements and restrictions and  
18 enjoys all legal protections and immunities that apply to a  
19 Commissioner and to state officers generally while the person is  
20 engaged in the business of the Commission as an Acting  
21 Commissioner; and

22           (b) Is entitled to receive, for each day the person is engaged in  
23 the business of the Commission as an Acting Commissioner, a  
24 salary of \$80 and the per diem allowance and travel expenses  
25 provided for state officers and employees generally. The person is  
26 not entitled to receive any other compensation for serving as an  
27 Acting Commissioner.

28       6. A person who is appointed to serve as an Acting  
29 Commissioner serves at the pleasure of the Governor. The  
30 appointment of the person expires:

31           (a) On the date that the Governor declares that the appointment  
32 has expired; or

33           (b) On the date that the matter or matters for which the person  
34 was appointed are no longer pending before the Commission,  
35 ➔ whichever date occurs earlier.

36       7. The Governor may reappoint a person to serve as an Acting  
37 Commissioner.

38       **Sec. 3.** 1. As soon as practicable after passage and approval  
39 of this act, the Governor shall appoint two additional  
40 Commissioners to the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada in  
41 accordance with the provisions of section 1 of this act. For the initial  
42 terms of those Commissioners, the Governor shall appoint:

43           (a) One Commissioner whose term begins on October 1, 2005,  
44 and expires on September 30, 2008; and



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1       (b) One Commissioner whose term begins on October 1, 2005,  
2 and expires on September 30, 2009.

3       2. The provisions of this act do not abrogate or affect the term  
4 of office of any other Commissioner of the Public Utilities  
5 Commission of Nevada.

6       **Sec. 4.** 1. This section and section 3 of this act become  
7 effective upon passage and approval.

8       2. Sections 1 and 2 of this act become effective on October 1,  
9 2005.

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
