

SENATE BILL No. 179—COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

MARCH 14, 2005

Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Provides formula to calculate salaries of peace officers of Department of Public Safety. (BDR 23-938)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No.

AN ACT relating to peace officers; requiring the Director of the Department of Personnel to calculate the average salaries of certain law enforcement personnel; requiring the Director of the Department of Public Safety to include in the proposed budget of the Department the salaries for peace officers which are based on those calculations; making appropriations to increase the salaries of such officers; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires the Director of the Department of Personnel to prepare a
2 classification plan and pay plan for employees in the classified service. (NRS
3 284.160, 284.175)

4 This bill requires the Director of the Department of Personnel to conduct a
5 salary survey of police officers employed in the larger cities and counties in Nevada
6 in each even-numbered year. The Director must forward the results of that survey
7 to the Department of Administration and the Department of Public Safety. The
8 Director of the Department of Public Safety must set the salaries of peace officers
9 in the biennial budget for the first year at amounts which are equal to or greater
10 than the average salary of police officers of equal rank or equivalent duties as
11 determined pursuant to the salary survey. Those amounts may be adjusted for
12 inflation the second year.

13 This bill also makes appropriations to the State Board of Examiners for the
14 salaries of peace officers in the Department of Public Safety for Fiscal Years 2005-
15 2006 and 2006-2007. The appropriation is for salary levels equal to the salary
16 levels of peace officers in the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 284 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. The Director shall calculate the respective average salaries
4 as of July 1 of each even-numbered year of all police officers of
5 equivalent rank or equivalent duties employed by:*

6 *(a) Law enforcement agencies in cities whose population is
7 60,000 or more;*

8 *(b) Law enforcement agencies in counties whose population is
9 100,000 or more; and*

10 *(c) Metropolitan police departments formed pursuant to
11 chapter 280 of NRS in counties whose population is 100,000 or
12 more.*

13 *2. The Director shall forward the figures of the average
14 salaries calculated pursuant to this section to the Chief of the
15 Budget Division of the Department of Administration and the
16 Director of the Department of Public Safety not later than July 15
17 of each even-numbered year.*

18 **Sec. 2.** Chapter 353 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
19 thereto a new section to read as follows:

20 *1. In preparing the proposed biennial budget for the
21 Department of Public Safety, the Director of the Department of
22 Public Safety shall set the respective salaries of the peace officers
23 employed by the Department of Public Safety at amounts which:*

24 *(a) For the first year of the biennium, are equal to or greater
25 than the average salary of police officers of equivalent rank or
26 equivalent duties as calculated by the Director of the Department
27 of Personnel pursuant to section 2 of this act; and*

28 *(b) For the second year of the biennium, are equal to the
29 respective amounts proposed pursuant to paragraph (a), plus an
30 adjustment for inflation, if any. The amounts of the adjustments
31 must be determined by multiplying the respective amounts
32 established pursuant to paragraph (a) by the percentage of
33 increase, if any. The Consumer Price Index published by the
34 United States Department of Labor for July preceding each
35 biennium must be used to determine the percentage of inflation.*

36 *2. In preparing the proposed executive budget, the Chief shall
37 ensure that the salaries of the peace officers employed by the
38 Department of Public Safety, as included in the proposed budget
39 of the Department of Public Safety, are established in accordance
40 with the provisions of subsection 1.*

1 **Sec. 3.** NRS 353.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 353.150 NRS 353.150 to 353.246, inclusive, ***and section 2 of***
3 ***this act*** may be cited as the State Budget Act.

4 **Sec. 4.** 1. The Department of Personnel shall increase the
5 level of compensation of all peace officers employed by the
6 Department of Public Safety to that of similar positions of the Las
7 Vegas Metropolitan Police Department.

8 2. There is hereby appropriated from the State Highway Fund
9 to the State Board of Examiners to increase the level of
10 compensation of all uniformed positions in the Nevada Highway
11 Patrol pursuant to subsection 1:

12 For the Fiscal Year 2005-2006..... \$11,326,000
13 For the Fiscal Year 2006-2007..... \$11,329,000

14 3. Except for uniformed positions in the Nevada Highway
15 Patrol, there is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to
16 the State Board of Examiners to increase the level of compensation
17 of all peace officers employed by the Department of Public Safety
18 pursuant to subsection 1:

19 For the Fiscal Year 2005-2006..... \$9,830,000
20 For the Fiscal Year 2006-2007..... \$9,832,000

21 4. Any balance of the money appropriated by subsections 2 and
22 3 for the Fiscal Year 2005-2006 does not revert to the Fund from
23 which it was appropriated, but must be carried forward to the next
24 fiscal year.

25 5. Any balance of the money appropriated by subsections 2 and
26 3 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2007, and
27 must be reverted to the Fund from which it was appropriated on or
28 before September 21, 2007.

29 **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.
