

SENATE BILL NO. 265—SENATORS RHOADS AND MCGINNESS

MARCH 22, 2005

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Referred to Committee on Finance

**SUMMARY**—Provides for allowances for certain travel expenses incurred by Legislators during legislative interim. (BDR 17-538)

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AN ACT relating to the State Legislature; providing for allowances for certain travel expenses incurred by Legislators during the legislative interim; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** Chapter 218 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3       *1. Except as otherwise provided in this section and NRS  
4 218.2207, each Senator and Assemblyman is entitled to receive,  
5 during the legislative interim, an allowance for travel within his  
6 legislative district to participate in public meetings with elected  
7 bodies having jurisdiction over any area within that legislative  
8 district, including, without limitation, a board of county  
9 commissioners, city council, town board or board of trustees of a  
10 school district.*

11       *2. The maximum allowance for travel payable to each  
12 Senator and Assemblyman pursuant to this section during a  
13 legislative interim is \$5,000, except that no allowance for travel  
14 pursuant to this section is payable to a Senator or Assemblyman  
15 for travel that occurs during the legislative interim at any time  
16 after the date on which the Senator or Assemblyman has filed a*

1       *declaration or an acceptance of candidacy for an elective office*  
2       *and remains a candidate for that office.*

3       *3. Transportation must be by the most economical means,*  
4       *considering total cost and time spent in transit. The allowance is:*

5       *(a) If the travel is by private conveyance, the standard mileage*  
6       *reimbursement rate for which a deduction is allowed for the*  
7       *purposes of federal income tax.*

8       *(b) If the travel is not by private conveyance, the actual*  
9       *amount expended.*

10      *4. Claims made pursuant to this section must be paid from*  
11      *the Legislative Fund unless otherwise provided by specific statute.*  
12      *A claim must not be paid unless the Senator or Assemblyman*  
13      *submits a signed statement affirming:*

14       *(a) The date of travel; and*

15       *(b) The places of departure and arrival and, if the travel is by*  
16       *private conveyance, the actual miles traveled. If the travel is not by*  
17       *private conveyance, the claim must include a receipt or other*  
18       *evidence of the expenditure.*

19      Sec. 2. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
