SUMMARY—Provides for certification, regulation and discipline of alcohol and drug abuse prevention specialists and interns, and problem gambling prevention specialists and interns. (BDR 54-144)

AN ACT relating to professions; providing for the certification, regulation and discipline of alcohol and drug abuse prevention specialists and interns, and problem gambling prevention specialists and interns, by the Board of Examiners for Alcohol, Drug and Gambling Counselors; prohibiting the practice of such persons without certification; authorizing the Board to adopt regulations relating to such persons; revising provisions governing alcohol and drug abuse counselors and problem gambling counselors; authorizing and increasing certain fees; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. NRS 641.029 is hereby amended to read as follows: 641.029 The provisions of this chapter do not apply to:
- 3 1. A physician who is licensed to practice in this State;

- 2. A person who is licensed to practice dentistry in this State;
- 5 3. A person who is licensed as a marriage and family therapist 6 pursuant to chapter 641A of NRS;



- 4. A person who is licensed to engage in social work pursuant to chapter 641B of NRS;
