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**SENATE BILL NO. 311—SENATOR NOLAN****MARCH 24, 2005**

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Referred to Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections

**SUMMARY**—Increases allowance for Legislators for reimbursement of travel and other expenses during legislative session. (BDR 17-742)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to the Legislature; increasing the amount of the supplemental allowance a Legislator is entitled to receive for reimbursement of travel and other expenses during a legislative session; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

- 1     Existing law entitles a Legislator to receive a maximum supplemental  
2 allowance of \$6,800 for a regular session and \$1,000 for a special session. The  
3 supplemental allowance must be used for certain travel and housing expenses.  
4 (NRS 218.220)  
5     This bill increases that allowance to \$10,000 for a regular session and \$1,200  
6 for a special session.
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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1     **Section 1.** NRS 218.220 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2        218.220 1. The per diem expense allowance and the travel  
3 and telephone expenses of Senators and Assemblymen elected or  
4 appointed and in attendance at any session or presession orientation  
5 conference of the Legislature must be allowed in the manner set  
6 forth in this section.  
7        2. For initial travel from his home to Carson City, Nevada, to  
8 attend a session or presession orientation conference of the



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1 Legislature, and for return travel from Carson City, Nevada, to his  
2 home upon adjournment sine die of a session or termination of a  
3 presession orientation conference of the Legislature, each Senator  
4 and Assemblyman is entitled to receive:

5 (a) A per diem expense allowance, not to exceed the maximum  
6 rate established by the Federal Government for the Carson City area,  
7 for one day's travel to and one day's travel from the session or  
8 conference.

9 (b) Travel expenses.

10 3. In addition to the per diem and travel expenses authorized by  
11 subsection 2, each Senator and Assemblyman is entitled to receive a  
12 supplemental allowance which must not exceed:

13 (a) A total of ~~\$6,800~~ \$10,000 during each regular session of  
14 the Legislature for:

15 (1) His actual expenses in moving to and from Carson City  
16 for the session;

17 (2) Travel to and from his home or temporary residence or  
18 for traveling to and from legislative committee and subcommittee  
19 meetings or hearings or for individual travel within the State which  
20 relates to legislative business;

21 (3) If he rents furniture for his temporary residence rather  
22 than moving similar furniture from his home, the cost of renting that  
23 furniture not to exceed the amount that it would have cost to move  
24 the furniture to and from his home; and

25 (4) If:

26 (I) His home is more than 50 miles from Carson City; and  
27 (II) He maintains temporary quarters in or near Carson  
28 City for which he has entered into a lease or other agreement for  
29 occupancy during a regular legislative session,

30 → the cost of such additional housing, paid at the end of each month  
31 during the legislative session, beginning the month of the first day  
32 of the legislative session and ending the month of the adjournment  
33 sine die of the legislative session, in an amount that is the fair  
34 market rent for a one bedroom unit in Carson City as published by  
35 the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development  
36 prorated for the number of days of the month that he actually  
37 maintained the temporary quarters in or near Carson City. For the  
38 purposes of this subparagraph, any day before the first day of the  
39 legislative session or after the day of the adjournment sine die of  
40 the legislative session may not be counted as a day for which he  
41 actually maintained such temporary quarters; and

42 (b) A total of ~~\$1,000~~ \$1,200 during each special session of the  
43 Legislature for travel to and from his home or temporary residence  
44 or for traveling to and from legislative committee and subcommittee



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1 meetings or hearings or for individual travel within the State which  
2 relates to legislative business.

3       4. Each Senator and Assemblyman is entitled to receive a per  
4 diem expense allowance, not to exceed the maximum rate  
5 established by the Federal Government for the Carson City area, for  
6 each day that the Legislature is in session or in a pre-session  
7 orientation conference and for each day that he attends a meeting of  
8 a standing committee of which he is a member when the Legislature  
9 has adjourned for more than 4 days.

10      5. Each Senator and Assemblyman who maintains temporary  
11 quarters in or near Carson City for which he has entered into a lease  
12 or other agreement for continuous occupancy for the duration of a  
13 legislative session is entitled to receive a lodging allowance equal to  
14 that portion of the expense allowance which the Legislative  
15 Commission designates by rule as being allocated to lodging, for not  
16 more than 14 days in each period in which:

17       (a) The Legislature has adjourned until a time certain; and

18       (b) The Senator or Assemblyman is not entitled to a per diem  
19 expense allowance pursuant to subsection 4.

20      6. In addition to the per diem expense allowance authorized by  
21 subsection 4 and the lodging allowance authorized by subsection 5,  
22 each Senator and Assemblyman who maintains temporary quarters  
23 in or near Carson City for which he has entered into a lease or other  
24 agreement for continuous occupancy for the duration of a legislative  
25 session is entitled to receive a lodging allowance equal to that  
26 portion of the expense allowance which the Legislative Commission  
27 designates by rule as being allocated to lodging, for not more than  
28 17 days in each period in which:

29       (a) The Legislature has adjourned for more than 4 days; and

30       (b) The Senator or Assemblyman must obtain temporary lodging  
31 in a location that a standing committee of which he is a member is  
32 meeting.

33      7. Each Senator and Assemblyman is entitled to receive a  
34 lodging allowance equal to that portion of the expense allowance  
35 which the Legislative Commission designates by rule as being  
36 allocated to lodging, for not more than 6 days in each period in  
37 which:

38       (a) The Legislature has adjourned for more than 4 days; and

39       (b) The Senator or Assemblyman must obtain temporary lodging  
40 in a location that a standing committee of which he is a member is  
41 meeting,

42       → if the Senator or Assemblyman is not entitled to the per diem  
43 expense allowance authorized by subsection 4 or the lodging  
44 allowances authorized by subsections 5 and 6.



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1       8. Each Senator and Assemblyman is entitled to receive a  
2 telephone allowance of not more than \$2,800 for the payment of  
3 tolls and charges incurred by him in the performance of official  
4 business during each regular session of the Legislature and not more  
5 than \$300 during each special session of the Legislature.

6       9. An employee of the Legislature assigned to serve a standing  
7 committee is entitled to receive the travel expenses and per diem  
8 expense allowance provided by law for state employees generally if  
9 he is required to attend a hearing of the committee outside Carson  
10 City.

11      10. Claims for per diem expense allowances authorized by  
12 subsection 4 and lodging allowances authorized by subsections 5, 6  
13 and 7 must be paid once each week during a legislative session and  
14 upon completion of a presession orientation conference.

15      11. A claim for travel expenses authorized by subsection 2 or 3  
16 must not be paid unless the Senator or Assemblyman submits a  
17 signed statement affirming:

18           (a) The date of the travel; and

19           (b) The places of departure and arrival and, if the travel is by  
20 private conveyance, the actual miles traveled. If the travel is not by  
21 private conveyance, the claim must include a receipt or other  
22 evidence of the expenditure.

23      12. Travel expenses authorized by subsections 2 and 3 are  
24 limited to:

25           (a) If the travel is by private conveyance, a rate equal to the  
26 standard mileage reimbursement rate for which a deduction is  
27 allowed for the purposes of federal income tax. If two or more  
28 Legislators travel in the same private conveyance, the Legislator  
29 who provided or arranged for providing the transportation is  
30 presumed entitled to reimbursement.

31           (b) If the travel is not by private conveyance, the actual amount  
32 expended.

33      → Transportation must be by the most economical means,  
34 considering total cost, time spent in transit and the availability of  
35 state-owned automobiles.

36      **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval  
37 and applies to reimbursement of expenses for the 73rd Session of  
38 the Nevada Legislature.
