

SENATE BILL NO. 342—SENATOR AMODEI

MARCH 24, 2005

Referred to Committee on Natural Resources

SUMMARY—Revises provisions relating to issuance of game tags to residents and nonresidents of this State. (BDR 45-1030)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact.
Effect on the State: Yes.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to wildlife; requiring the Board of Wildlife Commissioners to ensure that certain chances or other advantages are not conferred upon a resident of this State in issuing tags for certain hunts; prohibiting the Board from establishing certain percentages or numbers of tags that are available for issuance to such a resident; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 501.181 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 2 501.181 The Commission shall:
 - 3 1. Establish broad policies for:
 - 4 (a) The protection, propagation, restoration, transplanting,
5 introduction and management of wildlife in this State.
 - 6 (b) The promotion of the safety of persons using or property
7 used in the operation of vessels on the waters of this State.
 - 8 (c) The promotion of uniformity of laws relating to policy
9 matters.
 - 10 2. Guide the Department in its administration and enforcement
11 of the provisions of this title and of chapter 488 of NRS by the
12 establishment of such policies.
 - 13 3. Establish policies for areas of interest including:



1 (a) The management of big and small game mammals, upland
2 and migratory game birds, fur-bearing mammals, game fish, and
3 protected and unprotected mammals, birds, fish, reptiles and
4 amphibians.

5 (b) The control of wildlife depredations.

6 (c) The acquisition of lands, water rights and easements and
7 other property for the management, propagation, protection and
8 restoration of wildlife.

9 (d) The entry, access to, and occupancy and use of such
10 property, including leases of grazing rights, sales of agricultural
11 products and requests by the Director to the State Land Registrar for
12 the sale of timber if the sale does not interfere with the use of the
13 property on which the timber is located for wildlife management or
14 for hunting or fishing thereon.

15 (e) The control of **resident or** nonresident hunters.

16 (f) The introduction, transplanting or exporting of wildlife.

17 (g) Cooperation with federal, state and local agencies on wildlife
18 and boating programs.

19 (h) The revocation of licenses issued pursuant to this title to any
20 person who is convicted of a violation of any provision of this title
21 or any regulation adopted pursuant thereto.

22 4. Establish regulations necessary to carry out the provisions of
23 this title and of chapter 488 of NRS, including:

24 (a) **[Seasons] Except as otherwise provided in section 2 of this**
25 **act, seasons** for hunting game mammals and game birds, for hunting
26 or trapping fur-bearing mammals and for fishing, the daily and
27 possession limits, the manner and means of taking wildlife,
28 including, but not limited to, the sex, size or other physical
29 differentiation for each species, and, when necessary for
30 management purposes, the emergency closing or extending of a
31 season, reducing or increasing of the bag or possession limits on a
32 species, or the closing of any area to hunting, fishing or trapping.
33 The regulations must be established after first considering the
34 recommendations of the Department, the county advisory boards to
35 manage wildlife and others who wish to present their views at an
36 open meeting. Any regulations relating to the closure of a season
37 must be based upon scientific data concerning the management of
38 wildlife. The data upon which the regulations are based must be
39 collected or developed by the Department.

40 (b) The manner of using, attaching, filling out, punching,
41 inspecting, validating or reporting tags.

42 (c) The delineation of game management units embracing
43 contiguous territory located in more than one county, irrespective of
44 county boundary lines.



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1 (d) The number of licenses issued for big game and, if
2 necessary, other game species.

3 5. Adopt regulations requiring the Department to make public,
4 before official delivery, its proposed responses to any requests by
5 federal agencies for its comment on drafts of statements concerning
6 the environmental effect of proposed actions or regulations affecting
7 public lands.

8 6. Adopt regulations:

9 (a) Governing the provisions of the permit required by NRS
10 502.390 and for the issuance, renewal and revocation of such a
11 permit.

12 (b) Establishing the method for determining the amount of an
13 assessment, and the time and manner of payment, necessary for the
14 collection of the assessment required by NRS 502.390.

15 7. Designate those portions of wildlife management areas for
16 big game mammals that are of special concern for the regulation of
17 the importation, possession and propagation of alternative livestock
18 pursuant to NRS 576.129.

19 Sec. 2. Chapter 502 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
20 thereto a new section to read as follows:

21 *1. In establishing the manner of issuing a tag for any hunt
22 for which a tag is required pursuant to NRS 502.130, the
23 Commission:*

24 *(a) Shall ensure that the manner of issuing the tag does not
25 confer a chance or other advantage upon a resident of this State
26 that is greater than any chance or advantage conferred upon a
27 nonresident of this State in obtaining the tag; and*

28 *(b) Shall not establish a percentage or number of tags that are
29 available for issuance to residents of this State for the hunt in an
30 amount that is greater than the percentage or number of tags that
31 are available for issuance to nonresidents of this State for the
32 hunt.*

33 *2. The provisions of this section do not require the
34 Commission to issue a tag to a person for a hunt specified in
35 subsection 1.*

36 *3. As used in this section, "manner of issuing a tag" includes,
37 without limitation, establishing a quota, awarding a bonus point
38 and conducting a drawing.*

39 Sec. 3. NRS 502.140 is hereby amended to read as follows:

40 *502.140 Except as otherwise provided in section 2 of this act:*

41 1. Tags may be used as a method of enforcing a limit of the
42 number of any species which may be taken by any one person in any
43 one season or year, and may be issued in such a manner that only a
44 certain number may be used in any one management area, or that



1 one tag may be used in several management areas, as designated by
2 the Commission.

3 2. The Commission shall designate the number of tags for any
4 species which may be obtained by any one person, and it is unlawful
5 for any person to obtain tags for his use in excess of this number.
6 Except as otherwise provided in NRS 502.145, it is unlawful for any
7 person to use or possess tags issued to any other person, or to
8 transfer or give tags issued to him to any other person.

9 **Sec. 4.** NRS 502.146 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10 502.146 As used in NRS 502.146 to 502.149, inclusive:

11 1. "Restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer hunt" means a deer hunt in
12 which a restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer hunter hunts with a licensed
13 master guide or licensed subguide.

14 2. "Restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer hunter" means a person who
15 is ~~not a resident of this State and is~~ issued a restricted
16 ~~nonresident~~ deer tag.

17 3. "Restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer tag" means a tag which is
18 issued to a ~~nonresident~~ person for a restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer
19 hunt.

20 **Sec. 5.** NRS 502.147 is hereby amended to read as follows:

21 502.147 1. The Department shall make available restricted
22 ~~nonresident~~ deer tags in an amount not to exceed the amount set
23 forth in this section. If the number of persons who apply for
24 restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer tags is greater than the number of tags
25 to be issued, the Department shall conduct a drawing to determine
26 the persons to whom to issue the tags.

27 2. The number of restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer tags must:

28 (a) Be subtracted from the quota of rifle deer tags for
29 ~~nonresidents;~~ **the season in which the restricted deer tags are**
30 **issued;** and

31 (b) Not exceed 16 percent of the deer tags issued ~~to~~
32 ~~nonresidents~~ during the previous year or 400 tags, whichever is
33 greater.

34 3. The number of restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer tags issued for
35 any management area or unit must not exceed 37.5 percent, rounded
36 to the nearest whole number, of the rifle deer tags issued ~~to~~
37 ~~nonresidents~~ during the previous year for that management area or
38 unit.

39 4. The Department shall mail the tags to the successful
40 applicants.

41 **Sec. 6.** NRS 502.148 is hereby amended to read as follows:

42 502.148 1. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection,
43 any person who wishes to apply for a restricted ~~nonresident~~ deer
44 tag pursuant to NRS 502.147 must complete an application on a
45 form prescribed and furnished by the Department. A licensed master



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1 guide may complete the application for an applicant. The
2 application must be signed by the applicant and the master guide
3 who will be responsible for conducting the restricted [nonresident]
4 deer hunt.

5 2. The application must be accompanied by a fee for the tag of
6 \$300, plus any other fees which the Department may require. The
7 Commission shall establish the time limits and acceptable methods
8 for submitting such applications to the Department.

9 3. Any application for a restricted [nonresident] deer tag which
10 contains an error or omission must be rejected and the fee for the tag
11 returned to the applicant.

12 4. A person who is issued a restricted [nonresident] deer tag is
13 not eligible to apply for any other deer tag issued in this State for the
14 same hunting season as that restricted [nonresident] deer hunt.

15 5. All fees collected pursuant to this section must be deposited
16 with the State Treasurer for credit to the Wildlife Account in the
17 State General Fund.

18 **Sec. 7.** NRS 502.149 is hereby amended to read as follows:
19 502.149 A restricted [nonresident] deer hunter must be
20 accompanied at all times during the restricted [nonresident] deer
21 hunt by the licensed master guide who cosigned the application or
22 one of his licensed subguides.

23 **Sec. 8.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
