AN ACT making a contingent appropriation to the Department of Transportation for Rural Transit Operations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
2 General Fund to the Department of Transportation for Rural Transit
3 Operations:

4 For the Fiscal Year 2005-2006..... \$761,391
5 For the Fiscal Year 2006-2007..... \$761,391

6 2. The Department of Transportation may use the money
7 appropriated by subsection 1 only if matching money is provided by
8 cities and counties of the State from sources other than the
9 appropriation in subsection 1.

10 **Sec. 2.** For each fiscal year, the money must be allocated in
11 the following manner:

12 1. For the Capital Bus Program..... \$61,391



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1 2. For the Elderly and Persons with Disabilities
2 Formula Program..... \$72,000
3 3. For the Rural and Nonurbanized Rural Public
4 Transportation Program..... \$430,000
5 4. For the Job Access Reverse Commute
6 Discretionary Funds..... \$198,000
7 **Sec. 3.** Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
8 section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after
9 June 30, 2007, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or
10 before September 21, 2007.
11 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.

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
