AN ACT relating to crimes against property; revising provisions governing the crime of burglary; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1       **Section 1.** NRS 205.060 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2       205.060 1. A person who, by day or night, enters any house,  
3 room, apartment, tenement, shop, warehouse, store, mill, barn,  
4 stable, outhouse or other building, tent, vessel, vehicle, vehicle  
5 trailer, semitrailer or house trailer, airplane, glider, boat or railroad  
6 car, with the intent to commit grand or petit larceny, assault or  
7 battery on any person or any felony, ***or to obtain money or property***  
8 ***by false pretenses,*** is guilty of burglary.  
9       2. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a person  
10 convicted of burglary is guilty of a category B felony and shall be  
11 punished by imprisonment in the state prison for a minimum term of  
12 not less than 1 year and a maximum term of not more than 10 years,  
13 and may be further punished by a fine of not more than \$10,000. A  
14 person who is convicted of burglary and who has previously been  
15 convicted of burglary or another crime involving the forcible entry  
16 or invasion of a dwelling must not be released on probation or  
17 granted a suspension of his sentence.  
18       3. Whenever a burglary is committed on a vessel, vehicle,  
19 vehicle trailer, semitrailer, house trailer, airplane, glider, boat or

1 railroad car, in motion or in rest, in this State, and it cannot with  
2 reasonable certainty be ascertained in what county the crime was  
3 committed, the offender may be arrested and tried in any county  
4 through which the vessel, vehicle, vehicle trailer, semitrailer, house  
5 trailer, airplane, glider, boat or railroad car traveled during the time  
6 the burglary was committed.

7       4. A person convicted of burglary who has in his possession or  
8 gains possession of any firearm or deadly weapon at any time during  
9 the commission of the crime, at any time before leaving the  
10 structure or upon leaving the structure, is guilty of a category B  
11 felony and shall be punished by imprisonment in the state prison for  
12 a minimum term of not less than 2 years and a maximum term of not  
13 more than 15 years, and may be further punished by a fine of not  
14 more than \$10,000.

15     **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
