AN ACT making an appropriation for the implementation of an Offender Tracking Information System for the Department of Corrections; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
- 2 General Fund to the Interim Finance Committee to provide early
- 3 funding for the implementation of an Offender Tracking
- 4 Information System for the Department of Corrections:
- 5 For the Fiscal Year 2005-2006..... \$10,901,583
- 6 For the Fiscal Year 2006-2007..... \$207,931
- 7 2. If the Department of Corrections determines that additional
- 8 resources are necessary to implement an Offender Tracking
- 9 Information System, the Department shall transmit a request for an
- 10 allocation from the money appropriated by this section to the State
- 11 Board of Examiners. Upon receipt of the request, the State Board of
- 12 Examiners shall consider the request and transmit the request with
- 13 the recommendation of the Board to the Interim Finance Committee.
- 14 3. The Interim Finance Committee is not required to approve
- 15 the entire amount of an allocation recommended pursuant to



1 subsection 2 or to allocate the entire amount appropriated in
2 subsection 1.

3 **Sec. 2.** The sums appropriated by section 1 of this act are
4 available for either fiscal year. Any balance of those sums must not
5 be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2007, and must be
6 reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 21, 2007.

7 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.
