

SENATE BILL NO. 69—COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE
OPERATIONS AND ELECTIONS

(ON BEHALF OF THE COMMITTEE TO EVALUATE HIGHER
EDUCATION PROGRAMS)

FEBRUARY 16, 2005

SUMMARY—Creates and sets forth powers and duties of P-16 Council. (BDR S-182)

AN ACT relating to higher education; providing a legislative declaration regarding the importance of higher education and the need to develop a public agenda concerning higher education and the transition from secondary education to higher education; creating a body to be known as the P-16 Council to assist in the coordination between elementary, secondary and higher education; providing for the organization, powers and duties of the Council; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** The Legislature hereby finds and declares that:
2 1. The Board of Regents was created by the Nevada
3 Constitution and empowered to control and manage the affairs of
4 the Nevada System of Higher Education.
5 2. Matters relating to higher education are vitally important to
6 the future of the State of Nevada, its economy and the general
7 welfare of its residents. In light of the growing enrollments in
8 Nevada's public system of higher education, it is important that the



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1 Nevada Legislature, the Board of Regents and the Executive Branch
2 of the State Government work together as partners in developing a
3 needed public agenda to advance higher education in this State.

4 3. Implementation of the recommendations made by the
5 Committee to Evaluate Higher Education Programs, created
6 pursuant to Assembly Bill No. 203 of the 72nd Session of the
7 Nevada Legislature, must be evaluated, and such evaluation should
8 include, without limitation, an examination of the costs and sources
9 of funding associated with the implementation of those
10 recommendations.

11 4. Many of the recommendations made by the Committee to
12 Evaluate Higher Education Programs, created pursuant to Assembly
13 Bill No. 203 of the 72nd Session of the Nevada Legislature, may
14 take a significant period of time to evaluate and implement.

15 5. The development of the agenda to advance higher education
16 should be carried out with a view toward seeking input from all
17 parties who have a stake in the advancement of higher education in
18 this State, including, without limitation, the students who participate
19 in Nevada's public system of higher education.

20 6. Coordination between elementary, secondary and higher
21 education must be strengthened to ensure that pupils in the 12th
22 grade are prepared adequately to make the transition from secondary
23 education to higher education or careers. To this end, a body should
24 be established to coordinate education from the level of preschool
25 through the completion of a bachelor's degree, to be known as the
26 P-16 Council.

27 **Sec. 2.** 1. The P-16 Council, consisting of 14 voting
28 members, is hereby created.

29 2. The Council consists of:

30 (a) The Chancellor of the Nevada System of Higher Education;
31 (b) The Superintendent of Public Instruction;
32 (c) Three members appointed by the Chancellor of the Nevada
33 System of Higher Education;

34 (d) Three members appointed by the Superintended of Public
35 Instruction;

36 (e) Two members appointed by the Majority Leader of the
37 Senate, as follows:

38 (1) One member of the general public; and
39 (2) One member of the Senate;

40 (f) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly, as
41 follows:

42 (1) One member of the general public; and
43 (2) One member of the Assembly;

44 (g) One member of the general public, appointed by the
45 Minority Leader of the Senate; and



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1 (h) One member of the general public, appointed by the
2 Minority Leader of the Assembly.

3 3. The Chancellor of the Nevada System of Higher Education
4 and the Superintendent of Public Instruction shall serve as the
5 Chairman and Vice Chairman of the Council, alternating positions
6 each fiscal year. The Chancellor and the Superintendent shall draw
7 lots to determine who will serve as Chairman during the first fiscal
8 year.

9 4. During fiscal years in which:

10 (a) The Chancellor of the Nevada System of Higher Education
11 serves as Chairman of the Council, the Nevada System of Higher
12 Education shall provide administrative support for the Council.

13 (b) The Superintendent of Public Instruction serves as Chairman
14 of the Council, the Department of Education shall provide
15 administrative support for the Council.

16 5. A vacancy on the Council must be filled in the same manner
17 as the initial appointment.

18 6. For each day or portion of a day during which they attend a
19 meeting of the Council or are otherwise engaged in the business of
20 the Council:

21 (a) The members of the Council who are Legislators are entitled
22 to receive the compensation provided for a majority of the members
23 of the Legislature during the first 60 days of the preceding regular
24 session plus the per diem allowance provided for state officers and
25 employees generally and the travel expenses provided pursuant to
26 NRS 218.2207.

27 (b) The members of the Council who are not Legislators serve
28 without salary, but are entitled to receive the per diem allowance
29 and travel expenses provided for state officers and employees
30 generally.

31 7. Any member who is absent from two consecutive meetings
32 of the Council:

33 (a) Forfeits his membership on the Council; and
34 (b) Must be replaced as provided in this section for the filling of
35 a vacancy.

36 **Sec. 3.** 1. The P-16 Council shall examine and evaluate the
37 need in this State for the expansion of existing programs of higher
38 education and the need for the creation of new programs of higher
39 education for the purpose of ensuring:

40 (a) Economic progress and development in the State of Nevada;
41 (b) The collaboration among the business community, members
42 of the academic community and political leaders to set forth a
43 process for incorporating technology-based economic development
44 in the overall economic growth and diversification strategies for the
45 Nevada System of Higher Education;



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1 (c) The successful transition of pupils enrolled in high schools in
2 this State into the Nevada System of Higher Education; and

3 (d) That the educational needs of the residents of this State are
4 being met.

5 2. In addition to the duties set forth in subsection 1, the Council
6 may consider:

7 (a) Developing a plan for accommodating growth within
8 Nevada's public system of higher education;

9 (b) Developing a plan to evaluate the programmatic needs of
10 Nevada's public system of higher education, including, without
11 limitation:

12 (1) The role of higher education in assisting the public
13 schools in this State in increasing the number of pupils who
14 graduate from high school;

15 (2) Measures to ensure that pupils who graduate from the
16 public schools in this State are prepared to enter a college or
17 university; and

18 (3) Identification of areas of expertise in research that may
19 be fostered;

20 (c) Developing a plan for examining the role of higher education
21 in promoting the literacy of adults; and

22 (d) The development of a strategic-level financing plan for the
23 public system of higher education in Nevada.

24 3. The Council shall recommend to the Board of Regents of the
25 Nevada System of Higher Education and the Legislature such action
26 as may be needed for the efficient and effective operation of higher
27 education in Nevada if this State is to progress economically and
28 socially.

29 4. On or before January 1 and July 1 of each year, the Council
30 shall prepare and submit a written report of its activities, findings
31 and any recommendations to the:

32 (a) Legislative Commission;

33 (b) Legislative Committee on Education;

34 (c) Board of Regents of the Nevada System of Higher
35 Education; and

36 (d) State Board of Education.

37 → In addition, the report prepared for January 1, 2007, must be
38 submitted to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for
39 transmission to the 74th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

40 **Sec. 4.** The P-16 Council may hold public hearings at such
41 times and places as it deems necessary to afford the general public
42 and representatives of governmental agencies and of organizations
43 interested in higher education or in the coordination between
44 elementary, secondary and higher education an opportunity to
45 present relevant information and recommendations.



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1 **Sec. 5.** The P-16 Council may apply for and accept any gifts,
2 grants, donations or contributions from any source to:

- 3 1. Carry out the provisions of this act; and
4 2. Contract with consultants to assist the Council in carrying
5 out its duties.

6 **Sec. 6.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005, and expires
7 by limitation on February 1, 2007.

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
