AND BENEFITS COMMITTEE)

**SUMMARY**—Removes requirement for approval of salaries of executive staff of Public Employees' Benefits Program by Interim Retirement and Benefits Committee. (BDR 23-86)

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AN ACT relating to the Public Employees' Benefits Program; eliminating the requirement that the annual salaries of the executive staff of the Public Employees' Benefits Program be approved by the Interim Retirement and Benefits Committee; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law requires that the Interim Retirement and Benefits Committee  
2 approve the annual salary of the Executive Officer, Quality Control Officer,  
3 Operations Officer, Accounting Officer, Information Technology Systems Officer  
4 and Executive Assistant employed by the Board of the Public Employees' Benefits  
5 Program. (NRS 287.0424, 287.0426) Because these are all positions in the  
6 unclassified service of the State, the annual salaries are also approved by the  
7 Legislature in the unclassified pay bill.

8 This bill would eliminate the requirement for approval of the annual salaries by  
9 the Interim Retirement and Benefits Committee.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 287.0424 is hereby amended to read as  
2 follows:

3       287.0424 1. The Board shall employ an Executive Officer  
4 who is in the unclassified service of the State and serves at the  
5 pleasure of the Board. The Board may delegate to the Executive  
6 Officer the exercise or discharge of any power, duty or function  
7 vested in or imposed upon the Board.

8       2. The Executive Officer must:

9       (a) Be a graduate of a 4-year college or university with a degree  
10 in business administration or public administration or an equivalent  
11 degree, as determined by the Board; and

12       (b) Possess at least 5 years' experience in a high-level  
13 administrative or executive capacity in the field of insurance,  
14 management of employees' benefits or risk management, including,  
15 without limitation, responsibility for a variety of administrative  
16 functions such as personnel, accounting, data processing or the  
17 structuring of insurance programs.

18       3. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 284.143, the  
19 Executive Officer shall not pursue any other business or occupation  
20 or perform the duties of any other office of profit during normal  
21 office hours unless on leave approved in advance. The Executive  
22 Officer shall not participate in any business enterprise or investment  
23 with any vendor or provider to the Program.

24       4. The Executive Officer is entitled to an annual salary fixed by  
25 the Board . ~~fwith the approval of the Interim Retirement and  
26 Benefits Committee of the Legislature created pursuant to NRS  
27 218.5373.]~~ The salary of the Executive Officer is exempt from the  
28 limitations set forth in NRS 281.123.

29       **Sec. 2.** NRS 287.0426 is hereby amended to read as follows:

30       287.0426 1. The Executive Officer may appoint a Quality  
31 Control Officer, Operations Officer, Accounting Officer,  
32 Information Technology Systems Officer and Executive Assistant ,  
33 who are in the unclassified service of the State and serve at the  
34 pleasure of the Executive Officer. The appointment and dismissal of  
35 the Quality Control Officer are subject to the approval of the Board.

36       2. The Quality Control Officer, Operations Officer, Accounting  
37 Officer and Information Technology Systems Officer must each be a  
38 graduate of a 4-year college or university with a degree that is  
39 appropriate to their respective responsibilities or possess equivalent  
40 experience as determined by the Board.

41       3. The Quality Control Officer, Operations Officer, Accounting  
42 Officer, Information Technology Systems Officer and Executive



1 Assistant are entitled to annual salaries fixed by the Board . [with  
2 ~~the approval of the Interim Retirement and Benefits Committee of~~  
3 ~~the Legislature created pursuant to NRS 218.5373.~~] The salaries of  
4 these employees are exempt from the limitations set forth in  
5 NRS 281.123.

6 4. The Executive Officer may employ such staff in the  
7 classified service of the State as are necessary for the performance  
8 of his duties, within limits of legislative appropriations or other  
9 available money.

10 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2005.

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
