## Referred to Committee on Commerce and Labor

SUMMARY—Requires training in geriatrics and gerontology for certain professions and occupations. (BDR 54-161)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: May have Fiscal Impact. Effect on the State: Yes.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets formitted material; is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to older persons; requiring certain providers of health care, judges, and officers and employees of district, justice and municipal court to receive education in geriatrics and gerontology; urging the Nevada Supreme Court to require attorneys to receive education in gerontology as a requirement for initial licensure and continuing education; urging the justices of the Supreme Court to expand their knowledge of gerontology; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Existing law establishes requirements for the initial licensure, certification or registration of certain providers of health care and for continuing education. (Chapters 630, 630A, 631, 632, 633, 634, 634A, 635, 636, 637, 637A, 637B, 639, 640, 640A, 641, 641B, 641C and 654 of NRS)

Sections 1, 3, 7, 9, 12, 14, 16, 18, 20, 26, 28, 34, 36, 38 and 40 of this bill require certain providers of health care to complete the equivalent of at least 6 semester hours of education in geriatrics and gerontology as a condition of obtaining initial licensure or certification.

Sections 2, 4-6, 8, 10, 11, 13, 15, 17, 19, 21-25, 27, 29-33, 35, 37, 39, 41 and 42 of this bill require those providers of health care, certain other health care workers and persons who practice other health care occupations to receive education in geriatrics and gerontology as part of their continuing education.





Existing law regulates certain facilities that provide health care or personal care. (Chapter 449 of NRS)

**Section 56** of this bill requires the State Board of Health to establish requirements for education or training in geriatrics and gerontology for persons who work in such facilities and prohibits the operator of such a facility from employing a person unless he satisfies those requirements.

Sections 43-53 of this bill require employees and officers of the Nevada Supreme Court and judges, officers and employees of district, justice and municipal courts to receive education or training in gerontology. Section 55 of this bill requires peace officers to receive training in gerontology. Section 57 of this bill urges the Supreme Court to require applicants for a license to practice law to receive education or training in gerontology as a condition of obtaining their initial licenses and to include that education or training in their continuing education. Section 57 also urges the justices of the Supreme Court to expand their knowledge of gerontology.

## THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 630 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

In addition to any other requirements for licensure, an applicant for a license to practice medicine must submit proof to the Board that he has successfully completed the equivalent of at least 6 semester hours of education in geriatrics and gerontology.

- **Sec. 2.** NRS 630.253 is hereby amended to read as follows:
- 630.253 1. The Board shall, as a prerequisite for the:
- (a) Renewal of a license as a physician assistant; or
- 10 (b) Biennial registration of the holder of a license to practice 11 medicine,

- (4) Syndromic surveillance and reporting procedures for acts of terrorism that involve biological agents; and
- (5) An overview of the information available on, and the use of, the Health Alert Network.
- → The Board may thereafter determine whether to include in a program of continuing education additional courses of instruction relating to the medical consequences of an act of terrorism that involves the use of a weapon of mass destruction.

The Board shall [encourage] require each holder of a license [who treats or cares for persons who are more than 60 years of age] to receive [, as a portion of their continuing education,] education in geriatrics and gerontology [, including such topics as:] as part of his continuing education, including, without limitation:
- (a) The skills and knowledge that the licensee needs to address aging issues;
- (b) Approaches to providing health care to older persons, including both didactic and clinical approaches;
- (c) The biological, behavioral, social and emotional aspects of the aging process; and
- (d) The importance of maintenance of function and independence for older persons.
  - 4. As used in this section:
- (a) "Act of terrorism" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 202.4415.
- (b) "Biological agent" has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 202.442.

In addition to any other requirements for licensure, an applicant for a license to practice homeopathic medicine must submit proof to the Board that he has successfully completed the equivalent of at least 6 semester hours of education in geriatrics and gerontology.

Sec. 4. NRS 630A.295 is hereby amended to read as follows:

630A.295 The Board shall adopt regulations:





- 1. Specifying the training, education and experience necessary for certification as an advanced practitioner of homeopathy.
- 2. Delineating the authorized scope of practice of an advanced practitioner of homeopathy.
- 3. Establishing the procedure for application for certification as an advanced practitioner of homeopathy.

- (b) Pay the annual fee for renewal set by the Board;
- (c) Submit evidence to the Board of his completion of the requirements for continuing education; and
  - (d) Submit all information required to complete the renewal.
- 2. The Board shall, as a prerequisite for the renewal or restoration of a license other than a temporary, special or limited license, require each holder of a license to comply with the requirements for continuing education adopted by the Board.

- 632.342 1. The certificate of a nursing assistant must be renewed biennially on the date of the certificate holder's birthday.
  - 2. The Board shall renew a certificate if the applicant:
- (a) Submits a completed written application and the fee required by this chapter;
- (b) Submits documentation of completion of continuing training, as required by the Board, in the previous 24 months;





- (c) Has not committed any acts which are grounds for disciplinary action, unless the Board determines that sufficient restitution has been made or the act was not substantially related to nursing;

**Sec. 12.** Chapter 633 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

In addition to any other requirements for licensure, an applicant for a license to practice osteopathic medicine must submit proof to the Board that he has successfully completed the equivalent of at least 6 semester hours of education in geriatrics and gerontology.

**Sec. 13.** NRS 633.471 is hereby amended to read as follows:

633.471 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection [4] 5 and in NRS 633.491, every holder of a license issued under this chapter, except a temporary or a special license, may renew his license on or before January 1 of each calendar year after its issuance by:

In addition to any other requirements for licensure, an applicant for a license to practice chiropractic must submit proof to the Board that he has successfully completed the equivalent of at least 6 semester hours of education in geriatrics and gerontology.

**Sec. 15.** NRS 634.130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- 634.130 1. Licenses and certificates must be renewed annually. Each person who is licensed pursuant to the provisions of this chapter must, upon the payment of the required renewal fee and the submission of all information required to complete the renewal, be granted a renewal certificate which authorizes him to continue to practice for 1 year.

- 2. The State Demographer projects that by 2017 nearly 20 percent of all persons living in the State will be at least 60 years of age.
- 3. Older persons confront the legal system with unique problems that are associated with the process of aging.
- 4. Mandatory education or training of attorneys and counselors at law in gerontology is desirable, and the Nevada Supreme Court is urged to require:
- (a) Each applicant for a license as an attorney and counselor at law, in addition to any other requirements for licensure, to complete a course in gerontology that is approved by the Court Administrator pursuant to section 43 of this act; and
- (b) Each holder of a license as an attorney and counselor at law to receive education in gerontology as part of his continuing education.
- 5. Knowledge of gerontology is desirable for justices of the Supreme Court, and each justice is urged to expand his knowledge of gerontology.

**Sec. 58.** This act becomes effective:

- 1. Upon passage and approval for the purpose of adopting regulations and performing any other preparatory administrative tasks that are necessary to carry out the provisions of this act; and
  - 2. On October 1, 2007, for all other purposes.
