
ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 179—COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARYFEBRUARY 26, 2007

SUMMARY—Revises the provisions governing the terms of office of members of the State Gaming Control Board. (BDR 41-104)

AN ACT relating to gaming; revising the provisions governing the terms of office of members of the State Gaming Control Board; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 **Section 1** of this bill changes the date on which the terms of office of members
2 of the State Gaming Control Board begin from January 1 to the last Monday in
3 January. (NRS 463.050) Because the Nevada Constitution prohibits the Legislature
4 from creating an office with a term greater than 4 years, **section 2** of this bill
5 provides for the appointment of members to serve terms lasting either 25 or 30
6 days, which is the length of the transitional period between the expiration of the
7 terms of office of the current members of the Board and the new date on which
8 terms of office will begin. (Nev. Const. Art. 15, § 11)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 463.050 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 463.050 1. **[After the initial terms, the] The** term of office of
3 each member of the Board is 4 years **[, commencing on the last**
4 **Monday in January.**



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1 2. The Governor shall appoint the members of the Board and
2 designate one member to serve as Chairman and Executive Director,
3 who shall coordinate the activities of the Board.

4 3. The Governor may remove any member for misfeasance,
5 malfeasance or nonfeasance in office. Removal may be made after:

6 (a) The member has been served with a copy of the charges
7 against him; and

8 (b) A public hearing before the Governor is held upon the
9 charges, if requested by the member charged.

10 → The request for a public hearing must be made within 10 days
11 after service upon such member of the charges. If a hearing is not
12 requested, a member is removed effective 10 days after service of
13 charges upon him. A record of the proceedings at the public hearing
14 must be filed with the Secretary of State.

15 **Sec. 2.** Notwithstanding the provisions of NRS 463.050, as
16 amended by section 1 of this act, upon the expiration of the term of
17 office of a member of the State Gaming Control Board whose term
18 expires on:

19 1. December 31, 2008, the Governor shall appoint a member to
20 serve a term commencing on January 1, 2009, and expiring on
21 January 25, 2009.

22 2. December 31, 2010, the Governor shall appoint a member to
23 serve a term commencing on January 1, 2011, and expiring on
24 January 30, 2011.

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
