**SUMMARY**—Revises various provisions relating to economic and energy development. (BDR S-784)

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AN ACT relating to economic and energy development; revising various provisions governing the Solar Energy Systems Demonstration Program Act; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under the Solar Energy Systems Demonstration Program Act, a certain number of schools which install solar energy systems are entitled to participate in the Demonstration Program and receive portfolio energy credits that may be sold to utilities seeking to comply with the portfolio standards. (Chapter 331, Statutes of Nevada 2003, pp. 1868-71) **Section 11** of this bill increases the number of schools that may participate in the Demonstration Program and increases the kilowatts of capacity for solar energy systems in schools from 570 kilowatts to 2 megawatts for the years 2007, 2008 and 2009.

17                  (3) An additional 760 kilowatts of capacity for private  
18                  residences and small businesses.

19                  3. The Public Utilities Commission of Nevada shall  
20                  notify each nominee of its selections no later than 10 days  
21                  after the decision is made.

22                  4. *To promote the installation of solar energy systems  
23                  at as many schools as possible, the Public Utilities  
24                  Commission of Nevada may not approve for use in the  
25                  Demonstration Program a solar energy system having a  
26                  generating capacity of more than 50 kilowatts if the solar  
27                  energy system is or will be installed at a school on or after  
28                  July 1, 2007, unless the Commission determines that  
29                  approval of a solar energy system with a greater generating  
30                  capacity is more practicable for a particular school.*
