ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 206—COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION)

SUMMARY—Makes an appropriation to the Department of Administration to fund certain information technology projects. (BDR S-1207)

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Department of Administration to fund certain information technology projects; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the State
- 2 General Fund to the Department of Administration the sum of
- 3 \$4,728,740 to pay the costs of information technology projects,
- 4 including a state lands management system, enhancements to the
- 5 Nevada Employee Action and Timekeeping System and the Nevada
- 6 Executive Budget System, an electronic birth registration system, a
- 7 study on the replacement of the EMS radio system, a medical and
- 8 health records storage data warehouse and disaster recovery storage.
- 9 **Sec. 2.** Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
- 10 section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after
- 11 June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or
- 12 any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or
- 13 otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the



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1 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose
2 after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money
3 was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
4 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
5 Fund on or before September 18, 2009.

6 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
