

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 220—COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS  
(ON BEHALF OF THE SECRETARY OF STATE)

SUMMARY—Revises certain duties of the Secretary of State.  
(BDR 18-545)

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AN ACT relating to the Secretary of State; revising certain duties of the Secretary of State; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1       **Section 1** of this bill changes the date by which the Secretary of State is  
2 required to prepare and submit to the Governor a biennial report pertaining to the  
3 expenditures, receipts and general business of the Office of the Secretary of State  
4 from August 1 to September 15 of an even-numbered year. (NRS 225.120)  
5       Under existing law, the Secretary of State, if practicable, is required to refund  
6 payments made to the Secretary of State that exceed the amount owed by \$15 or  
7 more. The Secretary of State is required to deposit any such excess payments that  
8 have not been refunded with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General  
9 Fund. (NRS 225.155) **Section 2** of this bill requires the Secretary of State to retain  
10 such an excess payment for 12 months after the date of receipt of the payment  
11 while he is attempting to refund the payment before depositing the excess payment  
12 with the State Treasurer. This period for retention of excess payments is consistent  
13 with the 1-year period in existing law within which a person may make a claim for  
14 a refund of money deposited in the State Treasury or paid to a state agency or  
15 officer unless the payment was made under protest or an applicable statute  
16 prescribes a different period. (NRS 353.115) As a result of the imposition of the 12-  
17 month retention period by the Secretary of State of excess payments, **section 2** also  
18 removes the right of a person who does not receive a refund of an excess payment  
20 to make a claim for a refund directly to the State Board of Examiners within 30  
days after the date of the payment.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** NRS 225.120 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2      225.120 On or before ~~August 1, 1954, and in every second~~  
3      ~~year thereafter,~~ **September 15 of each even-numbered year**, the  
4      Secretary of State shall prepare and render a biennial report to the  
5      Governor. ~~[There shall be included in the report:] The report must~~  
6      **include:**

- 7      1. An exhibit showing in detail all expenditures made by ~~him~~  
8      **the Secretary of State** or under ~~his direction~~  
9      ~~2. All moneys] the direction of the Secretary of State during~~  
10     **the biennium ending June 30 of that even-numbered year;**  
11     2. **An accounting of all money** received by ~~him~~ **the**  
12     **Secretary of State** from whatever source, and the disposition made  
13     of the ~~[same.]~~ **money during that biennium; and**  
14     3. All matters relating to the general business of the Office of  
15     **the Secretary of State** during ~~[the period embraced in the report.]~~  
16     **that biennium.**

17      **Sec. 2.** NRS 225.155 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
18      225.155 1. If any money is paid to the Secretary of State  
19      which exceeds by less than \$15 the amount required by law to be  
20      paid, the Secretary of State shall deposit the excess payment with  
21      the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund.  
22      2. If a payment exceeds the amount required by law to be paid  
23      by \$15 or more, the Secretary of State shall, if practicable, refund  
24      the excess. If the Secretary of State cannot make the refund ~~[, he]~~  
25      **within 12 months after the date on which the excess payment was**  
26      **received, the Secretary of State** shall deposit the excess payment  
27      with the State Treasurer for credit to the State General Fund.  
28      ~~3. Any person who claims a refund of an excess payment~~  
29      ~~which is not refunded pursuant to subsection 2 must, within 30 days~~  
30      ~~after the date of the payment, make a claim for a refund to the State~~  
31      ~~Board of Examiners.]~~
