

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 228—COMMITTEE ON
NATURAL RESOURCES, AGRICULTURE, AND MINING

(ON BEHALF OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE)

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing licenses to engage in pest control. (BDR 49-626)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: Increases or Newly Provides for Term of Imprisonment in County or City Jail or Detention Facility.
Effect on the State: No.

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EXPLANATION – Matter in *bolded italics* is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to pest control; authorizing the Director of the State Department of Agriculture to refuse to issue a license to engage in pest control to a person who is convicted of certain acts; prohibiting the Director from issuing such a license until the expiration of the period of the person's parole, probation or sentence; prohibiting a person, in connection with a real estate transaction, from engaging in certain pest control activities concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms without a license issued by the Director; providing a penalty; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law prohibits a person from engaging in pest control activities without
2 a license issued by the Director of the State Department of Agriculture. (NRS
3 555.280) “Pest control” means the business of using pesticides and mechanical
4 devices to control infestations of pests and the inspection for hire of houses and
5 other structures. The term also includes the submission of reports, estimates or bids
6 for the inspection or control of wood-destroying pests. (NRS 555.2667) Existing
7 law further prohibits a person from engaging in various pest control activities



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8 concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms without a license issued by the
9 Director, including, without limitation, conducting an inspection to identify or
10 attempt to identify infestations or infections of houses by those pests and preparing
11 inspection reports concerning the infestations or infections. (NRS 555.285)

12 **Section 1** of this bill authorizes the Director to refuse to issue a license to
13 engage in pest control to a person who is convicted of, or enters a plea of guilty or
14 nolo contendere to, certain specified crimes, including, without limitation, any
15 crime involving moral turpitude. **Section 1** also prohibits the Director from issuing
16 a license to engage in pest control to such a person until the expiration of the
17 person's parole, probation or sentence. Additionally, **section 1** sets forth grounds
18 for the Director to refuse to issue such a license.

19 **Section 3** of this bill prohibits a person from engaging in certain pest control
20 activities concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms without a license issued
21 by the Director if the pest control activities are conducted in connection with a real
22 estate transaction. Those pest control activities include: (1) making an inspection to
23 identify or attempt to identify infestations or infections of wood-destroying pests or
24 organisms; (2) making or altering inspection reports concerning those infestations
25 or infections; (3) making written or oral estimates or bids concerning the
26 infestations or infections; and (4) submitting bids to do any work involving
27 the application of pesticides to eliminate, exterminate, control or prevent the
28 infestations or infections.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 555 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 ***1. The Director:***

4 ***(a) May refuse to issue a license to engage in pest control to
any person who has been convicted of, or entered a plea of guilty
or nolo contendere to, forgery, embezzlement, obtaining money
under false pretenses, larceny, extortion, conspiracy to defraud,
engaging in pest control without a license, possessing for the
purpose of sale any controlled substance or any crime involving
moral turpitude, in any court of competent jurisdiction in the
United States or any other country.***

12 ***(b) Shall not issue a license to engage in pest control to a
person specified in paragraph (a) until the expiration of the period
of the person's parole, probation or sentence.***

15 ***2. A suspension or revocation of a license to engage in pest
control pursuant to NRS 555.350 or any previous revocation or
current suspension of such a license in this or any other state,
district or territory of the United States or any foreign country
within 10 years immediately preceding the date of submission of
an application for a license is grounds for refusal to issue the
license.***



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1 **Sec. 2.** NRS 555.2605 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 555.2605 As used in NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive, **and**
3 **section 1 of this act**, unless the context otherwise requires, the
4 words and terms defined in NRS 555.261 to 555.2695, inclusive,
5 have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.

6 **Sec. 3.** NRS 555.285 is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 555.285 A person shall not, for hire **or in connection with any**
8 **real estate transaction**, engage in, offer to engage in, advertise or
9 solicit to perform any of the following pest control activities
10 concerning wood-destroying pests or organisms without a license
11 issued by the Director:

12 1. Making an inspection to identify or to attempt to identify
13 infestations or infections of households or other structures by those
14 pests or organisms.

15 2. Making **or altering** inspection reports concerning the
16 infestations or infections.

17 3. Making estimates or bids, whether written or oral,
18 concerning the infestations or infections.

19 4. Submitting bids to perform any work involving the
20 application of pesticides for the elimination, extermination, control
21 or prevention of infestations or infections of those pests.

22 **Sec. 4.** NRS 555.400 is hereby amended to read as follows:

23 555.400 1. The Director may adopt regulations to carry out
24 the provisions of NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive, **[but the]** **and**
25 **section 1 of this act.** **The** regulations must not be inconsistent with
26 **any** regulations issued by this State or by the Federal Government
27 relating to safety in air navigation or **the** operation of aircraft.

28 2. Before **[issuing]** **adopting** regulations directly relating to any
29 matter within the jurisdiction of any other officer of this State, the
30 Director shall consult with that officer **[with reference thereto.]**
concerning those regulations.

31 **Sec. 5.** NRS 555.460 is hereby amended to read as follows:

32 555.460 Any person violating the provisions of NRS 555.2605
33 to 555.420, inclusive, **and section 1 of this act**, or the regulations
34 adopted pursuant thereto, is guilty of a misdemeanor and, in
35 addition to any criminal penalty, shall pay to the Department an
36 administrative fine of not more than \$5,000 per violation. If an
37 administrative fine is imposed pursuant to this section, the costs of
38 the proceeding, including investigative costs and attorney's fees,
39 may be recovered by the Department.

40 **Sec. 6.** NRS 555.470 is hereby amended to read as follows:

41 555.470 1. The Director shall adopt regulations specifying a
42 schedule of fines which may be imposed, upon notice and a hearing,
43 for each violation of the provisions of NRS 555.2605 to 555.460,
44 inclusive **[, and section 1 of this act.** The maximum fine that may



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1 be imposed by the Director for each violation must not exceed
2 \$5,000 per day. All fines collected by the Director pursuant to this
3 subsection must be remitted to the county treasurer of the county in
4 which the violation occurred for credit to the county school district
5 fund.

6 2. The Director may:

7 (a) In addition to imposing a fine pursuant to subsection 1, issue
8 an order requiring a violator to take appropriate action to correct the
9 violation; or

10 (b) Request the district attorney of the appropriate county to
11 investigate or file a criminal complaint against any person that the
12 State Board of Agriculture suspects may have violated any provision
13 of NRS 555.2605 to 555.460, inclusive **H, and section 1 of this
14 act.**

15 **Sec. 7.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
