

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 29—COMMITTEE ON TRANSPORTATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY)

SUMMARY—Adds certain vehicles of certain governmental agencies to the authorized emergency vehicles list. (BDR 43-557)

AN ACT relating to public safety; revising the list of authorized emergency vehicles to include certain vehicles of certain governmental agencies; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel’s Digest:**

1 This bill adds certain vehicles owned and operated by certain governmental  
2 agencies to the list of authorized emergency vehicles. (NRS 484.787)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 484.787 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2 484.787 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 484.789,  
3 authorized emergency vehicles are vehicles publicly owned and  
4 operated in the performance of the duty of:  
5 (a) A police or fire department.  
6 (b) A sheriff’s office.  
7 (c) The Nevada Highway Patrol.  
8 (d) *The Division of Parole and Probation of the Department of*  
9 *Public Safety.*  
10 (e) *The Investigation Division of the Department of Public*  
11 *Safety.*



1 (f) *The Division of Compliance Enforcement of the*  
2 *Department of Motor Vehicles.*

3 (g) *The Department of Wildlife when the vehicles are operated*  
4 *by a game warden or any peace officer exercising the powers of*  
5 *enforcement conferred by NRS 289.280, 501.349 or 501.375.*

6 (h) *The State Department of Agriculture when the vehicles are*  
7 *operated by a field agent or an inspector exercising the powers of*  
8 *enforcement conferred by NRS 289.290.*

9 (i) The Division of Forestry of the State Department of  
10 Conservation and Natural Resources in responding to a fire.

11 ~~(e)~~ (j) A public ambulance agency.

12 ~~(f)~~ (k) A public lifeguard or lifesaving agency.

13 2. A vehicle publicly maintained in whole or in part by the  
14 State, or by a city or county, and privately owned and operated by a  
15 regularly salaried member of a police department, sheriff's office ,  
16 ~~(e)~~ traffic law enforcement department ~~(f)~~ *or any agency listed in*  
17 *subsection 1* is an authorized emergency vehicle if:

18 (a) The vehicle has a permit, pursuant to NRS 484.789, from the  
19 Department;

20 (b) The person operates the vehicle in responding to emergency  
21 calls or fire alarms, or at the request of the Nevada Highway Patrol  
22 or *any agency listed in subsection 1* in the pursuit of actual or  
23 suspected violators of the law; and

24 (c) The State, county or city does not furnish a publicly owned  
25 vehicle for the purposes stated in paragraph (b).

26 3. Every authorized emergency vehicle must be equipped with  
27 at least one flashing red warning lamp visible from the front and a  
28 siren for use as provided in this chapter, which lamp and siren must  
29 be in compliance with standards approved by the Department. In  
30 addition, an authorized emergency vehicle may display revolving,  
31 flashing or steady red or blue warning lights to the front, sides or  
32 rear of the vehicle.

33 4. An authorized emergency vehicle may be equipped with a  
34 system or device that causes the upper-beam head lamps of the  
35 vehicle to continue to flash alternately while the system or device is  
36 activated. The driver of a vehicle that is so equipped may use the  
37 system or device when responding to an emergency call or fire  
38 alarm, while escorting a funeral procession, or when in pursuit of an  
39 actual or suspected violator of the law. As used in this subsection,  
40 "upper-beam head lamp" means a head lamp or that part of a head  
41 lamp which projects a distribution of light or composite beam  
42 meeting the requirements of subsection 1 of NRS 484.587.

43 5. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, a person shall  
44 not operate a motor vehicle with any system or device that causes  
45 the head lamps of the vehicle to continue to flash alternately or



1 simultaneously while the system or device is activated. This  
2 subsection does not prohibit the operation of a motorcycle equipped  
3 with any system or device that modulates the intensity of light  
4 produced by the head lamp of the motorcycle, if the system or  
5 device is used only during daylight hours and conforms to the  
6 requirements of 49 C.F.R. § 571.108.

7 6. A person shall not operate a vehicle with any lamp or device  
8 displaying a red light visible from directly in front of the center of  
9 the vehicle except an authorized emergency vehicle, a school bus or  
10 an official vehicle of a regulatory agency.

11 7. A person shall not operate a vehicle with any lamp or device  
12 displaying a blue light, except a motorcycle pursuant to NRS  
13 486.261 or an authorized emergency vehicle.

14 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
