

ASSEMBLY BILL No. 333—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION  
(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION)

MARCH 15, 2007

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Referred to Committee on Education

**SUMMARY**—Requires the Legislative Committee on Education to study certain issues during the 2007-2009 interim. (BDR S-417)

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AN ACT relating to education; requiring the Legislative Committee on Education to study certain issues during the 2007-2009 interim; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1       The Legislative Committee on Education is a permanent statutory committee of  
2 Legislators that meets during the interim between legislative sessions to study  
3 various issues relating to education. (NRS 218.5351-218.5355) This bill requires  
4 the Committee, during the 2007-2009 interim, to study the governance of public  
5 schools, including the feasibility and desirability of implementing a program of  
6 local autonomy for public schools. This bill also requires the Chairman of the  
7 Committee to appoint a subcommittee to study charter schools during the  
8 2007-2009 interim.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** 1. The Legislative Committee on Education shall,  
2 during the 2007-2009 interim, conduct a study of the governance of  
3 the public schools in this State, including, without limitation, the  
4 feasibility and desirability of implementing a program of local  
5 autonomy for public schools. The study must include, without  
6 limitation, a review of:



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1       (a) Accountability measures that should be carried out by public  
2 schools that participate in a program of local autonomy;  
3       (b) The provision of professional development for educational  
4 personnel in public schools that participate in a program of local  
5 autonomy in a manner that ensures effective school leaders;  
6       (c) The effect of a program of local autonomy on existing  
7 collective bargaining agreements;  
8       (d) The feasibility of performance-based contracts for  
9 employees of public schools that participate in a program of local  
10 autonomy;  
11      (e) The duties, responsibilities and powers of principals of  
12 public schools that participate in a program of local autonomy;  
13      (f) The role of teachers, parents and the community in decision  
14 making in public schools that participate in a program of local  
15 autonomy;  
16      (g) The proposed effect of a program of local autonomy on the  
17 success and achievement of pupils;  
18      (h) Guidelines for budgets for individual schools that participate  
19 in a program of local autonomy;  
20      (i) The progress of the pilot project carried out in the Clark  
21 County School District referred to as "empowerment schools,"  
22 including, without limitation, the identification of successful  
23 measures used in that pilot project which may be carried out as part  
24 of a statewide program of local autonomy for public schools; and  
25      (j) The feasibility of authorizing individual teachers to negotiate  
26 year-round contracts with the school districts that employ the  
27 teachers.

28     2. The Legislative Committee on Education shall submit a  
29 report of the results of the study conducted pursuant to subsection 1  
30 and any recommendations for legislation to the Director of the  
31 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the 75th Session of  
32 the Nevada Legislature.

33     **Sec. 2.** 1. The Chairman of the Legislative Committee on  
34 Education shall appoint a subcommittee of the members of the  
35 Committee to study charter schools operating in this State.

36     2. The subcommittee appointed pursuant to subsection 1 shall:  
37       (a) Review the accountability of charter schools and determine  
38 whether measures should be carried out to improve accountability;  
39       (b) Review the money available for the operation of charter  
40 schools;  
41       (c) Review the ability of charter schools to acquire suitable  
42 facilities and determine measures that may increase the availability  
43 of suitable facilities for charter schools;  
44       (d) Review the governance structure of charter schools;



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1       (e) Identify any restrictions on the operation of charter schools  
2 that should be revised or eliminated; and

3       (f) Identify practices carried out in other states to ensure the  
4 success of charter schools and determine the feasibility of carrying  
5 out those practices in this State.

6       3. On or before August 1, 2008, the subcommittee appointed  
7 pursuant to subsection 1 shall submit to the Legislative Committee  
8 on Education:

9           (a) A report of its findings; and

10          (b) Requests for the drafting of not more than five legislative  
11 measures which relate to matters within the scope of the study  
12 conducted by the subcommittee. Such requests are in addition to the  
13 number of requests authorized for the Legislative Committee on  
14 Education in paragraph (a) of subsection 3 of NRS 218.2429.

15       4. The Legislative Committee on Education shall:

16           (a) Approve or deny the requests for the drafting of legislative  
17 measures of the subcommittee; and

18           (b) On or before February 1, 2009, submit the report of the  
19 subcommittee to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for  
20 transmission to the 75th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

21       **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.

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
