
ASSEMBLY BILL No. 333—COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION)

MARCH 15, 2007

SUMMARY—Requires the Legislative Committee on Education to study certain issues during the 2007-2009 interim. (BDR S-417)

AN ACT relating to education; requiring the Legislative Committee on Education to study certain issues during the 2007-2009 interim; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 The Legislative Committee on Education is a permanent statutory committee of
2 Legislators that meets during the interim between legislative sessions to study
3 various issues relating to education. (NRS 218.5351-218.5355) This bill requires
4 the Committee, during the 2007-2009 interim, to study the governance of public
5 schools, including the governance structure for kindergarten through grade 12 and
6 the feasibility and desirability of implementing a program of local autonomy for
7 public schools. This bill also requires the Chairman of the Committee to appoint a
8 subcommittee to study charter schools during the 2007-2009 interim.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** 1. The Legislative Committee on Education shall,
2 during the 2007-2009 interim, conduct a study of the governance of
3 the public schools in this State, including, without limitation:
4 (a) The feasibility and desirability of implementing a program of
5 local autonomy for public schools; and



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1 (b) A review of the system of public education for kindergarten
2 through grade 12 to ensure that the structure of governance is
3 organized in a manner which provides for efficient operation and
4 which meets the educational needs of the residents of this State.

5 2. The study must include, without limitation, a review of:

6 (a) Accountability measures that should be carried out by public
7 schools that participate in a program of local autonomy;

8 (b) The provision of professional development for educational
9 personnel in public schools that participate in a program of local
10 autonomy in a manner that ensures effective school leaders;

11 (c) The effect of a program of local autonomy on existing
12 collective bargaining agreements;

13 (d) The feasibility of performance-based contracts for
14 employees of public schools that participate in a program of local
15 autonomy;

16 (e) The duties, responsibilities and powers of principals of
17 public schools that participate in a program of local autonomy;

18 (f) The role of teachers, parents and the community in decision
19 making in public schools that participate in a program of local
20 autonomy;

21 (g) The proposed effect of a program of local autonomy on the
22 success and achievement of pupils;

23 (h) Guidelines for budgets for individual schools that participate
24 in a program of local autonomy;

25 (i) The progress of the pilot project carried out in the Clark
26 County School District referred to as "empowerment schools,"
27 including, without limitation, the identification of successful
28 measures used in that pilot project which may be carried out as part
29 of a statewide program of local autonomy for public schools; and

30 (j) The feasibility of authorizing individual teachers to negotiate
31 year-round contracts with the school districts that employ the
32 teachers.

33 → The Committee's review of the items set forth in this subsection
34 must be made in recognition of the provisions of chapter 288 of
35 NRS.

36 3. The Legislative Committee on Education shall submit a
37 report of the results of the study conducted pursuant to this section
38 and any recommendations for legislation to the Director of the
39 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the 75th Session of
40 the Nevada Legislature.

41 **Sec. 2.** 1. The Chairman of the Legislative Committee on
42 Education shall appoint a subcommittee of the members of the
43 Committee to study charter schools operating in this State.

44 2. The subcommittee appointed pursuant to subsection 1 shall:



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1 (a) Review the accountability of charter schools and determine
2 whether measures should be carried out to improve accountability;

3 (b) Review the money available for the operation of charter
4 schools;

5 (c) Review the ability of charter schools to acquire suitable
6 facilities and determine measures that may increase the availability
7 of suitable facilities for charter schools;

8 (d) Review the governance structure of charter schools;

9 (e) Identify any restrictions on the operation of charter schools
10 that should be revised or eliminated; and

11 (f) Identify practices carried out in other states to ensure the
12 success of charter schools and determine the feasibility of carrying
13 out those practices in this State.

14 3. On or before August 1, 2008, the subcommittee appointed
15 pursuant to subsection 1 shall submit to the Legislative Committee
16 on Education:

17 (a) A report of its findings; and

18 (b) Requests for the drafting of not more than five legislative
19 measures which relate to matters within the scope of the study
20 conducted by the subcommittee. Such requests are in addition to the
21 number of requests authorized for the Legislative Committee on
22 Education in paragraph (a) of subsection 3 of NRS 218.2429.

23 4. The Legislative Committee on Education shall:

24 (a) Approve or deny the requests for the drafting of legislative
25 measures of the subcommittee; and

26 (b) On or before February 1, 2009, submit the report of the
27 subcommittee to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for
28 transmission to the 75th Session of the Nevada Legislature.

29 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.

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
