SUMMARY—Requires employment of outreach coordinators to provide education and information relating to resources available for adults with disabilities. (BDR 38-847)

AN ACT relating to persons with disabilities; requiring the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services to employ two outreach coordinators to provide education and information relating to the availability of services, programs, financial assistance and other resources for adults with disabilities; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill requires the Director of the Department of Health and Human Services
2 to employ a Northern Nevada Outreach Coordinator and a Southern Nevada
3 Outreach Coordinator to provide education and information relating to services,
4 programs, financial assistance and other resources that are available to adults with
5 disabilities and their families from the Department, the Federal Government, local
6 governments and private organizations.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 426 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *The Director shall employ a Northern Nevada Outreach
4 Coordinator and a Southern Nevada Outreach Coordinator to
5 provide education and information relating to the services,
6 programs, financial assistance and other resources that are
7 available to adults with disabilities and their families. The
8 resources for which education and information must be provided
9 include, without limitation, the resources available from the
10 Department, the Federal Government, local governments and
11 private organizations. The two outreach coordinators shall work
12 together to develop mutually beneficial information.*

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
