

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 387—ASSEMBLYMAN MABEY (BY REQUEST)

MARCH 16, 2007

Referred to Committee on Education

SUMMARY—Requires physical examinations of children before initially enrolling in a public school in this State. (BDR 34-1032)

AN ACT relating to education; requiring the parent or legal guardian of a child to submit a certificate stating that the child underwent a physical examination before the child may initially enroll in a public school in this State; providing exceptions; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law requires that each child enrolled in a specified grade level in a
2 public school undergo an examination by a school nurse or a designee to determine
3 whether the child has scoliosis, visual or auditory problems or a gross physical
4 defect. (NRS 392.420) Existing law also requires proof of immunization of a child
5 for certain diseases before the child may enroll in a public school. (NRS 392.435)
6 A child is exempt from the requirement of immunizations for religious belief or for
7 a medical condition. (NRS 392.437, 392.439)

8 This bill requires the parent or legal guardian of a child to submit a certificate
9 stating that the child underwent a physical examination within the immediately
10 preceding 12 months as a condition to the initial enrollment of the child in a public
11 school. This bill also provides an exception to the requirement of a physical
12 examination if: (1) the parent or legal guardian submits a written statement that his
13 religious belief prohibits the physical examination; (2) the child underwent a
14 substantially similar examination in another state; or (3) the parent or legal
15 guardian submits evidence of good cause for a waiver from the requirement of a
16 physical examination.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 392 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3 *1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a child must
4 not be enrolled in a public school within this State unless the
5 parent or legal guardian of the child submits to the principal of
6 the public school or the administrative head of the charter school
7 in which the child has been accepted for enrollment a certificate
8 stating that the child underwent a physical examination within the
9 immediately preceding 12 months before the date of the child's
10 initial enrollment in a public school in this State. The State Board
11 of Health shall prescribe the type of physical examination that
12 satisfies the requirements of this section.*

13 *2. A certificate submitted pursuant to subsection 1 must be
14 signed by a physician, osteopathic physician's assistant or a
15 physician assistant.*

16 *3. A public school shall not refuse to enroll a child as a pupil
17 because the child has not undergone a physical examination if the
18 parent or legal guardian of the child submits to the principal of
19 the public school or the administrative head of the charter school
20 in which the child has been accepted for enrollment:*

21 *(a) A written statement indicating that the religious belief of
22 the parent or legal guardian prohibits the physical examination of
23 the child as required by the State Board of Health; or*

24 *(b) Evidence that the child underwent a substantially similar
25 physical examination for enrollment in school in another state.*

26 *4. The principal of a public school or the administrative head
27 of a charter school may enroll a child in the school without the
28 certificate required by this section if the parent or legal guardian
29 of the child submits evidence of good cause for a waiver from the
30 requirements of the physical examination, including, without
31 limitation, financial hardship.*

32 *5. On or before December 31 of each year, each school
33 district and the governing body of each charter school shall report
34 to the Health Division of the Department of Health and Human
35 Services, on a form furnished by the Division, the number of
36 pupils who have undergone physical examinations and complied
37 with the provisions of this section.*

38 *6. The certificate of physical examination submitted pursuant
39 to subsection 1 must be maintained in the pupil's academic or
40 cumulative record and transferred as a part of that record.*
