**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing the suspension and termination of certain educational personnel for failure to maintain a valid license. (BDR 34-1192)

EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to education; requiring a school district to maintain an employee in his position of employment rather than suspend his employment for failure to maintain a valid license if the lapse of the employee's license occurs during a time that school is in session; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1      **Section 2** of this bill requires the Superintendent of Public Instruction to provide written notice to a person who is licensed pursuant to chapter 391 of NRS 3 of the date of expiration of the person's license.

4      Existing law prescribes the action that must be taken by a school district if the 5 license of a teacher or other person who is licensed pursuant to chapter 391 of NRS 6 fails to maintain his license in force. (NRS 391.301-391.309) A school district shall 7 immediately suspend without pay such a person from employment. If the person 8 does not reinstate his license within a prescribed time, the school district shall 9 terminate the person's employment. (NRS 391.302) **Section 3** of this bill provides 10 that if the employee's license lapses during a time that school is in session, the 11 employee must not be suspended from employment for 90 days or until the end of 12 the school year, whichever is longer. The person's employment shall be deemed 13 terminated if the person does not reinstate his license within the prescribed time.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** Chapter 391 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 and 3 of this act.

3      **Sec. 2.** *The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall  
4 provide written notice to each person who holds a license issued  
5 pursuant to this chapter of the date on which the license expires.  
6 The written notice must be mailed, by first-class mail, to the last  
7 known address of the licensee, as reflected in the records of the  
8 Superintendent, not less than 6 months and not more than 1 year  
9 before the date of expiration.*

10     **Sec. 3. 1.** *Except as otherwise provided by subsection 3, if  
11 the license of an employee lapses during a time that school is in  
12 session:*

13     *(a) The school district that employs him shall provide written  
14 notice to the employee of the lapse of his license and of the  
15 provisions of this section;*

16     *(b) The employee must not be suspended from employment for  
17 the lapsed license for a period of 90 days after the date of the  
18 notice pursuant to paragraph (a) or the end of the school year,  
19 whichever is longer; and*

20     *(c) The employee's license shall be deemed valid for the period  
21 described in paragraph (b) for purposes of the employee's  
22 continued employment with the school district during that period.*

23     **2.** *If a school district complies with subsection 1 and an  
24 employee fails to reinstate his license within the time prescribed in  
25 paragraph (b) of subsection 1, his employment shall be deemed  
26 terminated at the end of the period described in paragraph (b) of  
27 subsection 1 and the school district is not otherwise required to  
28 comply with NRS 391.301 to 391.309, inclusive.*

29     **3.** *The provisions of this section do not apply to an employee  
30 whose license has been suspended or revoked by the State Board  
31 pursuant to NRS 391.320 to 391.361, inclusive.*

32     **Sec. 4.** NRS 391.120 is hereby amended to read as follows:

33     **391.120 1.** Boards of trustees of the school districts in this  
34 State may employ legally qualified teachers and other licensed  
35 personnel and may determine their salaries and the length of the  
36 term of school for which they are employed. These conditions and  
37 any other conditions agreed upon by the parties must be embodied  
38 in a written contract, or notice of reemployment, to be approved by  
39 the board of trustees and accepted and signed by the employee. A  
40 copy of the contract or notice of reemployment, properly written,  
41 must be delivered to each teacher or other licensed employee not  
42 later than the opening of the term of school.

1       2. A board of trustees may not employ teachers or other  
2 licensed personnel for any school year commencing after the  
3 expiration of the time for which any member of the board of trustees  
4 was elected or appointed.

5       3. It is unlawful for the board of trustees of any school district  
6 to employ any teacher who is not legally qualified to teach all the  
7 grades which the teacher is engaged to teach. ~~The~~ Except as  
8 *otherwise provided in section 3 of this act, the* board of trustees  
9 shall suspend or terminate, as applicable, the employment of any  
10 teacher who fails to maintain a license issued pursuant to this  
11 chapter in force, if such a license is required for employment. Any  
12 such suspension or termination must comply with the requirements  
13 of NRS 391.301 to 391.309, inclusive ~~H, and section 3 of this act.~~

14      4. On or before November 15 of each year, the school district  
15 shall submit to the Department, in a form prescribed by the  
16 Superintendent of Public Instruction, the following information for  
17 each licensed employee employed by the school district on  
18 October 1 of that year:

19       (a) The amount of salary of the employee; and  
20       (b) The designated assignment, as that term is defined by the  
21 Department of Education, of the employee.

22      **Sec. 5.** NRS 391.301 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
23      391.301 As used in NRS 391.301 to 391.309, inclusive, *and*  
24 *section 3 of this act,* unless the context otherwise requires,  
25 "employee" means a person who:

26       1. Is employed by a school district in this State; and  
27       2. Is required, as a condition of his employment, to hold a  
28 license issued pursuant to this chapter.

29      **Sec. 6.** NRS 391.302 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
30      391.302 1. ~~H~~ Except as *otherwise provided in section 3 of*  
31 *this act, if* an employee fails to maintain his license in force, the  
32 school district that employs him shall:

33       (a) Immediately suspend the employee without pay; and  
34       (b) Terminate his employment if he fails to reinstate his license  
35 within the time prescribed by subsection 2 of NRS 391.305.

36       2. If an employee is suspended pursuant to this section and,  
37 within 90 days after the date of suspension, is granted by the  
38 Department or Commission an extension of time or any other relief  
39 which has the effect of reinstating or continuing his license in force,  
40 the suspension of the employee is ineffective and the school district  
41 shall immediately reinstate the employee while his license remains  
42 in force. The employee must be reinstated to the position he held at  
43 the time of his suspension. If the employee thereafter fails again to  
44 maintain his license in force, the school district shall again suspend

1 the employee without pay and proceed in accordance with NRS  
2 391.305, 391.308 and 391.309.

3       **Sec. 7.** NRS 391.3115 is hereby amended to read as follows:

4           391.3115 1. The demotion, suspension, dismissal and  
5 nonreemployment provisions of NRS 391.311 to 391.3197,  
6 inclusive, do not apply to:

7           (a) Substitute teachers; or

8           (b) Adult education teachers.

9           2. The provisions of NRS 391.311 to 391.3194, inclusive, do  
10 not apply to a teacher whose employment is suspended or  
11 terminated pursuant to subsection 3 of NRS 391.120 **or section 3 of**  
12 **this act** for failure to maintain a license in force.

13          3. A licensed employee who is employed in a position fully  
14 funded by a federal or private categorical grant or to replace another  
15 licensed employee during that employee's leave of absence is  
16 employed only for the duration of the grant or leave. Such a licensed  
17 employee and licensed employees who are employed on temporary  
18 contracts for 90 school days or less, or its equivalent in a school  
19 district operating under an alternative schedule authorized pursuant  
20 to NRS 388.090, to replace licensed employees whose employment  
21 has terminated after the beginning of the school year are entitled to  
22 credit for that time in fulfilling any period of probation and during  
23 that time the provisions of NRS 391.311 to 391.3197, inclusive, for  
24 demotion, suspension or dismissal apply to them.

25       **Sec. 8.** The provisions of this act apply to any employee who  
26 fails to maintain his license in force on or after July 1, 2007.

27       **Sec. 9.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
