AN ACT making an appropriation to the Aging Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services for the respite care grant program; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Aging Services Division of the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$245,000 for use as matching money for federal funding for the respite care grant program.

**Sec. 2.** Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after



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1 June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or  
2 any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or  
3 otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the  
4 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose  
5 after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money  
6 was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently  
7 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General  
8 Fund on or before September 18, 2009.

9 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
