AN ACT relating to peace officers; eliminating the exceptions that authorize the release of the home address of a peace officer by a law enforcement agency in certain circumstances; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill eliminates the exceptions that currently authorize a law enforcement
2 agency to release the home address of a peace officer to the public. Those
3 exceptions include authorization of the release by the officer and situations in
4 which the officer has been arrested. (NRS 289.025)

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 289.025 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 289.025 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2, the
3 home address and any photograph of a peace officer in the
4 possession of a law enforcement agency are not public information
5 and are confidential.
6 2. The **[home address and]** photograph of a peace officer may
7 be released:
