

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 529—COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS  
(ON BEHALF OF THE NEVADA ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES)

**SUMMARY**—Clarifies the applicability of regulations of the State Fire Marshal concerning building codes. (BDR 42-375)

AN ACT relating to the State Fire Marshal; clarifying that, with certain exceptions, regulations adopted by the State Fire Marshal concerning building codes do not apply in certain larger counties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, the State Fire Marshal is required to enforce all laws and adopt regulations relating, in pertinent part, to the safety, access, means and adequacy of exit in case of fire from certain buildings used by the public. (NRS 477.030) In accordance with this duty, the State Fire Marshal has adopted by reference in regulation the *International Building Code*, 2003 edition, Volumes 1 and 2, with certain changes. (NAC 477.281, 477.283) Although the regulations adopted by the State Fire Marshal apply throughout the State, the State Fire Marshal is only authorized under existing law to enforce those regulations: (1) with respect to buildings owned or occupied by the State; and (2) in counties whose population is less than 100,000 other than consolidated municipalities (currently counties other than Clark and Washoe Counties and Carson City). In counties whose population is 100,000 or more (currently Clark and Washoe Counties and Carson City), the local jurisdictions in those counties are required to enforce the regulations of the State Fire Marshal except if a local jurisdiction in such a county requests the State Fire Marshal to perform such enforcement. (NRS 477.030) Existing law also authorizes the governing body of a city or county to adopt building codes and authorizes boards of county commissioners to regulate all matters relating to the construction, maintenance and safety of buildings, structures and property within the county. (NRS 244.3675, 268.413, 278.580)

20 This bill makes the regulations adopted by the State Fire Marshal concerning  
21 building codes inapplicable in a county whose population is 400,000 or more  
22 (currently Clark County) that has adopted a building code, except with respect to  
23 buildings owned or occupied by the State and public schools and except in a local  
24 jurisdiction in such a county in which the State Fire Marshal is requested to enforce  
25 those regulations by the chief executive officer of the jurisdiction.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     **Section 1.** NRS 477.030 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2         477.030 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, the  
3         State Fire Marshal shall enforce all laws and adopt regulations  
4         relating to:  
5             (a) The prevention of fire.  
6             (b) The storage and use of:  
7                 (1) Combustibles, flammables and fireworks; and  
8                 (2) Explosives in any commercial construction, but not in  
9         mining or the control of avalanches,  
10         → under those circumstances that are not otherwise regulated by the  
11         Division of Industrial Relations of the Department of Business and  
12         Industry pursuant to NRS 618.890.  
13         (c) The safety, access, means and adequacy of exit in case of fire  
14         from mental and penal institutions, facilities for the care of children,  
15         foster homes, residential facilities for groups, facilities for  
16         intermediate care, nursing homes, hospitals, schools, all buildings,  
17         except private residences, which are occupied for sleeping purposes,  
18         buildings used for public assembly and all other buildings where  
19         large numbers of persons work, live or congregate for any purpose.  
20         As used in this paragraph, "public assembly" means a building or a  
21         portion of a building used for the gathering together of 50 or more  
22         persons for purposes of deliberation, education, instruction, worship,  
23         entertainment, amusement or awaiting transportation, or the  
24         gathering together of 100 or more persons in establishments for  
25         drinking or dining.  
26         (d) The suppression and punishment of arson and fraudulent  
27         claims or practices in connection with fire losses.  
28         → **[The] Except as otherwise provided in subsection 12, the**  
29         regulations of the State Fire Marshal apply throughout the State, but  
30         **H** except with respect to state-owned or state-occupied buildings,  
31         his authority to enforce them or conduct investigations under this  
32         chapter does not extend to a county whose population is 100,000 or  
33         more or which has been converted into a consolidated municipality,  
34         except in those local jurisdictions in those counties where he is  
35         requested to exercise that authority by the chief officer of the

1 organized fire department of that jurisdiction or except as otherwise  
2 provided in a regulation adopted pursuant to paragraph (b) of  
3 subsection 2.

4       2. The State Fire Marshal may:

5           (a) Set standards for equipment and appliances pertaining to fire  
6 safety or to be used for fire protection within this State, including  
7 the threads used on fire hose couplings and hydrant fittings; and

8           (b) Adopt regulations based on nationally recognized standards  
9 setting forth the requirements for fire departments to provide  
10 training to firefighters using techniques or exercises that involve the  
11 use of fire or any device that produces or may be used to produce  
12 fire.

13       3. The State Fire Marshal shall cooperate with the State  
14 Forester Firewarden in the preparation of regulations relating to  
15 standards for fire retardant roofing materials pursuant to paragraph  
16 (e) of subsection 1 of NRS 472.040.

17       4. The State Fire Marshal shall cooperate with the Division of  
18 Child and Family Services of the Department of Health and Human  
19 Services in establishing reasonable minimum standards for  
20 overseeing the safety of and directing the means and adequacy of  
21 exit in case of fire from family foster homes and group foster  
22 homes.

23       5. The State Fire Marshal shall coordinate all activities  
24 conducted pursuant to 15 U.S.C. §§ 2201 et seq. and receive and  
25 distribute money allocated by the United States pursuant to that act.

26       6. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 10, the State Fire  
27 Marshal shall:

28           (a) Investigate any fire which occurs in a county other than one  
29 whose population is 100,000 or more or which has been converted  
30 into a consolidated municipality, and from which a death results or  
31 which is of a suspicious nature.

32           (b) Investigate any fire which occurs in a county whose  
33 population is 100,000 or more or which has been converted into a  
34 consolidated municipality, and from which a death results or which  
35 is of a suspicious nature, if requested to do so by the chief officer of  
36 the fire department in whose jurisdiction the fire occurs.

37           (c) Cooperate with the Commissioner of Insurance, the Attorney  
38 General and the Fraud Control Unit established pursuant to NRS  
39 228.412 in any investigation of a fraudulent claim under an  
40 insurance policy for any fire of a suspicious nature.

41           (d) Cooperate with any local fire department in the investigation  
42 of any report received pursuant to NRS 629.045.

43           (e) Provide specialized training in investigating the causes of  
44 fires if requested to do so by the chief officer of an organized fire  
45 department.

1       7. The State Fire Marshal shall put the National Fire Incident  
2 Reporting System into effect throughout the State and publish at  
3 least annually a summary of data collected under the System.

4       8. The State Fire Marshal shall provide assistance and  
5 materials to local authorities, upon request, for the establishment of  
6 programs for public education and other fire prevention activities.

7       9. The State Fire Marshal shall:

8           (a) ~~Assist~~ Except as otherwise provided in subsection 12,  
9 *assist* in checking plans and specifications for construction;

10          (b) Provide specialized training to local fire departments; and  
11          (c) Assist local governments in drafting regulations and  
12 ordinances,

13      → on request or as he deems necessary.

14       10. Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, in a county  
15 other than one whose population is 100,000 or more or which has  
16 been converted into a consolidated municipality, the State Fire  
17 Marshal shall, upon request by a local government, delegate to the  
18 local government by interlocal agreement all or a portion of his  
19 authority or duties if the local government's personnel and programs  
20 are, as determined by the State Fire Marshal, equally qualified to  
21 perform those functions. If a local government fails to maintain the  
22 qualified personnel and programs in accordance with such an  
23 agreement, the State Fire Marshal shall revoke the agreement. The  
24 provisions of this subsection do not apply to the authority of the  
25 State Fire Marshal to adopt regulations pursuant to paragraph (b) of  
26 subsection 2.

27       11. The State Fire Marshal may, as a public safety officer or as  
28 a technical expert on issues relating to hazardous materials,  
29 participate in any local, state or federal team or task force that is  
30 established to conduct enforcement and interdiction activities  
31 involving:

32           (a) Commercial trucking;  
33           (b) Environmental crimes;  
34           (c) Explosives and pyrotechnics;  
35           (d) Drugs or other controlled substances; or  
36           (e) Any similar activity specified by the State Fire Marshal.

37       **12. Any regulations of the State Fire Marshal concerning**  
38 *matters relating to building codes, including, without limitation,*  
39 *matters relating to the construction, maintenance or safety of*  
40 *buildings, structures and property in this State, do not apply in a*  
41 *county whose population is 400,000 or more that has adopted a*  
42 *building code, except with respect to state-owned or state-occupied*  
43 *buildings or public schools in such a county and except in those*  
44 *local jurisdictions in such a county in which the State Fire*  
45 *Marshal is requested to exercise that authority by the chief*

2 *“public school” has the meaning ascribed to it in NRS 385.007.*

3 **Sec. 2.** NRS 244.3675 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
4 244.3675 Subject to the limitations set forth in NRS 244.368,  
5 278.580, 278.582 , ~~and~~ 444.340 to 444.430, inclusive, *and*  
6 **477.030**, the boards of county commissioners within their respective  
7 counties may:

8 1. Regulate all matters relating to the construction,  
9 maintenance and safety of buildings, structures and property within  
10 the county.

11 2. Adopt any building, electrical, housing, plumbing or safety  
12 code necessary to carry out the provisions of this section and  
13 establish such fees as may be necessary. Except as otherwise  
14 provided in NRS 278.580, these fees do not apply to the State of  
15 Nevada, the Nevada System of Higher Education or any school  
16 district.

17 **Sec. 3.** NRS 268.413 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
18 268.413 Subject to the limitations contained in NRS 244.368,  
19 278.580, 278.582 , ~~and~~ 444.340 to 444.430, inclusive, *and*  
20 **477.030**, the city council or other governing body of an incorporated  
21 city may:

22 1. Regulate all matters relating to the construction,  
23 maintenance and safety of buildings, structures and property within  
24 the city.

25 2. Adopt any building, electrical, plumbing or safety code  
26 necessary to carry out the provisions of this section and establish  
27 such fees as may be necessary. Except as otherwise provided in  
28 NRS 278.580, these fees do not apply to the State of Nevada, the  
29 Nevada System of Higher Education or any school district.

30 **Sec. 4.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
