ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 564-COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION)

MARCH 26, 2007

Referred to Concurrent Committees on Education and Ways and Means

SUMMARY—Creates and funds new scholarship programs for higher education. (BDR 34-277)

FISCAL NOTE: Effect on Local Government: No.

EXPLANATION - Matter in bolded italics is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to education; creating the Nevada Science, Technology, Engineering and Math Scholarship Program; creating the Nevada Scholars Scholarship Program; creating the Nevada Nursing Scholarship Program; creating the Nevada Teaching Scholarship Program; making appropriations; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

Section 2 of this bill creates the Nevada Science, Technology, Engineering and Math Scholarship Program to award scholarships to students majoring in physical science, life science, computer science, technology or mathematics who satisfy the other criteria established for the scholarship. Each scholarship must not exceed \$4,000 per year, except that if the program of study of a student requires more than 4 years, the student may receive a scholarship not to exceed \$8,000 for an additional year of study. The Scholarship Program may award a grant of up to \$4,000 to any recipient of such a scholarship who completes 2 years of employment as a teacher in an elementary or secondary school in this State in the field of physical science, life science, computer science, technology or mathematics. **Section 6** of this bill appropriates \$700,000 for the Scholarship Program.

Section 3 of this bill creates the Nevada Scholars Scholarship Program to award scholarships to students who have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.8, are recipients of the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship, are nominated for the scholarship by the President of a university, state college or community college within the Nevada System of Higher Education and satisfy the other criteria established for the scholarship. **Section 3** also authorizes the provision

of educationally beneficial activities to recipients of the scholarship. **Section 7** of this bill appropriates \$170,000 for the Scholarship Program.

Section 4 of this bill creates the Nevada Nursing Scholarship Program to provide scholarships to students who are enrolled in a nursing program at a university, state college or community college within the System, have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0, demonstrate sufficient financial need for the scholarship and satisfy the other criteria established for the scholarship. Each scholarship must not exceed \$4,000 per year. Each recipient of the scholarship is required to begin full-time employment as a licensed practical nurse or registered nurse in this State within 6 months after graduating and remain employed in such a capacity for a period equal to the period of education covered by the scholarship. Any recipient who fails to comply with the requirement must repay the Scholarship Program the full amount of the money received from the scholarship, plus interest. **Section 8** of this bill appropriates \$2,700,000 for the Scholarship Program.

Section 5 of this bill creates the Nevada Teaching Scholarship Program to provide scholarships to students who are enrolled in a teaching program at a university, state college or community college within the System, have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0, demonstrate sufficient financial need for the scholarship and satisfy the other criteria established for the scholarship. Each scholarship must not exceed \$4,000 per year. Each recipient of the scholarship is required to begin full-time employment as a teacher in an elementary or secondary school in this State within 6 months after graduating and remain employed in such a capacity for a period equal to the period of education covered by the scholarship. Any recipient who fails to comply with the requirement must repay the Scholarship Program the full amount of the money received from the scholarship, plus interest. Section 9 of this bill appropriates \$2,500,000 for the Scholarship Program.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- **Section 1.** Chapter 396 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto the provisions set forth as sections 2 to 5, inclusive, of this act.
 - Sec. 2. 1. The Nevada Science, Technology, Engineering and Math Scholarship Program is hereby created.
 - 2. A student is eligible to receive a scholarship pursuant to this section if the student:
 - (a) Is enrolled full-time at a university, state college or community college within the System;
 - (b) Is majoring in physical science, life science, computer science, technology or mathematics;
 - (c) Has a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 in course work required for the major;
 - (d) Is in his third or fourth year of undergraduate study;
 - (e) Has received a National Science and Mathematics Access to Retain Talent Grant for the year of study covered by the scholarship; and





(f) Complies with all policies and procedures adopted by the Board of Regents pursuant to subsection 7.

The amount of a scholarship awarded pursuant to

subsection 2 must not exceed \$4,000 per year.

- 4. If a student who receives a scholarship awarded pursuant to subsection 2 is enrolled in an undergraduate program that requires more than 4 years of study, the student may receive an additional scholarship from the program that must not exceed \$8,000 for an additional year of study if the student satisfies the requirements of paragraphs (a), (b), (c) and (f) of subsection 2.
- The Scholarship Program may award a grant that must not exceed \$4,000 to any recipient of a scholarship pursuant to this section who completes 2 years of employment as a teacher in an elementary or secondary school in this State in the field of physical science, life science, computer science, technology or mathematics.
- The Board of Regents may accept any gift, grant, bequest or donation specifically designated for the Scholarship Program by the donor.
 - 7. The Board of Regents shall:
- (a) Receive, invest, disburse and account separately for all money received for the Scholarship Program; and
- (b) Adopt appropriate policies and procedures to carry out the Scholarship Program.
- Sec. 3. 1. The Nevada Scholars Scholarship Program is hereby created.
- 2. A student is eligible to receive a scholarship pursuant to this section if the student:
 - (a) Is a Nevada resident:
- (b) Is a recipient of the Governor Guinn Millennium Scholarship;
- (c) Is enrolled full-time at a university, state college or community college within the System;
- (d) Has completed at least 30 credits at a university, state 35 college or community college within the System;
 - (e) Has a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.8; and
- (f) Complies with all policies and procedures adopted by the Board of Regents pursuant to subsection 9. 38
- 3. A student who wishes to apply for a scholarship pursuant 39 40 to this section must: 41
 - (a) Be nominated for the scholarship by the President of a university, state college or community college within the System; and
 - (b) Submit with his application:





- (1) Two or more references from faculty members at a university, state college or community college within the System; and
- (2) One or more samples of outstanding work produced by the student at a university, state college or community college within the System.
- 4. If the number of qualified applicants for a scholarship pursuant to this section exceeds the number of available scholarships, preference must be given to any applicant who is entering his senior year.
- 5. The Scholarship Program shall provide each recipient of a scholarship pursuant to this section with a faculty mentor from the institution at which the recipient is enrolled and may, without limitation, provide such a recipient with opportunities to travel, attend special symposia and experience activities designed to extend education beyond the classroom.
- 6. Each recipient of a scholarship pursuant to this section and his faculty mentor shall jointly develop a plan designed to enhance the educational experience of the recipient and recommend educationally beneficial activities for recipients of the scholarship.
- 7. The Board of Regents shall establish a Nevada Scholars Committee to study issues relating to the reputation for excellence of the institutions within the System and to support the Scholarship Program. The Chairman of the Board of Regents shall appoint the members of the Committee. The members of the Committee serve without compensation.
- 8. The Board of Regents may accept any gift, grant, bequest or donation specifically designated for the Scholarship Program by the donor.
 - 9. The Board of Regents shall:
- (a) Receive, invest, disburse and account separately for all money received for the Scholarship Program; and
- (b) Adopt appropriate policies and procedures to carry out the Scholarship Program.
- Sec. 4. 1. The Nevada Nursing Scholarship Program is hereby created.
- 2. A student is eligible to receive a scholarship pursuant to this section if the student:
- 40 (a) Is enrolled in a nursing program at a university, state 41 college or community college within the System;
 - (b) Has a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0;
- 43 (c) Demonstrates sufficient financial need for the scholarship; 44 and





- (d) Complies with all policies and procedures adopted by the Board of Regents pursuant to subsection 8.
- 3. If the number of qualified applicants for a scholarship pursuant to this section exceeds the number of available scholarships, preference must be given to any applicant who is entering his senior year.
- 4. The amount of a scholarship awarded pursuant to subsection 2 must not exceed \$4,000 per year.
- 5. If a student who receives a scholarship awarded pursuant to subsection 2 is enrolled in a nursing program that requires more than 4 years of study, the student may receive an additional scholarship from the Scholarship Program that must not exceed \$4,000 for an additional year of study if the student satisfies the requirements of subsection 2.
- 6. Each recipient of a scholarship pursuant to this section must begin full-time employment as a licensed practical nurse or registered nurse in this State within 6 months after graduating and remain employed in such a capacity for a period equal to the period of education covered by the scholarship. Any recipient of a scholarship pursuant to this section who fails to comply with the requirements of this subsection is liable for repayment to the Scholarship Program of the full amount of the money received from the scholarship, plus interest at the rate of 7 percent per year computed from the date of receipt of the money.
- 7. The Board of Regents may accept any gift, grant, bequest or donation specifically designated for the Scholarship Program by the donor.

 - (a) Receive, invest, disburse and account separately for all money received for the Scholarship Program; and
- 31 (b) Adopt appropriate policies and procedures to carry out the 32 Scholarship Program.
- 33 Sec. 5. 1. The Nevada Teaching Scholarship Program is hereby created.
- 2. A student is eligible to receive a scholarship pursuant to this section if the student:
 - (a) Is enrolled in a teaching program at a university, state college or community college within the System;
 - (b) Has a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0;
- 40 (c) Demonstrates sufficient financial need for the scholarship; 41 and
 - (d) Complies with all policies and procedures adopted by the Board of Regents pursuant to subsection 8.
- 44 3. If the number of qualified applicants for a scholarship 45 pursuant to this section exceeds the number of available





scholarships, preference must be given to any applicant who is majoring in science education, mathematics education, special education or bilingual education.

4. The amount of a scholarship awarded pursuant to subsection 2 must not exceed \$4,000 per year.

- 5. If a student who receives a scholarship awarded pursuant to subsection 2 is enrolled in a teaching program that requires more than 4 years of study, the student may receive an additional scholarship from the Scholarship Program that must not exceed \$4,000 for an additional year of study if the student satisfies the requirements of subsection 2.
- 6. Each recipient of a scholarship pursuant to this section must begin full-time employment as a teacher in an elementary or secondary school in this State within 6 months after graduating and remain employed in such a capacity for a period equal to the period of education covered by the scholarship. Any recipient of a scholarship pursuant to this section who fails to comply with the requirements of this subsection is liable for repayment to the Scholarship Program of the full amount of the money received from the scholarship, plus interest at the rate of 7 percent per year computed from the date of receipt of the money.
- 7. The Board of Regents may accept any gift, grant, bequest or donation specifically designated for the Scholarship Program by the donor.

- **Sec. 6.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada the sum of \$700,000 for providing scholarships pursuant to the Nevada Science, Technology, Engineering and Math Scholarship Program created by section 2 of this act.
 - 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 18, 2009.





- **Sec. 7.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada:
- (a) For providing scholarships pursuant to the Nevada Scholars Scholarship Program created by section 3 of this act, the sum of \$150,000.
- (b) For providing educationally beneficial activities for recipients of such scholarships, the sum of \$20,000.
- 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriations made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 18, 2009.
- **Sec. 8.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada the sum of \$2,700,000 for providing scholarships pursuant to the Nevada Nursing Scholarship Program created by section 4 of this act.
- 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 18, 2009.
- **Sec. 9.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State General Fund to the Board of Regents of the University of Nevada the sum of \$2,500,000 for providing scholarships pursuant to the Nevada Teaching Scholarship Program created by section 5 of this act.
- 2. Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by subsection 1 must not be committed for expenditure after June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently

- granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General Fund on or before September 18, 2009.
