

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 589—COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY

MARCH 26, 2007

Referred to Committee on Judiciary

SUMMARY—Provides for continued operation of the Nevada Gaming Commission and the State Gaming Control Board during a budgetary or other fiscal crisis. (BDR 41-102)

AN ACT relating to gaming; providing for continued operation of the Nevada Gaming Commission and the State Gaming Control Board during a budgetary or other fiscal crisis; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law creates the Nevada Gaming Commission and the State Gaming
2 Control Board and sets forth the general powers and duties of the Commission and
3 the Board. (NRS 463.022, 463.030, 463.140) These powers and duties include
4 investigating, inspecting and examining gaming premises and equipment. This bill
5 provides that the Commission, the Board and their employees are essential
6 employees and shall continue to perform their duties during a budgetary or other
7 fiscal crisis which causes a closure of nonessential offices.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 463 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:
3 ***Notwithstanding any other provision of law, in the event of a
4 budgetary or other fiscal crisis which necessitates a temporary
5 closure of the nonessential state agencies, State of Nevada, the
6 Board, the Commission and their agents shall be deemed to be
7 essential employees and shall continue to perform their duties.***



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1 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.

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
