SUMMARY—Makes various changes relating to the Legislature
and the Legislative Counsel Bureau. (BDR 17-1081)

AN ACT relating to the Legislative Branch of Government; making
various changes relating to the Legislature and the
Legislative Counsel Bureau; and providing other matters
properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 This bill makes various changes relating to the Legislature and the Legislative
2 Counsel Bureau. **Section 1** of this bill provides that the fee for a certain bill service
3 during a legislative session will be set by the Director of the Legislative Counsel
4 Bureau instead of being specified in the statute. (NRS 218.185) **Section 2** of this
5 bill eliminates the requirement that the Legislative Counsel represent any Legislator
6 in any matter before the Commission on Ethics. (NRS 218.697) **Section 3** of this
7 bill transfers authority for the portrait of the Governor from the Legislative
8 Commission to the Director of the Department of Cultural Affairs. (NRS 223.121)
9 **Sections 4 and 7** of this bill provide for title to all property reserved for the use of
10 the Legislature to be held in the name of the Legislature. (NRS 331.135) **Section**
11 **4.5** of this bill exempts the Legislative Branch of Government from certain
12 provisions relating to the State Public Works Board. **Sections 5 and 8** of this bill
13 clarify provisions concerning the appointment of members to the Nevada Silver
14 Haired Legislative Forum. (NRS 427A.330) **Section 6** of this bill clarifies the
15 prospective impact of the cost-of-living increases enacted for Legislators. (Chapter
16 329, Statutes of Nevada 2005, p. 1182)



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 218.185 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 218.185 1. During each session of the Legislature, employees
3 of the Senate and Assembly shall compile and prepare sets of books
4 containing bills, resolutions, journals and histories for:

5 (a) The officers and members of the Senate and Assembly
6 without cost to them.

7 (b) Selected staff members of the Legislative Counsel Bureau
8 without cost to them.

9 (c) The press room for use of accredited press representatives,
10 four such sets of books without cost to them.

11 (d) Persons other than those enumerated in paragraphs (a), (b)
12 and (c) upon application to the Legislative Counsel Bureau and the
13 payment of a fee ~~[of \$150.]~~ established by the Director of the
14 *Legislative Counsel Bureau.*

15 2. All fees collected under the provisions of this section must
16 be deposited with the State Treasurer for credit to the Legislative
17 Fund in accordance with the provisions of NRS 353.250.

18 **Sec. 2.** NRS 218.697 is hereby amended to read as follows:

19 218.697 1. ~~Upon request, the Legislative Counsel shall
20 represent any Legislator in any matter before the Commission on
21 Ethics.~~

22 ~~2.~~ When deemed necessary or advisable to protect the official
23 interests of the Legislature or one or more legislative committees,
24 the Legislative Commission, or the Chairman of the Legislative
25 Commission in cases where action is required before a meeting of
26 the Legislative Commission is scheduled to be held, may direct the
27 Legislative Counsel and his staff to appear in, commence, prosecute,
28 defend or intervene in any action, suit, matter, cause or proceeding
29 in any court or agency of this State or of the United States.

30 ~~B.~~ 2. The Legislative Commission may authorize payment of
31 the expenses and costs incurred pursuant to this section from the
32 Legislative Fund.

33 **Sec. 3.** NRS 223.121 is hereby amended to read as follows:

34 223.121 1. The ~~Legislative Commission~~ Director may,
35 upon the election of each new Governor, enter into a contract with
36 an artist for the purpose of procuring a portrait of that Governor for
37 display in the Capitol Building.

38 2. The portrait must be painted in oil colors and appropriately
39 framed. The painting and framing must be done in the same manner,
40 style and size as the portraits of former Governors of the State
41 displayed in the Capitol Building.

1 3. The contract price must not exceed the appropriation made
2 for this purpose to the Account for the Governor's Portrait in the
3 State General Fund. The contract price must include the cost of the
4 portrait and the frame.

5 4. The portrait and frame are subject to the approval of the
6 Governor.

7 5. Upon delivery of the approved, framed portrait to the
8 Secretary of State and its acceptance by the ~~Legislative~~
9 ~~Commission,~~ Director, the State Controller shall draw his warrant
10 in an amount equal to the contract price and the State Treasurer shall
11 pay the warrant from the Account for the Governor's Portrait. Any
12 balance remaining in the Account immediately lapses to the State
13 General Fund.

14 6. *As used in this section, "Director" means the Director of
15 the Department of Cultural Affairs.*

16 Sec. 4. NRS 331.135 is hereby amended to read as follows:

17 331.135 1. The Legislature reserves the supervision and
18 control, both during and between legislative sessions, of:

19 (a) The entire legislative building, including its chambers,
20 offices and other rooms, and its furnishings and equipment.

21 (b) A portion of the parcel of land bounded on the west by
22 Carson Street, on the south by Fifth Street, on the east by Fall Street,
23 and on the north by the sidewalk along the south fence of the capitol
24 grounds, situated in a portion of the Capitol Complex, as shown on
25 the Record of Survey Map No. 297, Official Records of Carson
26 City, Nevada, File No. 3043, section 17, T. 15 N., R. 20 E., M.D.M.,
27 more particularly described as follows:

29 Beginning at the southwest corner of block 36, Sears ,
30 Thompson *and* Sears Division, as shown on that record of
31 survey;

32 Thence N 89°52'32" E, a distance of 443.93 feet;

33 Thence N 00°12'15" E, a distance of 302.14 feet;

34 Thence N 44°47'45" W, a distance of 189.88 feet to the
35 north side of an existing sidewalk;

36 Thence N 89°39'33" W, along that sidewalk, a distance of
37 97.13 feet to the east side of an existing sidewalk;

38 Thence N 00°14'26" E, along that sidewalk, a distance of
39 270.00 feet, more or less, to the north line of a sidewalk;

40 Thence N 89°47'45" W, along that sidewalk, a distance of
41 212.50 feet, to the east right-of-way line of Carson Street;

42 Thence S 00°13'08" W, along that line, a distance of
43 709.40 feet, more or less, to the true point of beginning.

44 Containing 5.572 acres, more or less.

1 (c) The entire parcel of land bounded on the north by Fifth
2 Street, on the south by Sixth Street, on the east by Stewart Street
3 and on the west by Plaza Street, also described as blocks 2 and 3,
4 Pierson and Goodridge Addition; and that portion of Fall Street
5 between Fifth Street and Sixth Street abandoned by Carson City on
6 April 26, 1990, Meeting Agenda Item 9 M-89/90-10. Also the entire
7 parcel of land bounded on the north by the south boundary line of
8 block 2, Pierson and Goodridge Addition, on the south by Seventh
9 Street, on the east by Stewart Street and on the west by Fall Street,
10 and further described as block 7, Pierson and Goodridge Addition.

11 (d) The entire parcel of land bounded on the north by Sixth
12 Street, on the south by Seventh Street, on the east by Fall Street, and
13 on the west by Plaza Street, also described as block 6, Pierson and
14 Goodridge Addition.

15 (e) The entire parcel of land bounded on the north by Fourth
16 Street, on the west by Stewart Street, on the south by Fifth Street,
17 and on the east by the abandoned right-of-way of Valley Street, also
18 described as block 39 of Sears , Thompson **and** Sears Division of
19 Carson City; and the west 30.00 feet of the abandoned right-of-way
20 of Valley Street abutting block 39 of Sears , Thompson **and** Sears
21 Division. Excepting therefrom that portion of Stewart and Fifth
22 Streets deeded to the State of Nevada through its Department of
23 Transportation as recorded in book 283, page 208, of Deeds, Carson
24 City, Nevada.

25 (f) *The entire parcel of land bounded on the north by Third
26 Street, on the west by Stewart Street, on the south by Fourth
27 Street, and on the east by Valley Street, also described as block 22
28 of Sears, Thompson and Sears Division of Carson City; and the
29 land occupied by the state printing warehouse in block 21 of
30 Sears, Thompson and Sears Division of Carson City; and the
31 abandoned right-of-way of Fourth Street between block 22 of
32 Sears, Thompson and Sears Division and block 39 of Sears,
33 Thompson and Sears Division of Carson City. Excepting
34 therefrom that portion of Stewart Street deeded to the State of
35 Nevada through its Department of Transportation as recorded in
36 book 283, page 208, of Deeds, Carson City, Nevada.*

37 (g) Any other property acquired for the use of the Legislature or
38 its staff.

39 → *Title to the property described in this subsection must be held in
40 the name of the Legislature of the State of Nevada.*

41 2. The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau:

42 (a) Shall provide an individual office for each Legislator whose
43 position as an officer or as a chairman of a committee does not
44 otherwise entitle him to occupy an assigned office.



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1 (b) May assign the use of space in the legislative building or
2 other legislative facilities or on the legislative grounds in such a
3 manner as the Legislative Commission prescribes.

4 3. The Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau shall cause
5 the legislative building, chambers and grounds and other legislative
6 facilities to be kept in good repair, clean, orderly and presentable as
7 befits public property and the dignity of the Legislature. For this
8 purpose he may, in addition to his general power to employ or
9 contract for the services of personnel, contract with any private
10 enterprise or governmental agency for the provision of appropriate
11 services.

12 **Sec. 4.5.** NRS 341.158 is hereby amended to read as follows:
13 341.158 The provisions of ~~NRS 341.141 to 341.155,~~
14 ~~inclusive,~~} **this chapter** do not ~~require~~ apply to the Legislative
15 Branch of government . ~~[to use the services of the Board.]~~ The
16 Legislature may require the Board to provide the services described
17 in ~~those sections~~ **NRS 341.141 to 341.155, inclusive**, for particular
18 projects for the Legislative Branch of government.

19 **Sec. 5.** NRS 427A.330 is hereby amended to read as follows:
20 427A.330 1. The Legislative Commission shall appoint to the
21 Nevada Silver Haired Legislative Forum a number of members
22 equal to the number of State Senators. The persons appointed to the
23 Forum must be the persons nominated pursuant to this section. Each
24 member of the Senate shall, after consulting with the members of
25 the Assembly who reside within his senatorial district, nominate a
26 person who meets the requirements for appointment to the Forum
27 set forth in NRS 427A.340.

28 2. Appointments to the Nevada Silver Haired Legislative
29 Forum must be made by the Legislative Commission before
30 December ~~1 of an odd numbered year. The term of a member~~
31 ~~begins on December 1 of the odd numbered year of appointment.~~

32 3. The members of the Nevada Silver Haired Legislative
33 Forum from Clark County Senatorial Districts 2, 3, 4, 7 and 8,
34 Washoe County Senatorial Districts 1 and 3, the Capital Senatorial
35 District and the Western Nevada Senatorial District serve an initial
36 term of 1 year. The members of the Nevada Silver Haired
37 Legislative Forum from the remaining senatorial districts serve an
38 initial term of 2 years.} **31 of the second year of a member's term.**
39 After the initial terms, each member **of the Forum** serves a term of
40 2 years. **Each member of the Forum continues to serve until his**
41 **successor is appointed.**



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1 **Sec. 6.** Chapter 329, Statutes of Nevada 2005, at page 1182, is
2 hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to be designated as
3 section 8, immediately following section 7, to read as follows:

4 *Sec. 8. The increases in the compensation for Senators
5 and Assemblymen pursuant to the amendatory provisions of
6 section 7 of this act must be calculated based only upon
7 increases in the salaries of the classified employees of this
8 State that take effect on or after November 2, 2004.*

9 **Sec. 7.** The State Land Registrar shall, as soon as practicable
10 after the effective date of this act, execute and file all necessary and
11 appropriate documents to provide that title to property described in
12 subsection 1 of NRS 331.135 is held in the name of the Legislature
13 of the State of Nevada.

14 **Sec. 8.** On or before December 31, 2007, or as soon thereafter
15 as practicable, the Legislative Commission shall appoint new
16 members of the Nevada Silver Haired Legislative Forum pursuant to
17 NRS 427A.330, as amended by section 5 of this act. The Legislative
18 Commission shall appoint to terms ending on:

19 1. December 31, 2008, members nominated by Senators
20 representing Clark County Senatorial Districts 1, 5, 9, 10 and 12,
21 Washoe County Senatorial Districts 1 and 4, the Central Nevada
22 Senatorial District and the Rural Nevada Senatorial District.

23 2. December 31, 2009, members nominated by Senators
24 representing Clark County Senatorial Districts 2, 3, 4, 6, 7, 8 and 11,
25 Washoe County Senatorial Districts 2 and 3, and the Capital
26 Senatorial District.

27 → The terms of the members of the Nevada Silver Haired
28 Legislative Forum as of the effective date of this act continue until
29 their successors are appointed pursuant to this section. A member
30 may be reappointed.

31 **Sec. 9.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.

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
