

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 609—COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

APRIL 17, 2007

Referred to Committee on Ways and Means

SUMMARY—Makes an appropriation to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services for a feasibility study of the NOMADS software application. (BDR S-1476)

AN ACT making an appropriation to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human Services for a feasibility study of the NOMADS software application; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** 1. There is hereby appropriated from the State
2 General Fund to the Division of Welfare and Supportive Services of
3 the Department of Health and Human Services the sum of \$350,000
4 to contract with a qualified, independent consultant to conduct a
5 feasibility study of the modification or replacement of the Division
6 of Welfare and Supportive Service's NOMADS software
7 application. The money appropriated by this section must be used to
8 match available federal financial participation from all benefiting
9 federal programs.
10 2. The feasibility study conducted pursuant to this section
11 must:
12 (a) Comprehensively review the ability of the NOMADS
13 software application to perform business responsibilities required by
14 federal and state laws, regulations and policy.



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1 (b) Examine the ability of NOMADS to promote business
2 efficiencies and cost-effective case management.

3 (c) Determine the long-term viability of NOMADS to provide
4 continued support of Divisional responsibilities and to integrate into
5 the Department of Information Technology's global information
6 technology plan.

7 (d) Analyze the cost-effectiveness and functionality of
8 NOMADS in comparison to other software applications used by
9 other state or county governments engaged in similar business
10 activities.

11 (e) Identify best practice software support options utilized by
12 other states to promote business efficiencies and cost-effective
13 operations.

14 (f) Recommend software application improvement or
15 replacement options, including cost analysis and implementation
16 timelines of these options.

17 3. On or before February 1, 2009, the Division of Welfare and
18 Supportive Services of the Department of Health and Human
19 Services shall submit a written report of the results of the study
20 conducted pursuant to subsection 2, including, without limitation,
21 any recommendations for legislation, to the Director of the
22 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmission to the 75th Session of
23 the Nevada Legislature.

24 **Sec. 2.** Any remaining balance of the appropriation made by
25 section 1 of this act must not be committed for expenditure after
26 June 30, 2009, by the entity to which the appropriation is made or
27 any entity to which money from the appropriation is granted or
28 otherwise transferred in any manner, and any portion of the
29 appropriated money remaining must not be spent for any purpose
30 after September 18, 2009, by either the entity to which the money
31 was appropriated or the entity to which the money was subsequently
32 granted or transferred, and must be reverted to the State General
33 Fund on or before September 18, 2009.

34 **Sec. 3.** This act becomes effective upon passage and approval.
