

ASSEMBLY BILL NO. 625—COMMITTEE ON WAYS AND MEANS

MAY 28, 2007

Referred to Committee on Ways and Means

SUMMARY—Makes certain changes concerning court programs.
(BDR 14-1514)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to court programs; reducing the allocation of administrative assessments for use by the Supreme Court to provide an allocation for specialty court programs; eliminating the requirement that the Court Administrator submit a domestic violence report in 2009; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 Existing law requires that 60 percent of the proceeds from certain
2 administrative assessments be distributed to the Court Administrator for use by the
3 Supreme Court. (NRS 176.059) **Section 1** of this bill reduces that allocation to 48
4 percent and requires the remaining 12 percent to be allocated for use by specialty
5 court programs.
6 Existing law requires the Court Administrator to submit to the Director of the
7 Legislative Counsel Bureau biennially a written report concerning the effectiveness
8 of counseling programs for persons who commit domestic violence. (NRS 1.360)
9 **Sections 2 and 3** of this bill eliminate this requirement after 2007.
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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** NRS 176.059 is hereby amended to read as follows:
2 176.059 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2,
3 when a defendant pleads guilty or is found guilty of a misdemeanor,
4 including the violation of any municipal ordinance, the justice or
5 judge shall include in the sentence the sum prescribed by the
6 following schedule as an administrative assessment and render a
7 judgment against the defendant for the assessment:

If the justice or judge sentences the defendant to perform community service in lieu of a fine, the justice or judge shall include in the sentence the amount of the administrative assessment that corresponds with the fine for which the defendant would have been responsible as prescribed by the schedule in this subsection.

2. The provisions of subsection 1 do not apply to:

(a) An ordinance regulating metered parking; or
(b) An ordinance which is specifically designated as imposing a civil penalty or liability pursuant to NRS 244.3575 or 268.019.

3. The money collected for an administrative assessment must not be deducted from the fine imposed by the justice or judge but must be taxed against the defendant in addition to the fine. The money collected for an administrative assessment must be stated separately on the court's docket and must be included in the amount posted for bail. If bail is forfeited, the administrative assessment included in the amount posted for bail pursuant to this subsection must be disbursed in the manner set forth in subsection 5 or 6. If the defendant is found not guilty or the charges are dismissed, the money deposited with the court must be returned to the defendant. If the justice or judge cancels a fine because the fine has been determined to be uncollectible, any balance of the fine and the administrative assessment remaining unpaid shall be deemed to be uncollectible and the defendant is not required to pay it. If a fine is determined to be uncollectible, the defendant is not entitled to a refund of the fine or administrative assessment he has paid and the justice or judge shall not recalculate the administrative assessment.

4. If the justice or judge permits the fine and administrative assessment to be paid in installments, the payments must be first applied to the unpaid balance of the administrative assessment. The city treasurer shall distribute partially collected administrative assessments in accordance with the requirements of subsection 5. The county treasurer shall distribute partially collected

2 subsection 6.

3 5. The money collected for administrative assessments in
4 municipal court must be paid by the clerk of the court to the city
5 treasurer on or before the fifth day of each month for the preceding
6 month. The city treasurer shall distribute, on or before the 15th day
7 of that month, the money received in the following amounts for each
8 assessment received:

9 (a) Two dollars to the county treasurer for credit to a special
10 account in the county general fund for the use of the county's
11 juvenile court or for services to juvenile offenders. Any money
12 remaining in the special account after 2 fiscal years must be
13 deposited in the county general fund if it has not been committed for
14 expenditure. The county treasurer shall provide, upon request by a
15 juvenile court, monthly reports of the revenue credited to and
16 expenditures made from the special account.

17 (b) Seven dollars for credit to a special revenue fund for the use
18 of the municipal courts. Any money remaining in the special
19 revenue fund after 2 fiscal years must be deposited in the municipal
20 general fund if it has not been committed for expenditure. The city
21 treasurer shall provide, upon request by a municipal court, monthly
22 reports of the revenue credited to and expenditures made from the
23 special revenue fund.

24 (c) The remainder of each assessment to the State Controller for
25 credit to a special account in the State General Fund.

26 6. The money collected for administrative assessments in
27 justice courts must be paid by the clerk of the court to the county
28 treasurer on or before the fifth day of each month for the preceding
29 month. The county treasurer shall distribute, on or before the 15th
30 day of that month, the money received in the following amounts for
31 each assessment received:

32 (a) Two dollars for credit to a special account in the county
33 general fund for the use of the county's juvenile court or for services
34 to juvenile offenders. Any money remaining in the special account
35 after 2 fiscal years must be deposited in the county general fund if it
36 has not been committed for expenditure. The county treasurer shall
37 provide, upon request by a juvenile court, monthly reports of the
38 revenue credited to and expenditures made from the special account.

39 (b) Seven dollars for credit to a special revenue fund for the use
40 of the justice courts. Any money remaining in the special revenue
41 fund after 2 fiscal years must be deposited in the county general
42 fund if it has not been committed for expenditure. The county
43 treasurer shall provide, upon request by a justice court, monthly
44 reports of the revenue credited to and expenditures made from the
45 special revenue fund.



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1 (c) The remainder of each assessment to the State Controller for
2 credit to a special account in the State General Fund.

3 7. The money apportioned to a juvenile court, a justice court or
4 a municipal court pursuant to this section must be used, in addition
5 to providing services to juvenile offenders in the juvenile court, to
6 improve the operations of the court, or to acquire appropriate
7 advanced technology or the use of such technology, or both. Money
8 used to improve the operations of the court may include
9 expenditures for:

- 10 (a) Training and education of personnel;
- 11 (b) Acquisition of capital goods;
- 12 (c) Management and operational studies; or
- 13 (d) Audits.

14 8. Of the total amount deposited in the State General Fund
15 pursuant to subsections 5 and 6, the State Controller shall distribute
16 the money received to the following public agencies in the
17 following manner:

18 (a) Not less than 51 percent to the Office of Court Administrator
19 for allocation as follows:

20 (1) Eighteen and one-half percent of the amount distributed
21 to the Office of Court Administrator for the administration of the
22 courts.

23 (2) Nine percent of the amount distributed to the Office of
24 Court Administrator for the development of a uniform system for
25 judicial records.

26 (3) Nine percent of the amount distributed to the Office of
27 Court Administrator for continuing judicial education.

28 (4) ~~Sixty~~ Forty-eight percent of the amount distributed to
29 the Office of Court Administrator for the Supreme Court.

30 (5) Three and one-half percent of the amount distributed to
31 the Office of Court Administrator for the payment for the services of
32 retired justices and retired district judges.

33 ~~(6) Twelve percent of the amount distributed to the Office
34 of Court Administrator for the provision of specialty court
35 programs.~~

36 (b) Not more than 49 percent must be used to the extent of
37 legislative authorization for the support of:

38 (1) The Central Repository for Nevada Records of Criminal
39 History;

40 (2) The Peace Officers' Standards and Training Commission;

41 (3) The operation by the Nevada Highway Patrol of a
42 computerized switching system for information related to law
43 enforcement;

44 (4) The Fund for the Compensation of Victims of Crime; and

45 (5) The Advisory Council for Prosecuting Attorneys.



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1 9. As used in this section:

2 (a) "Juvenile court" has the meaning ascribed to it in
3 NRS 62A.180.

4 (b) "Office of Court Administrator" means the Office of Court
5 Administrator created pursuant to NRS 1.320.

6 **Sec. 2.** NRS 1.360 is hereby amended to read as follows:

7 1.360 Under the direction of the Supreme Court, the Court
8 Administrator shall:

9 1. Examine the administrative procedures employed in the
10 offices of the judges, clerks, court reporters and employees of all
11 courts of this State and make recommendations, through the Chief
12 Justice, for the improvement of those procedures;

13 2. Examine the condition of the dockets of the courts and
14 determine the need for assistance by any court;

15 3. Make recommendations to and carry out the directions of the
16 Chief Justice relating to the assignment of district judges where
17 district courts are in need of assistance;

18 4. Develop a uniform system for collecting and compiling
19 statistics and other data regarding the operation of the State Court
20 System and transmit that information to the Supreme Court so that
21 proper action may be taken in respect thereto;

22 5. Prepare and submit a budget of state appropriations
23 necessary for the maintenance and operation of the State Court
24 System and make recommendations in respect thereto;

25 6. Develop procedures for accounting, internal auditing,
26 procurement and disbursement for the State Court System;

27 7. Collect statistical and other data and make reports relating to
28 the expenditure of all public money for the maintenance and
29 operation of the State Court System and the offices connected
30 therewith;

31 8. Compile statistics from the information required to be
32 maintained by the clerks of the district courts pursuant to NRS 3.275
33 and make reports as to the cases filed in the district courts;

34 9. Formulate and submit to the Supreme Court
35 recommendations of policies or proposed legislation for the
36 improvement of the State Court System;

37 10. On or before January 1 of each year, submit to the Director
38 of the Legislative Counsel Bureau a written report compiling the
39 information submitted to the Court Administrator pursuant to NRS
40 3.243, 4.175 and 5.045 during the immediately preceding fiscal
41 year;

42 11. On or before January 1 of each odd-numbered year, submit
43 to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau a written report
44 concerning:



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1 (a) The distribution of money deposited in the special account
2 created pursuant to NRS 176.0613 to assist with funding and
3 establishing specialty court programs;

4 (b) The current status of any specialty court programs to which
5 money from the account was allocated since the last report; and

6 (c) Such other related information as the Court Administrator
7 deems appropriate;

8 12. On or before February 15 of each odd-numbered year,
9 submit to the Governor and to the Director of the Legislative
10 Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the next regular session of the
11 Legislature a written report compiling the information submitted by
12 clerks of courts to the Court Administrator pursuant to NRS 630.307
13 and 633.533 which includes only aggregate information for
14 statistical purposes and excludes any identifying information related
15 to a particular person;

16 13. On or before February 15 ~~[of each odd numbered year,]~~,
17 **2007**, submit to the Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for
18 transmittal to the next regular session of the Legislature a written
19 report concerning the effectiveness of participation in counseling
20 sessions in a program for the treatment of persons who commit
21 domestic violence ordered by a court pursuant to NRS 200.485 and
22 the effect of such counseling sessions on recidivism of the offenders
23 who commit battery which constitutes domestic violence pursuant to
24 NRS 33.018; and

25 14. Attend to such other matters as may be assigned by the
26 Supreme Court or prescribed by law.

27 **Sec. 3.** Section 3 of chapter 162, Statutes of Nevada 2005, at
28 page 536, is hereby amended to read as follows:

29 Sec. 3. The report submitted to the Legislature by the
30 Court Administrator in 2007 ~~and 2009~~ pursuant to
31 subsection 13 of NRS 1.360, as amended by this act, must
32 include information concerning the effectiveness of biweekly
33 counseling sessions and the effect, if any, of participating in
34 biweekly counseling sessions on recidivism of offenders.

35 **Sec. 4.** (Deleted by amendment.)

36 **Sec. 5.** 1. This section and sections 2, 3 and 4 of this act
37 become effective upon passage and approval.

38 2. Section 1 of this act becomes effective on July 1, 2008.



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
