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ASSEMBLY CONCURRENT RESOLUTION—Encouraging the Department of Health and Human Services to take certain actions concerning chronic obstructive pulmonary disease.

1        WHEREAS, Chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD),  
2 which includes chronic bronchitis and emphysema, is the fourth  
3 leading cause of death in the United States, affecting one in four  
4 Americans over the age of 45; and

5        WHEREAS, COPD is a chronic progressive disease that affects  
6 over 89,000 Nevadans and impacts nearly 24 million Americans;

1        WHEREAS, Statistics reveal that COPD accounts for one death  
2 every 4 minutes in the United States each year and is one of the  
3 leading causes of disability; and

4        WHEREAS, In 2004, the cost to the nation for COPD was  
5 approximately \$37.2 billion, including \$20.9 billion in direct health  
6 care expenditures, \$7.4 billion in indirect morbidity costs and \$8.9  
7 billion in indirect mortality costs; and

8        WHEREAS, Early diagnosis and management of COPD can  
9 effectively reduce the overall financial burden of the illness within  
10 public programs such as Medicaid; and

11      WHEREAS, Proper treatment of COPD can lead to improved  
12 quality of life and self-sufficiency on the part of patients who  
13 receive care within public programs; and

14      WHEREAS, COPD is a chronic disease suitable for inclusion in  
15 programs for the management of diseases; and

16      WHEREAS, The National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute of the  
17 National Institutes of Health of the United States Department of  
18 Health and Human Services launched a public outreach campaign  
19 titled "Learn More Breathe Better" to increase awareness and  
20 understanding of COPD and its risk factors and to underscore the  
21 benefits of early detection and treatment in slowing the disease and  
22 improving the quality of life; now, therefore, be it

23      RESOLVED BY THE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, THE  
24 SENATE CONCURRING, That the Nevada Legislature hereby  
25 encourages the Department of Health and Human Services to  
26 recognize the importance of early diagnosis and treatment of  
27 persons with COPD and those at greatest risk for the disease; and be  
28 it further

29      RESOLVED, That the Nevada Legislature further encourages the  
30 Department of Health and Human Services to increase awareness  
31 and understanding of COPD through the promotion and support of  
32 the COPD campaign recently launched by the National Heart, Lung,  
33 and Blood Institute; and be it further

34      RESOLVED, That the Chief Clerk of the Assembly prepare and  
35 transmit a copy of this resolution to the Director of the Department  
36 of Health and Human Services.
