

SENATE BILL NO. 108—SENATOR BEERS

FEBRUARY 19, 2007

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Referred to Committee on Finance

SUMMARY—Provides for the use of zero-based budgeting in the state budget process. (BDR 31-476)

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AN ACT relating to the state budget process; providing for the use of zero-based budgeting in preparing the proposed budgets of a portion of the Executive Department of the State Government each biennium; requiring the Chief of the Budget Division of the Department of Administration to adopt certain regulations to carry out zero-based budgeting; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 **Section 1** of this bill amends the State Budget Act by providing that the  
2 Governor must require approximately 20 percent of the departments, institutions  
3 and agencies of the Executive Department of the State Government each biennium  
4 to prepare their proposed budgets using zero-based budgeting, which is a method of  
5 determining the budget of a department, institution or agency pursuant to which: (1)  
6 the budget of the department, institution or agency for the biennium immediately  
7 preceding the biennium covered by the budget is deemed to have been zero; and (2)  
8 each proposed expenditure for the biennium covered by the budget must be  
9 justified as if it were a new expenditure. **Section 1** also requires the Chief of the  
10 Budget Division of the Department of Administration to: (1) adopt regulations to  
11 provide appropriate instructions and guidance to departments, institutions and  
12 agencies that are required to use zero-based budgeting; and (2) provide necessary  
13 technical assistance to those departments, institutions and agencies to enable them  
14 to complete their budgetary requests in a timely and efficient manner.



THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** Chapter 353 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3       1. *The Governor shall, for each biennium to be covered by a*  
4 *proposed state budget, require the proposed budgets of*  
5 *approximately 20 percent of the departments, institutions and*  
6 *agencies of the Executive Department of the State Government to*  
7 *be prepared using zero-based budgeting.*

8       2. *No department, institution or agency of the Executive*  
9 *Department may be required pursuant to this section to have its*  
10 *proposed budget prepared using zero-based budgeting more often*  
11 *than once every 10 years.*

12       3. *The Chief shall provide to a department, institution or*  
13 *agency of the Executive Department that is required pursuant to*  
14 *this section to have its proposed budget prepared using zero-based*  
15 *budgeting such technical assistance as is necessary to enable the*  
16 *department, institution or agency to complete its budgetary*  
17 *requests in a timely and efficient manner as determined by the*  
18 *Chief.*

19       4. *The Chief shall adopt such regulations as he determines*  
20 *are necessary to provide appropriate instructions and guidance to*  
21 *departments, institutions and agencies of the Executive*  
22 *Department in carrying out the provisions of this section.*

23       5. *As used in this section, “zero-based budgeting” means a*  
24 *method of determining the budget of a department, institution or*  
25 *agency pursuant to which:*

26       (a) *The budget of the department, institution or agency for the*  
27 *biennium immediately preceding the biennium covered by the*  
28 *budget is deemed to have been zero; and*

29       (b) *Each proposed expenditure for the biennium covered by*  
30 *the budget must be justified as if it were a new expenditure.*

31       **Sec. 2.** NRS 353.150 is hereby amended to read as follows:

32       353.150 NRS 353.150 to 353.246, inclusive, *and section 1 of*  
33 *this act* may be cited as the State Budget Act.

34       **Sec. 3.** NRS 353.155 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35       353.155 As used in NRS 353.150 to 353.246, inclusive, *and*  
36 *section 1 of this act*, “Chief” means the Chief of the Budget  
37 Division of the Department of Administration.

38       **Sec. 4.** NRS 353.246 is hereby amended to read as follows:

39       353.246 1. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 2 of  
40 this section and subsection 6 of NRS 353.210, the provisions of  
41 NRS 353.150 to 353.245, inclusive, *and section 1 of this act* do not  
42 apply to agencies, bureaus, commissions and officers of the



1 Legislative Department, the Public Employees' Retirement System  
2 and the Judicial Department of the State Government.  
3 2. The Legislative Department, the Public Employees'  
4 Retirement System and the Judicial Department of the State  
5 Government shall submit their budgets to the Legislature in the  
6 same format as the proposed executive budget unless otherwise  
7 provided by the Legislative Commission. All projections of revenue  
8 and any other information concerning future state revenue contained  
9 in those budgets must be based upon the projections and estimates  
10 prepared by the Economic Forum pursuant to NRS 353.228.

**Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2009.
