## SENATE BILL NO. 13-SENATOR CARE

# PREFILED JANUARY 16, 2007

#### Referred to Committee on Government Affairs

SUMMARY—Restricts local governments from enacting or enforcing certain local laws which regulate signs held, carried or displayed by persons on public sidewalks on the basis of content or viewpoint. (BDR 19-123)

EXPLANATION – Matter in **bolded italics** is new; matter between brackets [omitted material] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to local government; restricting local governments from enacting or enforcing certain local laws which regulate signs held, carried or displayed by persons on public sidewalks on the basis of content or viewpoint; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

## **Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, local governments may enact and enforce local ordinances and regulations which regulate the conduct of persons on public sidewalks. (NRS 244.357, 266.275, 266.277, 267.110, 268.815, 269.185; Caliente City Charter §§ 2.200, 2.210; Carlin City Charter §§ 2.210, 2.230; Carson City Charter §§ 2.130, 2.230, 2.250; Elko City Charter §§ 2.250, 2.260; Henderson City Charter §§ 2.200, 2.210; Las Vegas City Charter §§ 2.220, 2.230; North Las Vegas City Charter §§ 2.200, 2.210; Reno City Charter §§ 2.110; Sparks City Charter §§ 2.090; Wells City Charter §§ 2.210, 2.230; Yerington City Charter §§ 2.200, 2.210)

**Section 1** of this bill provides that if a local government intends to enact or enforce a local ordinance or regulation which prohibits a person on a public sidewalk from holding, carrying or displaying a sign, or which otherwise restricts, limits or regulates such conduct on a public sidewalk, the local ordinance or regulation must apply uniformly to all signs and must not discriminate on the basis of the content of the sign or the viewpoint, beliefs or purpose of the person holding, carrying or displaying the sign. **Sections 2-27** of this bill amend various statutes and city charters to reflect this limitation on a local government's regulatory powers over public sidewalks.

# THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

**Section 1.** Chapter 237 of NRS is hereby amended by adding thereto a new section to read as follows:

- 1. A local government shall not enact or enforce any ordinance or regulation which prohibits a person who is on a public sidewalk from holding, carrying or displaying a sign on or about the person's body, or which otherwise restricts, limits or regulates such conduct, unless the ordinance or regulation applies uniformly to all signs and does not discriminate on the basis of:
  - (a) The content of the sign; or

(b) The viewpoint, beliefs or purpose of the person holding, carrying or displaying the sign.

- 2. For the purposes of this section, a sign is held, carried or displayed "on or about a person's body" if the sign is held, carried or displayed:
- (a) On the person's body or within reasonably close proximity to the person's body; and
- (b) In such a manner as to not pose a substantial threat to the safety of pedestrians or vehicles.
  - As used in this section:
- (a) "Public sidewalk" means that portion of a highway or roadway which lies between the curb lines or lateral lines of the highway or roadway and the adjacent property lines and which is designed or intended for the use of pedestrians. The term includes, without limitation:
  - (1) Crosswalks, medians and traffic islands; and
- (2) Private property upon which a limited easement of 27 public access has been granted.
  - (b) "Sign" means any structure, device or display, including, without limitation, a banner, flag, billboard, bulletin, notice, placard or poster, which:
  - (1) Is designed, intended or used to express ideas, opinions, viewpoints or messages or to advertise, inform or call attention to any thing, person, business, activity or place; and
- (2) Is capable of being held, carried or displayed by a 34 35 person:
  - (I) On the person's body or within reasonably close proximity to the person's body; and
  - (II) In such a manner as to not pose a substantial threat to the safety of pedestrians or vehicles.





- **Sec. 2.** NRS 244.357 is hereby amended to read as follows:

- **Sec. 27.** Section 2.210 of the Charter of the City of Yerington, being chapter 465, Statutes of Nevada 1971, at page 907, as last amended by chapter 237, Statutes of Nevada 2003, at page 1255, is hereby amended to read as follows:
  - Sec. 2.210 Powers of City Council: Traffic control. The City Council may, by ordinance, regulate:
  - 1. Except as otherwise provided in NRS 707.375 [,] and section 1 of this act, all vehicular, pedestrian and other traffic within the City and provide generally for the public safety on public streets and rights-of-way, publicly owned parking lots and parking areas to which the public is invited.
  - 2. The length of time for which vehicles may be parked upon the public streets and publicly owned parking lots.
