

**SENATE BILL NO. 151—COMMITTEE ON  
HUMAN RESOURCES AND EDUCATION**

**(ON BEHALF OF THE WASHOE COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT)**

**FEBRUARY 26, 2007**

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions governing school schedules.  
(BDR 34-444)

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**AN ACT** relating to education; revising the circumstances under which larger school districts may apply to the Superintendent of Public Instruction for an alternative school schedule; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1 Existing law requires school districts to provide at least 180 days of school in a  
2 school year. A school district in a county whose population is less than 100,000  
3 (currently counties other than Clark and Washoe Counties) may apply to the  
4 Superintendent of Public Instruction for an alternative school schedule if the  
5 number of minutes of instruction provided under the alternative schedule is equal to  
6 or greater than the number of minutes provided in 180 school days. A school  
7 district in a county whose population is 100,000 or more (currently Clark and  
8 Washoe Counties) may apply for an alternative school schedule if the schedule will  
9 apply only to a rural or remote portion of the county in which the school district is  
10 located. (NRS 388.090) This bill expands the circumstances under which a school  
11 district in a county whose population is 100,000 or more may apply for an  
12 alternative schedule to include an alternative schedule that is designed solely for the  
13 purpose of providing professional development for educational personnel.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1       **Section 1.** NRS 388.090 is hereby amended to read as follows:  
2        388.090 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section,  
3       boards of trustees of school districts shall schedule and provide a  
4       minimum of 180 days of free school in the districts under their  
5       charge.  
6       2. Except for an alternative schedule described in subsection 3,  
7       the Superintendent of Public Instruction may, upon application by  
8       the board of trustees of a school district, authorize the school district  
9       to provide a program of instruction based on an alternative schedule  
10      if the number of minutes of instruction to be provided is equal to or  
11      greater than the number of minutes of instruction that would be  
12      provided in a program of instruction consisting of 180 school days.  
13      The Superintendent of Public Instruction shall notify the board of  
14      trustees of the school district of the approval or denial of the  
15      application not later than 30 days after the Superintendent of Public  
16      Instruction receives the application. An alternative schedule  
17      proposed pursuant to this subsection must be developed in  
18      accordance with chapter 288 of NRS. If a school district is located  
19      in a county whose population is 100,000 or more, the **board of**  
20      **trustees of the** school district may not submit an application  
21      pursuant to this subsection unless the proposed alternative schedule  
22      of the school district ~~will~~:

23       (a) **Will** apply only to a rural portion or a remote portion of the  
24       county in which the school district is located, as defined by the State  
25       Board pursuant to subsection 9 ~~H~~; or

26       (b) *Is designed solely for the purpose of providing regular  
27       professional development to educational personnel and such  
28       professional development is focused on analyzing and discussing  
29       measures of the performance of pupils and identifying appropriate  
30       instructional strategies to improve the achievement of pupils.*

31       3. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may, upon  
32       application by the board of trustees of a school district, authorize a  
33       reduction of not more than 15 school days in that particular district  
34       to establish or maintain an alternative schedule consisting of a  
35       12-month school program if the board of trustees demonstrates that  
36       the proposed alternative schedule for the program provides for a  
37       number of minutes of instruction that is equal to or greater than that  
38       which would be provided under a program consisting of 180 school  
39       days. Before authorizing a reduction in the number of required  
40       school days pursuant to this subsection, the Superintendent of Public  
41       Instruction must find that the proposed alternative schedule will be



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1 used to alleviate problems associated with a growth in enrollment or  
2 overcrowding.

3       4. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may, upon  
4 application by a board of trustees, authorize the addition of minutes  
5 of instruction to any scheduled day of free school if days of free  
6 school are lost because of any interscholastic activity. Not more than  
7 5 days of free school so lost may be rescheduled in this manner. The  
8 provisions of this subsection do not apply to an alternative schedule  
9 approved pursuant to subsection 2.

10      5. The number of minutes of instruction required for a  
11 particular group of pupils in a program of instruction based on an  
12 alternative schedule approved pursuant to this section must be  
13 determined by multiplying the appropriate minimum daily period of  
14 instruction established by the State Board by regulation for that  
15 particular group of pupils by 180.

16      6. Each school district shall schedule at least 3 contingent days  
17 of school, or its equivalent if the school district operates under an  
18 alternative schedule authorized pursuant to this section, in addition  
19 to the number of days required by this section, which must be used  
20 if a natural disaster, inclement weather or an accident necessitates  
21 the closing of a majority of the facilities within the district. The 3  
22 contingent days of school, or its equivalent, may be scheduled as:

23       (a) Full days of school;

24       (b) An equivalent number of minutes of instruction added to any  
25 scheduled day of instruction, except that the minutes added must not  
26 be less than 30 minutes per school day; or

27       (c) Any combination thereof.

28      7. If more than 3 days of free school or minutes of instruction  
29 equaling 3 days of free school, or the equivalent if the school district  
30 operates under an alternative schedule authorized pursuant to this  
31 section, are lost because a natural disaster, inclement weather or an  
32 accident necessitates the closing of a majority of the facilities within  
33 a school district, the Superintendent of Public Instruction, upon  
34 application by the school district, may permit the additional days or  
35 equivalent minutes of instruction lost to be counted as school days  
36 in session. The application must be submitted in the manner  
37 prescribed by the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

38      8. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may, upon  
39 application by the board of trustees of a school district, authorize  
40 additional days or minutes of instruction for a program of remedial  
41 education that is fully paid for through the school district, including,  
42 without limitation, the provision of transportation. If the  
43 Superintendent of Public Instruction authorizes such additional days  
44 or minutes, the board of trustees may adopt a policy prescribing the  
45 minimum number of days of attendance or the minimum number of



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1 minutes of attendance for a pupil who is determined to need such  
2 remedial education. If the board of trustees adopts such a policy, the  
3 policy must include, without limitation, the criteria for determining  
4 that a pupil be enrolled in the program of remedial education, the  
5 procedure pursuant to which parents and guardians will be notified  
6 of the pupil's progress throughout the school year and a process for  
7 appealing a determination regarding a pupil's need for remedial  
8 education.

9       9. The State Board shall adopt regulations:

10      (a) Providing procedures for changing schedules of instruction  
11 to be used if a natural disaster, inclement weather or an accident  
12 necessitates the closing of a particular school within a school  
13 district.

14      (b) Defining a rural portion of a county and a remote portion of  
15 a county for the purposes of subsection 2.

16       **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.

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
