

SENATE BILL NO. 159—COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND LABOR

FEBRUARY 26, 2007

SUMMARY—Revises provisions governing collection agencies.
(BDR 54-541)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets [~~omitted material~~] is material to be omitted.

AN ACT relating to collection agencies; removing an exemption related to licensing for certain foreign collection agencies; revising certain qualifications for licensure as a collection agency or collection agent; limiting the activities of certain foreign collection agencies; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

1 Existing law exempts certain persons from obtaining a collection agency
2 license in Nevada if certain conditions are met. (NRS 649.075) **Section 1** of this
3 bill removes that exemption and requires all such persons to either register as a
4 foreign collection agency or obtain a regular license.

5 Existing law requires each applicant for a license as a collection agency or
6 collection agent to submit proof of certain information to the Commissioner of
7 Financial Institutions, including, without limitation, proof that the applicant will
8 maintain one or more offices in this State for the transaction of the business of his
9 collection agency. (NRS 649.085) **Section 1.5** of this act allows the applicant to
10 satisfy this requirement by submitting proof that the applicant will maintain one or
11 more such offices in another state.

12 **Section 2** of this bill removes the requirement that a person must hold a license
13 in another state in order to be registered as a foreign collection agency in Nevada.
14 (NRS 649.171)

15 Existing law states that a registered foreign collection agency must annually
16 submit proof that it will not solicit business in this State. (NRS 649.171) **Section 2**
17 of this bill adds the requirement that such an agency also must submit annually
18 proof that it will not respond to any bids, proposals or invitations for business in
19 this State under certain circumstances. **Section 2** also limits the activities of such an
20 agency to collecting from residents of this State on behalf of residents of another
21 state.



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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** NRS 649.075 is hereby amended to read as follows:

2 649.075 1. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a
3 person shall not conduct within this State a collection agency or
4 engage within this State in the business of collecting claims for
5 others, or of soliciting the right to collect or receive payment for
6 another of any claim, or advertise ~~H~~ or solicit, either in print, by
7 letter, in person or otherwise, the right to collect or receive payment
8 for another of any claim, or seek to make collection or obtain
9 payment of any claim on behalf of another without having first
10 applied for and obtained a license from the Commissioner.

11 ~~2. [A person is not required to obtain a license if:~~

12 ~~(a) The collection agency he works for is located outside of this~~
~~State;~~

13 ~~(b) His activities in this State are limited to the collection of~~
14 ~~claims from residents of this State on behalf of residents of another~~
15 ~~state; and~~

16 ~~(c) His contact with persons in this State is limited to interstate~~
17 ~~communications by telephone, mail or facsimile.~~

18 ~~3.]~~ A person is not required to obtain a license if the person
19 holds a certificate of registration as a foreign collection agency
20 issued by the Commissioner pursuant to NRS 649.171.

21 **Sec. 1.5.** NRS 649.085 is hereby amended to read as follows:

22 649.085 Every individual applicant, every officer and director
23 of a corporate applicant, and every member of a firm or partnership
24 applicant for a license as a collection agency or collection agent
25 must submit proof satisfactory to the Commissioner that he:

26 1. Is a citizen of the United States or lawfully entitled to
27 remain and work in the United States.

28 2. Has a good reputation for honesty, trustworthiness and
29 integrity and is competent to transact the business of a collection
30 agency in a manner which protects the interests of the general
31 public.

32 3. Has not had a collection agency license suspended or
33 revoked within the 10 years immediately preceding the date of the
34 application.

35 4. Has not been convicted of, or entered a plea of nolo
36 contendere to:

37 (a) A felony relating to the practice of collection agencies or
38 collection agents; or

39 (b) Any crime involving fraud, misrepresentation or moral
40 turpitude.



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1 5. Has not made a false statement of material fact on his
2 application.

3 6. Will maintain one or more offices in this State **or one or**
4 **more offices in another state** for the transaction of the business of
5 his collection agency.

6 7. Has established a plan to ensure that his collection agency
7 will provide the services of a collection agency adequately and
8 efficiently.

9 **Sec. 2.** NRS 649.171 is hereby amended to read as follows:

10 649.171 1. A person who is not licensed in this State as a
11 collection agency may apply to the Commissioner for a certificate of
12 registration as a foreign collection agency.

13 2. To be issued and to hold a certificate of registration as a
14 foreign collection agency, a person:

15 (a) ~~Must hold a license or permit to do business as a collection~~
16 ~~agency in another state;~~

17 ~~(b)~~ Must meet the qualifications to do business as a collection
18 agency in this State;

19 ~~(c)~~ (b) Must not have any employees or agents present in this
20 State who engage in the collection of claims and must not maintain
21 any business locations in this State as a collection agency;

22 ~~(d)~~ (c) Must submit proof to the Commissioner, upon
23 application and upon each annual renewal of the ~~certificate~~
24 **certificate** of registration, that the person and his employees and
25 agents will not, in this State:

26 (1) Engage in the business of soliciting the right to collect or
27 receive payment for another of any claim; ~~or~~

28 (2) **Respond to a bid, proposal or invitation for the right to**
29 **collect or receive payment for another of any claim, unless the bid,**
30 **proposal or invitation is for the collection of claims owed by**
31 **residents of another state; or**

32 (3) Advertise or solicit, either in print, by letter, in person or
33 otherwise, the right to collect or receive payment for another of any
34 claim;

35 ~~(d)~~ (d) When collecting claims against debtors who are
36 present in this State, must:

37 (1) Limit his activities and those of his employees and agents
38 to interstate communications by telephone, mail or facsimile; ~~and~~

39 (2) **Limit his activities and those of his employees and**
40 **agents to the collection of claims from residents of this State on**
41 **behalf of residents of another state; and**

42 (3) Comply with the requirements of NRS 649.305 to
43 649.375, inclusive, with regard to his activities and those of his
44 employees and agents;

45 ~~(e)~~ (e) Must pay:



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1 (1) A fee to apply for a certificate of registration of not less
2 than \$200 and not more than \$600, prorated on the basis of the
3 registration year as determined by the Commissioner; and

4 (2) An annual renewal fee of not more than \$200;

5 ~~(e)~~ (f) Must deposit and maintain a bond or an appropriate
6 substitute for the bond in the same manner as an applicant or
7 licensee pursuant to NRS 649.105, 649.115 and 649.119;

8 ~~(f)~~ (g) Must maintain his accounts, books and records in
9 accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and in
10 accordance with the requirements of subsection 1 of NRS 649.335;
11 and

12 ~~(f)~~ (h) Must pay any fees related to any examination of his
13 accounts, books and records conducted by the Commissioner
14 pursuant to subsection 3.

15 3. The Commissioner may conduct an annual examination and
16 any additional examinations pursuant to NRS 649.335 of the
17 accounts, books and records of each person who holds a certificate
18 of registration as a foreign collection agency.

19 4. The Commissioner may take disciplinary action pursuant to
20 NRS 649.385, 649.390 and 649.395 against a person who holds a
21 certificate of registration as a foreign collection agency for any act
22 or omission that would be grounds for taking such disciplinary
23 action under those sections.

24 5. The Commissioner shall adopt:

25 (a) Regulations establishing the amount of the fees required
26 pursuant to this section; and

27 (b) Any other regulations as may be necessary to carry out the
28 provisions of this section.

29 **Sec. 3.** 1. This section and sections 1.5 and 2 of this act
30 become effective upon passage and approval.

31 2. Section 1 of this act becomes effective on January 1, 2008.

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
