SUMMARY—Creates the Nevada Academy of Health.  
(BDR 40-952)

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AN ACT relating to health; creating the Nevada Academy of Health; prescribing its powers and duties; creating the governing body of the Academy; prescribing its powers and duties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

1      **Section 5** of this bill creates the Nevada Academy of Health. **Section 6** of this  
2      bill establishes the duties of the Academy, including studying issues relating to  
3      health care in this State and establishing standards and goals concerning the  
4      provision of such health care. **Section 7** of this bill creates the governing body of  
5      the Academy. **Section 8** of this bill prescribes the powers and duties of the  
6      governing body. **Section 9** of this bill establishes the requirements for the use of  
7      money received by the Academy. **Section 10** of this bill authorizes the Academy to  
8      accept gifts, grants and donations of money from any source. **Section 11** of this bill  
9      provides for the appointment of the members of the governing body of the  
10     Academy to specific terms of office.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1      **Section 1.** Title 40 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new chapter to consist of the provisions set forth as  
3 sections 2 to 10, inclusive, of this act.

4      **Sec. 2.** *As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise  
5 requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3 and 4 of this  
6 act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.*

7      **Sec. 3.** *"Academy" means the Nevada Academy of Health.*

8      **Sec. 4.** *"Governing body" means the governing body of the  
9 Academy.*

10     **Sec. 5.** *The Nevada Academy of Health is hereby created.  
11 Each public or private agency or nonprofit or for-profit  
12 organization that provides education or training for providers of  
13 health care or conducts medical research or clinical studies in this  
14 State may participate as a member of the Academy if the agency or  
15 organization agrees with the standards and goals established by  
16 the Academy.*

17     **Sec. 6.** *The Academy shall:*

18        1. *Study issues relating to health care in this State, including,  
19 without limitation, medical and clinical research and the  
20 education and training of providers of health care;*

21        2. *Establish standards and goals concerning the provision of  
22 health care which are measurable and regularly evaluated;*

23        3. *Analyze and evaluate data relating to health care that is  
24 created, collected or reviewed by the Department of Health and  
25 Human Services;*

26        4. *Promote cooperation between the public and private  
27 sectors, including the transfer of technology used to provide health  
28 care and the establishment of business partnerships that promote  
29 economic development in this State;*

30        5. *Provide recommendations to the Governor and the  
31 Legislature concerning the establishment of a statewide  
32 biomedical and health research program; and*

33        6. *Before January 1 of each odd-numbered year, prepare and  
34 submit a report to the Governor and to the Director of the  
35 Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal to the Legislature. The  
36 report must include, without limitation, recommendations  
37 concerning the strategic planning required for the improvement of  
38 health care provided in this State.*

39      **Sec. 7. 1.** *The governing body of the Academy consists of  
40 the State Health Officer and nine members who are appointed as  
41 follows:*

42        (a) *Five members appointed by the Governor;*



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1       (b) Two members appointed by the Senate Majority Leader;  
2 and

3       (c) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly.

4       2. The members appointed to the governing body must, to the  
5 extent practicable:

6           (a) Represent agencies and organizations that provide  
7 education or training for providers of health care;

8           (b) Be advocates for the rights of patients;

9           (c) Be recognized academic scholars; or

10          (d) Be members of the general public who have specialized  
11 knowledge and experience that are beneficial to the Academy.

12       3. The Chairman must be elected from among the members  
13 of the governing body.

14       4. After the initial terms, the term of office of a member  
15 of the governing body is 3 years. A vacancy occurring in  
16 the membership of the governing body must be filled for the  
17 remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the  
18 original appointment. A member of the governing body may be  
19 reappointed.

20       5. The State Health Officer is a nonvoting member of the  
21 governing body.

22       6. A majority of the members of the governing body  
23 constitutes a quorum, and a majority of those present must concur  
24 in any decision.

25       Sec. 8. 1. The governing body shall meet regularly at least  
26 three times a year and, within the limits of legislative  
27 appropriations, may hold additional meetings upon the call of the  
28 Chairman.

29       2. Each member of the governing body who is not an  
30 employee of this State or a political subdivision of this State is  
31 entitled to receive a salary of \$80 for each day's attendance at a  
32 meeting of the Academy.

33       3. While engaged in the business of the governing body, each  
34 member is entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel  
35 expenses provided for state officers and employees generally.

36       4. Each member of the governing body who is an officer or  
37 employee of this State or a political subdivision of this State must  
38 be relieved from his duties without loss of his regular  
39 compensation so that he may carry out his duties relating to the  
40 governing body in the most timely manner practicable. A state  
41 agency or a political subdivision of this State shall not require an  
42 officer or employee who is a member of the governing body to:

43           (a) Make up the time he is absent from work to fulfill his  
44 obligations as a member of the governing body; or

45           (b) Take annual leave or compensatory time for the absence.



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1       **5. The governing body may:**

2        (a) Appoint advisory committees if necessary or appropriate to  
3           assist the Academy in carrying out the provisions of this chapter;  
4           and

5        (b) Enter into contracts with such public agencies or private  
6           organizations as it considers necessary or appropriate to assist the  
7           Academy in carrying out the provisions of this chapter.

8        **Sec. 9. 1. Any money received by the Academy must be:**

9        (a) Deposited in the State Treasury and accounted for  
10          separately in the State General Fund; and

11        (b) Used only to carry out the provisions of this chapter.

12        2. The Director of the Department of Health and Human  
13           Services shall administer the account. The interest and income  
14           earned on the money in the account, after deducting any  
15           applicable charges, must be credited to the account.

16        3. The money in the account does not lapse to the State  
17          General Fund at the end of a fiscal year.

18        4. Any claims against the account must be paid as other  
19          claims against the State are paid.

20        **Sec. 10. The Academy may accept gifts, grants and donations**  
21          **of money from any source to carry out the provisions of this**  
22          **chapter.**

23        **Sec. 11. The members of the governing body of the Nevada**  
24          **Academy of Health must be appointed as follows:**

25        1. Three members must be appointed by the Governor to terms  
26          that end on June 30, 2008.

27        2. One member must be appointed by the Governor to a term  
28          that ends on June 30, 2009.

29        3. One member must be appointed by the Senate Majority  
30          Leader to a term that ends on June 30, 2009.

31        4. One member must be appointed by the Speaker of the  
32          Assembly to a term that ends on June 30, 2009.

33        5. One member must be appointed by the Governor to a term  
34          that ends on June 30, 2010.

35        6. One member must be appointed by the Senate Majority  
36          Leader to a term that ends on June 30, 2010.

37        7. One member must be appointed by the Speaker of the  
38          Assembly to a term that ends on June 30, 2010.

39        **Sec. 12. This act becomes effective upon passage and approval**  
40          **for the purpose of appointing the members of the governing body of**  
41          **the Nevada Academy of Health and on July 1, 2007, for all other**  
42          **purposes.**



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
