Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 This bill creates an advisory committee to the Legislative Committee on Health
2 Care, which is established pursuant to NRS 439B.200.

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** Chapter 439B of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:
3 *1. There is hereby established an advisory committee to the*
4 *Committee consisting of 14 members as follows:*
5 *(a) The Director or his designee;*
6 *(b) One member who represents the Nevada System of Higher*
7 *Education appointed by the Board of Regents of the University of*
8 *Nevada;*

- 1 (c) Six members appointed by the Governor;
2 (d) Two members appointed by the Majority Leader of the
3 Senate;
4 (e) Two members appointed by the Speaker of the Assembly;
5 (f) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
6 Senate; and
7 (g) One member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
8 Assembly.

9 2. The Chairman of the advisory committee must be elected
10 from among the members of the advisory committee.

11 3. Each member of the advisory committee who is not an
12 officer or employee of the State serves without compensation and
13 is not entitled to receive a per diem allowance or travel expenses.

14 4. Each member of the advisory committee who is an officer
15 or employee of the State must be relieved from his duties without
16 loss of his regular compensation so that he may attend meetings of
17 the Committee or the advisory committee and is entitled to receive
18 the per diem allowance and travel expenses provided for state
19 officers and employees generally, which must be paid by the state
20 agency that employs him.

21 **Sec. 2.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007, and expires
22 by limitation on June 30, 2009.
