

SENATE BILL NO. 19—COMMITTEE ON COMMERCE AND LABOR

(ON BEHALF OF THE CHIROPRACTIC PHYSICIANS'  
BOARD OF NEVADA)

**SUMMARY**—Revises provisions relating to licenses and certificates issued by the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada. (BDR 54-573)

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EXPLANATION – Matter in ***bolded italics*** is new; matter between brackets **[omitted material]** is material to be omitted.

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AN ACT relating to the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada; providing requirements for the reinstatement of certain licenses that have been suspended; revising provisions governing the renewal of a license or certificate; increasing the number of hours of continuing education required for the renewal of a license; eliminating the requirement that the Board file certain orders relating to the discipline of a licensee with the county recorder; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

**Legislative Counsel's Digest:**

Under existing law, a license or certificate issued by the Chiropractic Physicians' Board of Nevada must be renewed annually and a licensee must complete at least 12 hours of continuing education annually. (NRS 634.130) **Section 2** of this bill revises the renewal requirement for a license or certificate to provide that a license or certificate must be renewed biennially. **Section 2** also increases the number of hours of continuing education a licensee must complete. **Section 3** of this bill revises the fee schedule for the renewal of a license or certificate to reflect the renewal of a license or certificate biennially.

Existing law also provides that if a licensee or holder of a certificate does not renew a license or certificate on time or fails to notify the Board of a change in the location of the office of the licensee or holder, the license or certificate of the person will be automatically suspended. (NRS 634.130) **Section 2** of this bill



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13 provides that a license that was suspended for the failure to renew on time or the  
14 failure to notify the Board of a change in location may be reinstated by paying the  
15 reinstatement and renewal fees within 1 year of the original renewal deadline.  
16 **Section 1** of this bill provides for the reinstatement of suspended licenses that have  
17 not been reinstated within 1 year.

18 Existing law provides that every order of the Board which limits the practice of  
19 chiropractic or suspends or revokes a license must be filed with the county  
20 recorder. (NRS 634.200) **Section 4** of this bill eliminates this requirement.

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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN  
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 **Section 1.** Chapter 634 of NRS is hereby amended by adding  
2 thereto a new section to read as follows:

3     *1. If a license has been automatically suspended pursuant to  
4 the provisions of subsection 5 of NRS 634.130 and not reinstated  
5 pursuant to the provisions of that subsection, the person who held  
6 the license may apply to the Board to have the license reinstated to  
7 either active status or inactive status.*

8     *2. An applicant to have a suspended license reinstated to  
9 active status pursuant to subsection 1 must:*

10         *(a) Submit satisfactory evidence to the Board that he has  
11 maintained an active practice in another state, territory or country  
12 within the preceding 5 years;*

13         *(b) Submit satisfactory evidence to the Board from all other  
14 licensing agencies which have issued him a license that he is in  
15 good standing and has no legal actions pending against him;*

16         *(c) Submit satisfactory evidence to the Board that he has  
17 participated in a program of continuing education in accordance  
18 with NRS 634.130 for the year in which he seeks to be reinstated  
19 to active status;*

20         *(d) Score 75 percent or higher on an examination prescribed  
21 by the Board on the provisions of this chapter and the regulations  
22 adopted by the Board; and*

23         *(e) Pay:*

24             *(1) The fee for the biennial renewal of a license to practice  
25 chiropractic;*

26             *(2) The fee for reinstating a license to practice chiropractic  
27 which has been suspended or revoked; and*

28             *(3) The fee for the biennial renewal of an inactive license to  
29 practice chiropractic, on a pro rata basis, for each year during  
30 which the license was suspended.*

31     *3. If any of the requirements set forth in subsection 2 are not  
32 met by an applicant for the reinstatement of a suspended license to  
33 active status, the Board, before reinstating the license of the  
34 applicant to active status:*



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1       (a) Must hold a hearing to determine the professional  
2 competency and fitness of the applicant; and

3       (b) May require the applicant to:

4           (1) Pass the Special Purposes Examination for  
5 Chiropractic prepared by the National Board of Chiropractic  
6 Examiners; and

7           (2) Satisfy any additional requirements that the Board  
8 deems to be necessary.

9       4. An applicant to have a suspended license reinstated to  
10 inactive status pursuant to subsection 1 must:

11           (a) Submit satisfactory evidence to the Board that he has  
12 maintained an active practice in another state, territory or country  
13 within the preceding 5 years;

14           (b) Submit satisfactory evidence to the Board from all other  
15 licensing agencies which have issued him a license that he is in  
16 good standing and has no legal actions pending against him;

17           (c) Score 75 percent or higher on an examination prescribed  
18 by the Board on the provisions of this chapter and the regulations  
19 adopted by the Board; and

20           (d) Pay:

21              (1) The fee for reinstating a license to practice chiropractic  
22 which has been suspended or revoked; and

23              (2) The fee for the biennial renewal of an inactive license to  
24 practice chiropractic, on a pro rata basis, for each year during  
25 which the license was suspended.

26       5. If any of the requirements set forth in subsection 4 are not  
27 met by an applicant for the reinstatement of a suspended license to  
28 inactive status, the Board, before reinstating the license of the  
29 applicant to inactive status:

30           (a) Must hold a hearing to determine the professional  
31 competency and fitness of the applicant; and

32           (b) May require the applicant to satisfy any additional  
33 requirements that the Board deems to be necessary.

34       Sec. 2. NRS 634.130 is hereby amended to read as follows:

35       634.130 1. Licenses and certificates must be renewed  
36 ~~annually.~~ biennially. Each person who is licensed pursuant to the  
37 provisions of this chapter must, upon the payment of the required  
38 renewal fee and the submission of all information required to  
39 complete the renewal, be granted a renewal certificate which  
40 authorizes him to continue to practice for ~~1 year.~~ 2 years.

41       2. The renewal fee must be paid and all information required to  
42 complete the renewal must be submitted to the Board on or before  
43 January 1 of ~~the year to which it applies.~~ each odd-numbered  
44 year.



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1       3. Except as otherwise provided in subsection 4, a licensee in  
2 active practice within this State must submit satisfactory proof to the  
3 Board that , *during the 24 months immediately preceding the*  
4 *renewal date of his license*, he has attended at least ~~12~~ 36 hours of  
5 continuing education which is approved or endorsed by the Board.  
6 The educational requirement of this section may be waived by the  
7 Board if the licensee files with the Board a statement of a  
8 chiropractic physician, osteopathic physician or doctor of medicine  
9 certifying that the licensee is suffering from a serious or disabling  
10 illness or physical disability which prevented him from completing  
11 the requirements for continuing education during the ~~12~~ 24 months  
12 immediately preceding the renewal date of his license.

13      4. A licensee is not required to comply with the requirements  
14 of subsection 3 until the ~~calendar~~ *first odd-numbered* year after  
15 the year the Board issues to him an initial license to practice as a  
16 chiropractor in this State.

17      5. If a licensee fails to:

18       (a) Pay his renewal fee by January 1 ~~1~~ *of an odd-numbered*  
19 *year*;

20       (b) Submit proof of continuing education pursuant to  
21 subsection 3;

22       (c) Notify the Board of a change in the location of his office  
23 pursuant to NRS 634.129; or

24       (d) Submit all information required to complete the renewal,  
25 ~~his~~ license is automatically suspended and , *except as otherwise*  
26 *provided in section 1 of this act*, may be reinstated only upon the  
27 payment , *by January 1 of the even-numbered year following the*  
28 *year in which the license was suspended*, of the required fee for  
29 reinstatement in addition to the renewal fee.

30      6. If a holder of a certificate as a chiropractor's assistant fails  
31 to:

32       (a) Pay his renewal fee by January 1 ~~1~~ *of an odd-numbered*  
33 *year*;

34       (b) Notify the Board of a change in the location of his office  
35 pursuant to NRS 634.129; or

36       (c) Submit all information required to complete the renewal,  
37 ~~his~~ certificate is automatically suspended and may be reinstated  
38 only upon the payment of the required fee for reinstatement in  
39 addition to the renewal fee ~~1~~ *for each period of renewal during*  
40 *which the certificate was suspended*.

41      Sec. 3. NRS 634.135 is hereby amended to read as follows:

42       634.135 1. The Board may charge and collect fees not to  
43 exceed:

8        2. In addition to the fees set forth in subsection 1, the Board  
9 may charge and collect reasonable and necessary fees for any other  
10 service it provides.

11        3. For a check or other method of payment made payable to the  
12 Board or tendered to the Board that is returned to the Board or  
13 otherwise dishonored upon presentation for payment, the Board  
14 shall assess and collect a fee in the amount established by the State  
15 Controller pursuant to NRS 353C.115.

16        **Sec. 4.** NRS 634.200 is hereby amended to read as follows:

17        634.200 1. Any person who has been placed on probation or  
18 whose license has been limited, suspended or revoked by the Board  
19 is entitled to judicial review of the Board's order.

20        2. ~~Every order of the Board which limits the practice of  
21 chiropractic or suspends or revokes a license is effective from the  
22 date the Secretary certifies the order to the proper county recorder  
23 until the order is modified or reversed by a final judgment of the  
24 court.~~

25        ~~3.]~~ The district court shall give a petition for judicial review of  
26 the Board's order priority over other civil matters which are not  
27 expressly given that priority by law.

28        **Sec. 5.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.
