

SENATE BILL NO. 239—COMMITTEE ON
HUMAN RESOURCES AND EDUCATION

(ON BEHALF OF THE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION)

SUMMARY—Creates the P-16 Advisory Council. (BDR 34-416)

AN ACT relating to education; creating the P-16 Advisory Council to assist in the coordination between elementary, secondary and higher education in this State; providing for the organization, powers and duties of the Council; and providing other matters properly relating thereto.

Legislative Counsel's Digest:

- 1 This bill creates the P-16 Advisory Council to assist in the coordination
2 between elementary, secondary and higher education in this State.
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THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEVADA, REPRESENTED IN
SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 **Section 1.** Title 34 of NRS is hereby amended by adding
2 thereto a new chapter to consist of the provisions set forth as
3 sections 2 to 9 inclusive, of this act.

4 **Sec. 2.** *As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise
5 requires, the words and terms defined in sections 3 and 4 of this
6 act have the meanings ascribed to them in those sections.*

7 **Sec. 3.** *“Council” means the P-16 Advisory Council created
8 by section 6 of this act.*

9 **Sec. 4.** *“System” means the Nevada System of Higher
10 Education.*



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1 **Sec. 5. The Legislature hereby finds and declares that:**

2 **1. The Board of Regents of the University of Nevada was
3 created by the Nevada Constitution and empowered to control and
4 manage the affairs of the Nevada System of Higher Education.**

5 **2. Matters relating to education are vitally important to the
6 future of the State of Nevada, its economy and the general welfare
7 of its residents. In light of the growing enrollments in Nevada's
8 system of public elementary and secondary education and
9 Nevada's system of public higher education, it is important that
10 the Nevada Legislature, the Board of Regents and the Executive
11 Branch of the State Government work together as partners in
12 developing a needed public agenda to advance education in this
13 State.**

14 **3. The development of an agenda to advance education
15 should be carried out with a view toward seeking input from all
16 parties who have a stake in the advancement of education in this
17 State.**

18 **4. Coordination between elementary, secondary and higher
19 education must be strengthened to ensure that pupils in the 12th
20 grade are prepared adequately to make the transition from
21 secondary education to higher education or to careers. To this
22 end, a body should be established to coordinate education from the
23 level of preschool through the completion of a bachelor's degree,
24 to be known as the P-16 Advisory Council.**

25 **Sec. 6. 1. The P-16 Advisory Council, consisting of 11
26 voting members, is hereby created to assist in the coordination
27 between elementary, secondary and higher education in this State.**

28 **2. The Governor shall appoint five members to the Council as
29 follows:**

30 **(a) One representative of higher education in this State.**

31 **(b) One representative of elementary and secondary education
32 in this State.**

33 **(c) One representative of early childhood education in this
34 State.**

35 **(d) One representative of private business in this State.**

36 **(e) One person that meets the qualifications of paragraph (a),
37 (b), (c) or (d).**

38 **↳ The Governor may appoint the Chancellor of the System and
39 the Superintendent of Public Instruction as members of the
40 Council pursuant to paragraphs (a) and (b), respectively.**

41 **3. The Majority Leader of the Senate and the Speaker of the
42 Assembly shall each appoint two members to the Council as
43 follows:**

44 **(a) One member of the House of the Legislature that he
45 represents.**



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1 (b) One member who meets the requirements of paragraph (a),
2 (b), (c) or (d) of subsection 2.

3 4. The Minority Leader of the Senate and the Minority
4 Leader of the Assembly shall each appoint one member to the
5 Council who is a member of the general public.

6 5. The Governor shall appoint a Chairman and a Vice
7 Chairman from among the members of the Council who represent
8 business or the general public. After the initial term, the
9 Chairman and Vice Chairman serve in the office for a term of 2
10 years beginning July 1 of each odd-numbered year. If a vacancy
11 occurs in the chairmanship or vice chairmanship, the Governor
12 shall appoint a member to fill the vacancy from among the
13 members who represent business or the general public to serve for
14 the remainder of the unexpired term of that office.

15 6. After the initial terms, each member of the Council serves
16 a term of 3 years commencing on July 1 of the year of
17 appointment. Such members may be reappointed for one
18 additional term. A vacancy on the Council must be filled for the
19 remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the
20 original appointment. Each member of the Council continues in
21 office until his successor is appointed.

22 7. Any member who is absent from two consecutive meetings
23 of the Council without permission of the Chairman:

24 (a) Forfeits his office; and

25 (b) Must be replaced as provided in subsection 6 for the filling
26 of a vacancy before the end of a term.

27 Sec. 7. 1. The Council shall meet at least once each
28 calendar quarter and as frequently as necessary to afford the
29 general public, representatives of governmental agencies and
30 representatives of organizations an opportunity to present
31 information and recommendations relating to the coordination
32 between elementary, secondary and postsecondary education.

33 2. The Council shall comply with the provisions of chapter
34 241 of NRS.

35 3. For each day or portion of a day during which the
36 members of the Council attend a meeting of the Council or are
37 otherwise engaged in the business of the Council:

38 (a) The members who are Legislators are entitled to receive the
39 compensation provided for a majority of the members of the
40 Legislature during the first 60 days of the preceding regular
41 session plus the per diem allowance provided for state officers and
42 employees generally and the travel expenses provided pursuant to
43 NRS 218.2207, payable from the Legislative Fund.

44 (b) The members who are appointed by the Majority Leader of
45 the Senate, the Speaker of the Assembly, the Minority Leader of



1 *the Senate and the Minority Leader of the Assembly who are not
2 Legislators are entitled to receive the per diem allowance and
3 travel expenses provided for state officers and employees
4 generally, payable from the Legislative Fund.*

5 *(c) The members who are appointed by the Governor are
6 entitled to receive the per diem allowance and travel expenses
7 provided for state officers and employees generally, payable as
8 other claims against the State are paid.*

9 **4. The Office of the Governor shall provide:**

10 (a) Administrative support;

11 (b) Equipment; and

12 (c) Office space,

13 ↳ as is necessary for the Council to carry out its duties.

14 *5. The Board of Regents of the University of Nevada and the
15 Department shall provide technical assistance to the Council upon
16 the request of the Chairman.*

17 **Sec. 8. 1. The Council shall address:**

18 *(a) Methods to increase the number of students who enroll in
19 programs at the System to become teachers, including, without
20 limitation, financial aid programs for students enrolled in those
21 programs.*

22 *(b) Methods to ensure the successful transition of pupils from:*

23 (1) Elementary school to middle school;

24 (2) Middle school to high school; and

25 (3) High school to postsecondary education,

26 ↳ including, without limitation, methods to increase parental
27 involvement.

28 *(c) Methods to ensure that the data information system for the
29 pupils enrolled in the public schools is linked, to the extent
30 feasible, with the data information system for the students enrolled
31 in the System.*

32 *(d) Methods to ensure that the course work, standards and
33 assessments required of pupils in secondary schools is aligned
34 with the workload expected of students at the postsecondary level.*

35 *(e) Methods to ensure collaboration among the business
36 community, members of the academic community and political
37 leaders to set forth a process for developing strategies for the
38 growth and diversification of the economy of this State.*

39 *(f) Policies relating to workforce development, employment
40 needs of private employers and workforce shortages in
41 occupations critical to the education, health and safety of the
42 residents of this State.*

43 *(g) Other matters within the scope of the Council as
44 determined necessary or appropriate by the Council.*

45 **2. The Council may:**



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(a) Establish committees to assist the Council in carrying out its duties.

(b) Apply for any available grants and may accept any gifts, grants and donations from any source to assist the Council in carrying out its duties.

Sec. 9. On or before June 30 of each year, the Council shall submit a written report of its activities and any recommendations to the:

- 1. Board of Regents of the University of Nevada;*
 - 2. State Board;*
 - 3. Director of the Legislative Counsel Bureau for transmittal*
to the next regular session of the Legislature;
 - 4. Legislative Committee on Education; and*
 - 5. Governor.*

Sec. 10. 1. On or before September 1, 2007, the Governor shall, pursuant to subsection 2 of section 6 of this act, appoint to the P-16 Advisory Council created by that section:

(a) Three members to terms commencing on September 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2009.

(b) Two members to terms commencing on September 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2010.

2. On or before September 1, 2007, the Majority Leader of the Senate and the Speaker of the Assembly shall, pursuant to subsection 3 of section 6 of this act, each appoint to the P-16 Advisory Council created by that section:

(a) One member to a term commencing on September 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2009.

(b) One member to a term commencing on September 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2010.

3. On or before September 1, 2007, the Minority Leader of the Senate shall, pursuant to subsection 4 of section 6 of this act, appoint to the P-16 Advisory Council created by that section one member to a term commencing on September 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2009.

4. On or before September 1, 2007, the Minority Leader of the Assembly shall, pursuant to subsection 4 of section 6 of this act, appoint to the P-16 Advisory Council created by that section one member to a term commencing on September 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2010.

Sec. 11. On or before September 1, 2007, the Governor shall, pursuant to subsection 5 of section 6 of this act, appoint a Chairman and a Vice Chairman to the P-16 Advisory Council created by that section to a term commencing on September 1, 2007, and expiring on June 30, 2009.



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1 **Sec. 12.** This act becomes effective on July 1, 2007.

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
